

Haire to return to take reins of Eagle football

"I am proud of being from Salado," Alan Haire said. "I am proud of playing Eagle Football and I want the kids to feel the same way."

Almost 30 years after graduating from Salado, Haire will return to be the Head Football Coach of the Eagles.

Salado ISD Trustees met in special session Jan. 20 to formally offer the position to Haire, who was selected from a pool of more than 100 job applicants. The pool of applicants was narrowed to a round of 12 for interviews. Then there were three. And then two.

And then there was Alan, the choice of the selection committee and the recommendation of Superintendent Michael Novotny to trustees last night.

Haire returns to Salado from Stephenville, where he has been the Athletic Director of a program that has boasted five state championships in football, most recently in 2012 in 3A, Div. I, as well as a 2003 state champ volleyball team.

For a very short stint, he was head football coach and director of football operations at Mabank High School prior to going to Stephenville in March 2015. Haire was the Head Football Coach and Athletic Director for the Lago Vista Vikings for 13 seasons. He took over a fledgling young football program in a tough central Texas district. Haire' Vikings were the Class 2A, Div. State Semifinalists in 2010, with a 13-1 record, Regional Finalists in 2011 with a 10-2 record and again in 2012 with a 9-4 record. The Vikings had three straight district championships in football in 2009-2011.

After a year at the tiny Morgan Mill ISD, he came to Salado, coaching for the Eagles from 1994 to 2000. The Eagles went to the playoffs five times and were bi-district champions three times.

Haire was the Offensive Coordinator here in Salado.

He was also the head boys basketball coach, where the Eagles won their first district championship in 15 years.

He was the first coach of the Salado Eaglers softball team and won two bidistrict championships.

He was an assistant baseball coach of the Regional Finalist Eagles baseball team in 1995

Cabaniss retires as full-time finance director, takes on being full-time Grandma to four

Former co-workers, bosses, school trustees and friends gathered at the Salado Civic Center to wish Lyndal Cabaniss well as she retires from her fulltime duties as Salado ISD Finance Director to take on much more important duties as full-time grandma.

For more than three decades, Cabaniss has overseen the finances for Salado I.S.D. as the district has grown from fewer than 500 students to about 1,500 students and a budget that has grown to more than \$13 million. Cabaniss' roots run deep in Salado -- generations deep -- as do her husband Dennis'. Lyndal is a 1969 graduate of Salado High, where she had 25 other classmates. They went to school in the old red schoolhouse where Lyndal would later spend several years working in the school administration.

graduating in 1968. He soon went to work driving a bus at the school and coaching junior high be-

ginning in 1971. He still drives the bus, Lyndal says, some 45 years later and teaches higher level math at the high school.

Lyndal's mother, the late Johnnie Conder Barrett, also graduated from the old red schoolhouse on Main Street.

Her children both graduated from Salado High School, when it was located on Thomas Arnold Rd. Her first office was at the old high school building before the old red schoolhouse on Main Street was rescued and renovated in the mid-90s by community volunteers, many of them former students and teachers. Soon after the red schoolhouse on Main opened as the Salado Civic Center, the Salado ISD administration offices moved to the Civic Center and Cabaniss returned to the building where she started and finished her schoolgirl days.

And it was from that building that she finished a three-decade career in Salado schools.

During that time, she has worked for almost a dozen different superintendents (some of them here on an interim basis) during that time, guiding and advising them on the intricacies of school finance laws and the impact that as little as a penny on the tax rate or a handful of students can have on a tight budget.

"She's never taught in the classroom," her most current boss Michael Nodecade before Dr. Battershell took over the helm of Temple I.S.D.

Cabaniss retires after 32+ years in Salado schools, much of that time sharing an office with Darlene Kirk, who has worked here for three decades as well.

But now Lyndal will concentrate on grandbabies Matthew, 10 years old, Jack, seven years, Susie, six years old and Emily, one year old. They are the children of Jackie and Brent Cabaniss, who graduated from Salado in 1995.

Salado aldermen on Jan. 21 will conduct the final public hearings on the annexation and zoning amendments concerning The Sanctuary and the annexation of Hidden Glen development.

The hearings will be at 6:30 p.m. Jan. 21 at the Municipal Building, 301 N. Stagecoach Rd.

They mark the second public hearings on the voluntary annexation re-

quests by The Sanctuary and Hidden Glen developments. Only four individuals spoke during the public hearings on annexation of The Sanctuary on Jan. 14, Sheryl Russell, Maurice Strielger, Nancy Reynolds and Darlene Walsh, all opposed to the Sanctuary development.

