Rosine Smith Absolutely Incredible!

Youth Coalition will host the 15th Annual Incredible Kid Celebration on April 10, recognizing ten area students. The Central Texas Incredible Kid Celebration recognizes the special children in our lives, whether they are our children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews, students, or even the child of a friend or neighbor.

Salado senior Rosine Abuwe Smith will be among the 10 Absolutely Incredible Kids to be honored at the luncheon.

She is the adopted daughter of SHS Principal Burt Smith and his wife Jami.

She was nominated by Salado ISD Superintendent Michael Novotny.

She "is one of the most resilient and positive young ladies I know," Dr. Novotny said in the nomination. "Where you see her, she will have a smile on her face and she will be making those around her laugh. Her kind heart and sweet spirit make her one of the most incredible people I know."

Smith has lived in the U.S. for five years. Her mother sent her along with her brother to the U.S. from Rwanda, Africa to escape the violence and threats to their lives. Most of Rosine's family, who were Tutsis, were murdered, including her father, grandparents, aunts, uncles and cousin. Her mother and three brothers lived in a refugee camp in the Congo for two years. When they returned to Rwanda, they were threatened, beaten and had their property damaged or destroyed.

When she was only 12, the Hutus told her mom that they were going to rape and kill her, so her mom made the choice of protecting her children by sending them to America.

When her two older brothers could not get Visas to leave the country, Rosine's mother made the decision to stay with them.

Rosine and her 15-yearold brother Adalgis were sent to live with a distant cousin in Maine. They spoke no English.

They moved to Plano to live with the sister of their priest from Rwanda. This was where they met the Smiths, where Burt served as an administrator in the school they attended. The Smiths learned that the two children were going to be sent back to Africa, they contacted Child Protective Services and became foster parents. In June 2011, the Smiths received permanent managing conservatorship.

In her first two years of high school in Plano, Rosine excelled in and out of the classroom. Even though English was her second language, she enrolled in Advanced Placement and honors courses and was involved in Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps and theater.

She received the academic excellence award in AP Human Geography and AVID and received the Shepton High School Outstanding Citizenship Award for the character, honor and integrity she exemplified.

She was the captain of her rifle team and color guard, Company Sweetheart and won both the Military Order of the Purple Heart National Leadership Award and the Superior Junior Cadet Decoration Award. She was one of 10 cadets to attend the Junior Cadet Leadership Camp. She was a class member of Plano Youth Leadership.

When her father took e principal's job in Sala do, the Smiths moved here for the final two years of Rosine's high school ca-

She continues to take AP and honors courses and is active in many extra-curricular activities.

She was the manager for volleyball and boys basketball, and well-loved as Eddie the Eagle, SHS mascot.

She is involved in Student Council and is a leader in her church youth

"While living through threats to her life, separation from her mother, living in a country where she did not know the language and being moved from place to place," Dr. Novotny said, "Rosine's spirit never let down. She has always maintained a positive attitude, worked hard and never missed a day of

"She loves people," he added, "and has a natural way of making them feel better no matter what they are dealing with."

Rosine is going to be a Marine. "She wants to serve this amazing country," Dr. Novotny said, "that has embraced her, taken care of her and saved her from danger."

Village to consider sewer

Salado aldermen at their 6 p.m. April 3 meeting will consider accepting the donation of the Stagecoach Inn Sewer Treatment Plant.

The board will discuss the proposal during a 4:30 p.m. workshop session and again at 6 p.m. City administrator Jim Reed and village attorney Alan Bojorquez have been working with Morris Foster and aldermen on the details of the proposal to

accept the donation of the sewer treatment plant that serves Stagecoach Inn and at least a dozen other commercial properties on the south side of Salado Creek. Reed has stated that he wants to assure that the Village does not incur unforeseen expenses for the plant during the time that it prepares a bond proposal for the construction of a central sewer plant for the Village.

In other business, al-

dermen will conduct the first of two public hearings on the proposed West Side Overlay, which will give the Village additionally authority in influencing how the west side of I-35 is to be developed. In addition to the current regulations in the zoning ordinance and building codes, the West Side Overlay will cause developers to consider such things as pedestrian sidewalks, green space and how the

building looks from West Village Road when building commercial properties on the west side of I-35.


Aldermen will also conduct the first public hearing on an amended sign ordinance.

