Salado goes to State!

In the past decade, the district that includes Salado has dominated the University Interscholastic League (UIL) 2A State Baseball tournament, winning four state championships, including the past three straight with Jarrell (2012), Cameron (2011) and Rogers (2010).

Coach Chad Krempin hopes to continue that tradition and make it four in a row for this central Texas district.

To do so, the Eagles first have to get past Hallettsville, who fell in three games to eventual champs Jarrell in the Regional finals last year. Salado's junior ace Casey Frazier took the mound at the Dell Diamond on June 5 in the semi-final round of the UIL 2A State Baseball Tournament. Hallettsville is the number two seed in the tournament with a record of 33-3. The Brahmas were ranked seventh in the state at the end of district play by the Texas High School Baseball Coaches Association. Salado was ranked number two and Hughes Springs was ranked number one in state. Hughes Springs played Bangs, the winner in Region I, and ranked in the Top 20 in state.



and earn a berth in the state tournament.

Following junior pitcher Casey Frazier's five-inning performance in game three against the Troy Trojans, it is no wonder.

Frazier led Salado to an 11-0 10 run rule victory over Troy by striking out 10 batters and allowing just six Trojans to reach base. Through the first three innings, Frazier completely dominated the Troy batters, striking out nine of them. Zeb Criswell hit a single to right and moved to second on a two-out walk to Jake Shmidt. Runners were stranded when Frazier struck out his ninth batter of the evening looking. "It feels good," Frazier said of knowing he would pitch in the state tournament. Troy batters had trouble with Frazier's fast ball.

The Eagles jumped out in the first inning, beginning with a rocket down the third base line by leadoff batter Trey Mohler. A walk to Franz and a single by Cole Haag loaded the bases. Marshall Mann hit, but Mohler was thrown out at home.

Frazier, coming off of throwing 11 pitches and three strikeouts in the first, knocked Zach Epperson's 3-1 pitch for a tworun double. Davis Little walked and Coby Giniewicz singled, knocking in Frazier. Bryce Martin walked to load the bases when Troy made the first of three pitching changes. Payton Stanford walked Caden Eary to push in Little and then he walked Mohler to push in Giniewicz. Troy brought in its third pitcher of the inning. Matt Ellis who proceeded to hit Jon Franz to drive in Martin Salado had the bases loaded with seven runs in the pocket and just one out, but Ellis was able to pitch his way out of trouble with a foul out and a strike out. The Eagles scored three runs in the fourth inning on four singles. Haag led off with a single and stole second. Marshall Mann singled, and an error allowed him to reach second base and Haag to score from second. Davis Little hit a deep single, scoring Mann, reaching second on the throw. With two outs, Little scored on a single by Martin. Jon Franz led off the seventh with a walk and advanced on a one-out single by Mann, who was 3-for-4 in game three. Frazier laid down a sacrifice bunt to advance the runners before Franz scored on a wild pitch. Mann was left stranded on third.

The Eagles left seven runners on base in game three.

ORUI An Open Exchange of Ideas **Being Eric Holder**

President Barack Obama has been mocked for learning about untoward conduct in his administration from the press. But he's on the ball compared with his attorney general, who wouldn't know about his own poor judgment without reading about it in the papers. Let's hope he has a Google alert set for "Eric Holder."

The website The Daily Beast interviewed the attorney general and Justice Department officials for a piece about how the AG is holding up in the firestorm over two controversial Justice Department leak investigations, one into The Associated Press, the other into Fox News reporter James Rosen.

The Daily Beast piece pinpoints when Eric Holder had a crisis of conscience leading him to question his leak-investigating ways. The Washington Post had made inquiries at the Justice Department about the investigation into Rosen stemming from a 2009 leak, and the department's press office had begun to ready itself for the storm. For Eric Holder, though, "the gravity of the situation didn't fully sink in until Monday morning when he read the Post's front-page story, sitting at his kitchen table."