No one spoke during the Jan. 14 public hearing on the annexation of Hidden Glen affordable senior

living complex.

During a Jan. 12 Planning & Zoning Commission, 18 residents spoke in opposition to zoning changes for The Sanctuary. Ultimately, the P&Z board voted against three of the proposed changes and recommended the zoning change for the 50 acres at the southeast corner of FM 2268 and I-35 only.

Following the Board

of Aldermen Public Hearing on PD-MU Zoning Ordinance, the board will recommend to approve or deny the zoning request.

At the Feb. 11 meeting of the Board of Aldermen, the Board will have the first reading of Annexation Ordinance and consider giving final approval on the zoning request by the developer. The final reading and adoption of annexation will be Feb. 18.

Ted Cruz Is Nixon, not Goldwater

The lazy conventional wisdom is that Ted Cruz is the new Barry Goldwater, doomed to suffer an electoral landslide defeat should he win the Republican nomination.

Not only is this wrong about Cruz's general-election chances, it may compare Cruz to the wrong 20th-century Republican forebear. The better analogue for Cruz might be Richard Nixon, not in the crudely pejorative sense, but as another surpassingly shrewd and ambitious politician who lacked a personal touch but found a way to win nonetheless.

First, all the caveats. Obviously and most importantly, Cruz is not a paranoiac. He's more ideological than Nixon. And he has none of Nixon's insecurity, in fact the opposite. Nixon went to tiny Whittier College and resented the Northeastern elite; Cruz went to Princeton and Harvard, and could be a member of the Northeastern elite in good standing if he wanted to be But Cruz is cut from roughly similar cloth. He wears his ambition on his sleeve and isn't highly charismatic or relatable. If Cruz wins the nomination, it'll be on the strength of intelligence and willpower. He'll have outworked,



outsmarted and outmaneuvered everyone else.

Certainly, Cruz isn't ascending on the basis of warm feelings from his colleagues. Cruz portrays his unpopularity within the Senate as establishment distaste for him as a lonely man of principle. But it's a genuine personal dislike.

Not that Cruz cares. In fact, a key to what he has been able to achieve is his apparent immunity to the reflexive desire to be liked by people around you, a weakness to which almost all of us fall prey. Cruz is free of the peer pressure that typically makes all senators, at some level, team players.

Cruz is a Reagan Republican, although with considerable flexibility. When Rand Paul seemed to be on Two months later, when a brush fire erupted on the right over "Obamatrade," Cruz abruptly reversed course and came out against trade-promotion authority -- he cited procedural reasons -- and then opposed the underlying trade agreement as well.

Is all the effort on Cruz's part only in the cause of a 1964-style ideological blowout? No. The country's too evenly divided for another Goldwater-style landslide loss, and Hillary Clinton is a deeply flawed candidate.

But Cruz has major vulnerabilities. He's more ideologically defined than George W. Bush in 2000 or Barack Obama in 2008, and his current theory of the general election -- that he need turn out only conservatives -- is a comforting fable.

Marco Rubio and Chris Christie are both, in their own ways, more winsome, and it's easier to see how each of them could pick off Obama states. But Cruz has always understood that you have to win the primary to win the general. Whoever is going to beat him better know what he's doing -- because Cruz certainly does.

Creek crossing is not a bridge

The low water crossing across Salado Creek by Sherrill Park is not a bridge according to their Chief Engineer, Bobby Littlefield, in a January 8, 2016 email:

"Mayor Blancett, I found out that the low

water bridge in Salado that you and I discussed yesterday is not in our bridge inventory. This means it does not meet the federal definition of a bridge and is therefore not included in the federal bridge replacement/rehabilitation program. TxDOT does not own this structure nor do we have any jurisdiction here since this road is off of the state system."

Simply put, the State will not maintain, repair, or replace it. Likewise, they will not remove the gravel, dirt, grass, and weeds choking it. I have gone so far as to write Governor Abbott for assistance with "no reply." For years, this low wa-

ter crossing has been col-



lecting gravel, and growing grass and weeds. As a result, water is restricted from flowing through its main arteries and gravel, by summer, will begin covering the bridge and adding structure pressure. Additionally, animals drown from getting caught in the grass and weeds, and insects and snakes find it a breeding habitat. Cleaning the waterway and removing the gravel now will keep the creek healthy, safe, and will prevent some flooding.

meet environ-То mental restrictions, Mill Creek Association acquired a permit. Removing the gravel and weeds requires special, large wheeled equipment that

does not leak oil or gas. Likewise, debris cannot touch the ground, must go directly into a dump truck, and dumped away from the creek. The expense is significant – between \$10,000-\$18,000.