In other business, the board will discuss a swap of extra-territorial jurisdiction with Belton, accepting an annexation request from a homeowner and a proposed veterans memorial for Salado.


The Foolish Anti-Vax Cause

In a feat that would have been unimaginable a few decades ago, the antivaccine movement has managed to breathe life into nearly vanquished childhood diseases.

It took all the ingenuity and know-how we are capable of to find safe, effective ways to dramatically diminish diseases like measles and whooping cough in the developed world; it took all the hysteria and willful ignorance we are capable of to give them a boost. A developer of the measles vaccine, Dr. Samuel Katz, says the question "is not whether we shall see a world without measles, but when."

Not if Jenny McCarthy has anything to say about it. The former Playboy model and current co-host of "The View" is a leading light of the anti-vaccine movement. She has a boy with autismlike symptoms that she is convinced were caused by the vaccine for measles, mumps and rubella (MMR). You can credit her passion for her child, sympathize with her heartbreak -- and still cringe at her wholly irrational cause.

No amount of discrediting makes a difference. One theory was that a preservative in children's vaccines called thimerosal was causing autism. But the U.S. removed thimerosal from most child-





hood vaccines in 2001. If the theory had been sound, this should have reduced cases of autism. It didn't. Cases have continued to rise, and the same held true in Canada and Denmark after eliminating thimerosal in the 1990s.

Another theory, latched

onto by McCarthy, is that the MMR vaccine in particular causes autism. Dr. Andrew Wakefield publicized this supposed link in a famous article in the British medical journal The Lancet. It has since been thoroughly bunked. The Lancet retracted Wakefield's paper, and the British Medical Journal reported that he "falsified data." He had his medical license revoked. All of which should have been enough to give the anti-vaxxers pause.

Nonetheless, they fight on. In a recent interview with the Fox Business Network, former MTV star Kristin Cavallari plugged the anti-vaccination cause, citing "books" and "studies."

Most parents don't listen. Only 1.8 percent of kindergartners get exempted from vaccinations, according to NBC News.

But the number is much higher in some states. The more kids go unvaccinated, the greater the chance that diseases can get a foothold.

They usually are imported from abroad, but the absence of vaccination is a boon to their spread. A study in the journal Pediatrics found that the 2010 whooping-cough outbreak in California -- when the state had the highest number of cases since 1947 --hit hardest in areas with high levels of nonvaccination. In 2013, measles cases tripled nationwide.

In the panic created by the Wakefield article, England saw MMR vaccination rates fall to 80 percent in 2004 and Wales to 78 percent. In 2012, England and Wales had the highest number of measles cases in 18 years.

These are dangerous illnesses, and the victims of an outbreak are often infants too small to have yet received vaccinations. Jenny McCarthy styles herself a "mother warrior." If so, the kids sickened in the fallout from reduced vaccinations are the victims of friendly fire. Nothing good can come from undoing one of the miracles of medical progress.

Contract Bridge

France won the 1992 World Team Olympiad, defeating the United States in a 96-deal final. Today's deal provided the French with a substantial pickup in the match.

When France's Alain Levy and Herve Mouiel held the North-South cards, the bidding went as shown, and West led a heart. No doubt many declarers would have taken the first heart and played the A-K of diamonds without giving the matter much thought. But when the diamond queen failed to fall and the club ace later proved to be offside, they would have gone down, unable to reach the A-K of spades in the closed hand. However, this was the final of the world championship, and Mouiel, as would be expected, spotted the virtually sure way to make nine tricks. After taking the first heart in dummy, he led the diamond deuce to his ten. This lost to West's queen, but the diamond nine was established as an entry to the closed hand, and there was no way the defenders could stop South from scoring five diamonds, two hearts and two spades for a total

of nine tricks. At the other table, the U.S. North-South pair of Michael Rosenberg and Seymon Deutsch reached five diamonds. Rosenberg, North, won the opening heart lead and played the A-K of trumps. He then cashed his other high heart and ruffed a heart in dummy. Next came the A-K of spades, declarer discarding two clubs, followed by a spade ruff. Rosenberg then exited with a diamond to West's queen.

Had West started with precisely a 3-3-3-4 pattern, he would have been forced to return a club at this point, allowing dummy's king to score the gamegoing trick. As it was, though, West was able to exit with his last spade. Rosenberg had no choice but to ruff and lead a club to the king, and when West produced the ace, the contract was down one, giving the French a 12-IMP gain on the deal.