Then, the awful realization hit him that maybe it wasn't such a great idea for him to sign off on an affidavit portraying a member of the press -- particularly one from a news organization scorned and attacked by the White House -- as practically an agent of a foreign power. Perhaps it wasn't so wise, after all, to identify Rosen as a "co-conspirator" in a crime. Come to think of it, it might have been illadvised to track his movements in and out of the State Department building that he covered and to read his emails.

Yes, Eric Holder was beginning to wonder whether Eric Holder had made the right call. It may get worse if Eric Holder gets around to reading in the papers that Congress is investigating whether Eric Holder lied to it under oath. It turns out that Eric Holder did indeed make a false representation about Eric Holder.

Congressman Hank Johnson, D-Ga., pointed out to the attorney general that reporters could potentially be prosecuted under the Espionage Act

of 1917, and closed his interrogation with the clear trap: "I'll yield the balance of my time to you." Unable to find any way to wiggle free from this killer line of questioning, Eric Holder said, "With regard to potential prosecution of the press for the disclosure of material, that is not something I've ever been involved in, heard of, or would think would be wise policy." Eric Holder had plumb forgot that Eric Holder might have signed off on such a thing. Timing is everything: If only The Washington Post had published earlier!

What Eric Holder has done is so troubling to everyone, including Eric Holder, that President Obama has ordered a review of Justice Department policy -- to be undertaken by the single most appropriate man for such a task: Eric Holder. An unidentified friend told The Daily Beast, "Look, Eric sees himself fundamentally as a progressive, not some Torquemada out to silence the press."

And why would he want to silence the press? It's how he keeps up with Eric Holder.

Even as those at the top of our society have grown fabulously richer, those Jim in the economic middle have seen their incomes stagnate and fall, oppor tunities decline, and poverty become - not about someone else — but about them. Half a century after erty." Washington declared its war on poverty, our cold reality is bleak. We've got nearly 50 million poor people and 51 million more who are "near poor." Statistics vary, but between one in five and one in four American children now lives in poverty — the most grim reality for kids in any rich country. And there's no sign that the growth of poverty will reverse. The face of Ameri-

the long-term unemployed, grabbing at temporary low-paying jobs, and buying meager groceries with food stamps.


These are the new poor, but they also constitute a new demographic phenomenon: the suburban poor.

Once the secure base of the middle-class, suburbs have become the fastestgrowing home of American poverty. Since 2000, the number of suburban poor has surged by 64 percent, twice the rate of urban poverty growth. By 2011, America's suburbs held 16.4 million poor Americans. That's 3 million more poor people than reside in our core cities. 



An unusual safety play Contract Bridge

By Steve Becker

There are times when declarer must make what appears to be a senseless play in order to give himself the maximum chance for his contract. The play might seem foolish if it later turns out to be unnecessary, but when the play proves to be essential, declarer has something worth talking about.

Take this case where West leads a club against four hearts. South wins with dummy's ace, returns a low trump and, after East plays the eight, finesses the jack! The finesse appears absurd, considering that South possesses 10 trumps headed by the A-K-J. But, oddly enough, it is the right play -- not because the finesse succeeds in the actual deal, but because it assures the contract against any distribution of the opposing cards.

To appreciate the advantage of the finesse, let's assume that declarer makes the more normal play of the ace on the first round of trumps. After West shows out, South must go down one, losing a trick in each suit.

Now let's assume that when South finesses the jack, it loses to the queen. This is not cause for alarm, because the contract is still fully under control. The best the defenders can



a club and shift to a diamond.

South wins the diamond return, draws the one missing trump and plays the king of spades. West takes his ace, but that's the end of the line for the defense. South later crosses to dummy's nine of trumps and discards his diamond loser on the queen of spades.

In effect, the trump finesse is a safety play to guard against a 3-0 trump division. Quite often it will cost declarer a 30-point

In a blender, purée ginger, 1/4 cup walnuts, almondmilk, vinegar, tamari and dates until very smooth to make a dressing; add an extra splash of almondmilk for a thinner

dressing, if you like.

Grill peaches, flipping once, until softened and just charred, 5 to 10 minutes. Arrange greens in a bowl, top with warm peaches and remaining walnuts and drizzle with dressing.