Border Boondoggle GOP's "just build a wall" fans don't know what they're talking about

Good fences, wrote Robert Frost, make good neighbors.

But an 18-foot high, 2,000-mile wall? That's another story. It just antagonizes your neighbor - and shows your own fear and weakness.Yet this is what self-described conservatives running for president propose to build to stop migrants from coming across our country's southern border. Simple, right? Just fence 'em out!

Haven't we already tried this?

In 2006, Congress mandated the construction of a wall along the 1,954 miles of our border with Mexico. A decade later, guess how many miles have been completed? About 650. It turns out that erecting a monstrous wall isn't so simple after all.

First, it's ridiculously expensive – about \$10 billion just for the mate-



rials to build from the tip of Texas to the Pacific, not counting labor costs and maintenance.

Second, there's the prickly problem of land acquisition: To erect the first 650 miles of fence, the federal government had to sue hundreds of property owners to take their land. Odd, isn't it, that rightwing politicos who loudly rail against government overreach now favor using government muscle to grab private property?

Third, it's impossible to fence the whole border. Hundreds of miles of it lie along the Rio Grande's flood plain, and more miles cross the steep mountainous terrain of southern Arizona.

Donald Trump, Ted Cruz, and the other "just build a wall" simpletons either don't know what they're talking about or are deliberately trying to dupe voters.

Before you buy a 2,000mile wall from them, take a peek at the small part already built. Because of the poor terrain and legal prohibitions, it's not one long fence, but a fragment here and another there, with miles of gaps. Anyone wanting to cross into the United States can just go to one of the gaps and walk through.

But when they're just trying to stir up fear of foreigners, what's honesty have to do with it?




While some funding for the competition comes from Salado ISD, the bulk of financing for supplies, tools, required entry fees and travel comes from

ITALIAN WEDDING SOUP WITH VEGAN MEATBALLS

Ready-to-eat vegan meatballs make this filling soup a snap to pull together.

1 (15-ounce) can Italianstyle diced tomatoes with garlic, oregano and basil 6 cups organic vegetable broth

4 ounces elbow pasta

makes 12 rolls

These crusty and chewy seeded rolls are the perfect addition to any cozy meal. Plan in advance because you'll need to make the sponge the night before you serve the rolls.

1 (12-ounce) bottle brown ale, at room temperature 1/2 teaspoon active dry veast 3 cups all-purpose flour Dough 1/2 teaspoon active dry yeast 1/4 cup warm water (105° to 110°F) 1 cup whole spelt flour 2 cups whole wheat flour, plus more for dusting 1 tablespoon coarse sea salt 1/2 cup cool water

2 tablespoons sunflower seeds

2 tablespoons sesame seeds

1 tablespoon fennel seeds 1 tablespoon coarse sea salt

Seed Topping

2 tablespoons poppy seeds

To make sponge, in a medium bowl, combine beer and yeast and stir a few times. Let stand until yeast has dissolved, 3 to 4 minutes. Mix in all-purpose flour by hand or with a wooden spoon until evenly incorporated. Cover loosely and let sit at room temperature for 10 to 12 hours.

To make dough, transfer sponge to the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the dough hook. Add yeast, warm water, spelt flour, whole wheat flour and salt. Begin mixing on low speed. When dough starts to come together, add cool water to make a dough of medium consistency (not dry but not too wet). Continue to mix on the lowest or secondlowest speed until a smooth dough forms, 5 to 7 minutes. Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface and form into a ball. Return to the bowl, cover loosely and let sit in a warm spot until dough is almost doubled in size, about 1 hour.

Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface and divide into 12 equal rectangles. Roll a piece into a 12 inch-rope and tie into a knot. Repeat with remaining dough

Line 2 rimmed baking sheets with parchment paper. To make topping, combine poppy seeds, sesame seeds, sunflower seeds, fennel seeds and salt in a wide pie plate. Quickly dip the top of each roll into a small bowl of water, and then press the roll gently into seed mixture. Place 6 rolls on each prepared baking sheet. Cover with plastic wrap and let sit in a warm spot until rolls are almost doubled in size, 45 minutes to 1 hour.

Meanwhile, position 1 rack on the bottom and 1 rack in the middle of the oven. Preheat the oven to 500°F. Place a metal baking pan on the lower rack to use for creating steam.

When rolls are ready to bake, carefully pour about 1/2 cup water into the hot pan in the oven and immediately close the door. Wait about 2 minutes for the steam to settle, then quickly place 1 baking sheet on the middle rack (you can bake both pans if your oven is large enough). Lower the oven temperature to 450°F and bake until rolls are golden brown, 15 to 20 minutes.
