Momentum building for purchase of Mill Creek

Salado Golf Club leaders feel that momentum has been building toward reaching the ultimate goal of purchasing and repairing Mill Creek Golf Course to turn it into a member-owned course.

To date, the group has checks totaling \$1,417,000 with other "soft commitments" yet to sign checks over to the Salado Golf Club.

"The smaller amounts have started coming in," treasurer Bruce Bolick said on June 18, adding that checks of \$2,500 and \$5,000 are "starting to add up to real money."

Salado Golf Club will host a gathering at the Mill Creek Pro Shop at 6:30 p.m. June 21 to answer questions of residents who are interested in making loans to the Club so that it can make the purchase of the golf course. "We will also be collecting checks from anyone who wants to give us one," Bolick said.

In addition to loans in increments of \$2,500, Salado Golf Club will also accept donations in smaller amounts in order to reach its goal of purchasing the golf course.

Ultimately, all of the loans and/or donations will have to add up to \$1.75 million to purchase the golf course property and operations outright from

Morris Foster. Otherwise, Foster has told Salado Golf Club leaders and others in the community that he intends to close the golf course on Oct. 1.

Local business owner Dave Hermann is inviting businesses, residents and others who are supportive of the effort to gather with him at his restaurant at 7 p.m. June 20.

The Range at the Barton House will host a gathering for business owners and others to raise awareness and funds towards the purchase of Mill Creek.

We are committed to the overall health and vitality of Salado," Hermann said, "and believe this is a very worthwhile venture."

"We have an opportunity before us to rally as a community," he said, "The revitalization of the Salado Golf Club can be a true cornerstone, helping our entire community come together for a common good. Homeowners and businesses alike benefit from a vibrant golf club."

Hermann will have a free fajita buffet for people to dine from while the discussion ensues about how the business community can get behind the Salado Golf Club effort.

Paul Cox will play for the group and will sell CDs with all proceeds going toward the Salado Golf Club.

Aldermen to get update on city administrator

Salado aldermen will hear an update on the city administrator job description and timeline during their June 20 regular meeting at the Salado municipal

Salado ISD Trustees on June 17 hired a new intermediate school principal, a part-time counselor and three new teacher/coaches during their regular board meeting.

Beth Aycock will officially begin her duties as Salado Intermediate School principal on July 15. She comes to Salado from Killeen ISD where she has been Curriculum Director for Killeen High School since 2010.

Aycock began her teaching career in Killeen as a history teacher in 2006. In 2008, she became the international baccalaureate coordinator at Killeen High School. where she was responsible for organizing and coordinating international baccalaureate testing among other duties.

She was a curriculum and instruction specialist with Killeen High School in 2009-2010, where she was responsible for the campus induction for all new staff, assisted with the creation and implementation of campus professional development, coordinated new teacher mentor/protege relationship, coordinated the Advance Placement program and organized and maintained supplementary instructional materials.

Tara Hatfield will be a special education teacher at Salado Junior High. She will also be the Salado leyball coach and a junior high school basketball

Hatfield is certified to teach by the Texas Teachers program. She has a B.A. from Southern Methodist University and a M.A. from the University of Texas at Dallas.

She has coached volleyball since 2004, when she began as a volunteer assistant coach at SMU. In 2009 she was an assistant volleyball coach at Southwestern University through May 2011.

She has been the head volleyball coach for Austin Performance Vollevball Club since Aug. 2007. She has also been a volleyball coach for the past year at Brentwood Christian School.

Hatfield was a substitute teacher in Round Rock ISD for the past year as well.

Marcos Rene Garcia will teach high school and junior high school math. He will also be a high school assistant football coach and a high school assistant softball coach.

ENROLLMENT INCREASES

AT END OF SCHOOL YEAR

In other business, trustees reviewed enrollment comparisons for the year and saw that the school closed the year with a slight uptick in growth.

The enrollment for June 2013 total 1,368 with an average daily attendance of 1,301. This is an increase of almost one percent over June 2012 enrollment of 1,356.

The district trailed last year's enrollment throughout the year, due mainly to a small Kindergarten class enrollment in 2013. The Kindergarten class for 2012 was 108 students, while the Kindergarten class this year totaled only 70 students.

This caused Thomas Arnold Elementary to be the only school campus to be smaller than last year's campus enrollment: 302 compared to 324.

Salado High School saw the largest increase in enrollment: 449 from 426 last year. This is due in large part to a larger senior class. In 2012, the graduating class was 86 students. In 2013, it was 102 students.

Salado Junior High increased its enrollment slightly, from 206 students in 2012 to 210 students in 2013 (almost a two percent increase).

Salado Intermediate School saw its enrollment increase from 400 to 407 in 2013.

NRC Realty & Capital Advisors, LLC (NRC) has been retained again by 7-Eleven, Inc. (7-Eleven) to coordinate the sale of 139 gasoline stations and/ or convenience stores, 83 of which are located in Texas, 31 in Florida, 11 in Ohio, eight in Pennsylvania, five in Utah and one in Wisconsin.

Of the 83 Texas sites, 43 are located in the Dallas-Fort Worth metropolitan area, 10 are in the San Antonio market, 10 are near Austin, and the remainder are located throughout east Texas.

In announcing the sale, Robbie Radant, 7-Eleven vice president of mergers and acquisitions, said, "There are some terrific properties in this package that simply don't fit 7-Eleven's business model. All of these stores were part of the more than 1,000 sites we've acquired in the past three years and should provide great opportunities for the right buyers."

Lot sizes range from approximately 10,000 to 75,000 square feet, while store sizes range from kiosks to 6,700 square feet.

The Salado property is one of the 118 sites that are fee-owned properties.

The property is 24,829 square feet with a 3,360 square foot building. It was opened as Country Boy in 1977. It has a fuel supply term of 10 years.

All sites are being sold without 7-Eleven branding. Most sites are being offered for sale with fuel supply, which will be provided by SEI Fuels, Inc.

An Open Exchange of Ideas

Why President Obama Became a Snoop

Before Barack Obama became president, he reveled in the irresponsibility of his powerlessness. He could denounce Bush administration counterterrorism initiatives from a glorious position of civillibertarian purity and posit the need to strike a perfect balance "between privacy and security."

Then he got elected president, and the mere posturing had to end. He had to grow up. Invested with responsibility for keeping the country safe and, no doubt, informed of potential threats in hairraising terms on a daily basis, he jettisoned his innocent civil-libertarianism. In light of what were dire and real threats to our security, he had no choice but to use the surveillance powers of the government to foil them.

Now, President Obama thinks the Goldilocks balance he has always spoken of is struck by a vast National Security Agency monitoring program that vacuums up the phone records of all Americans. There is poetic justice in hearing the president excoriated in exactly the same terms as President George W. Bush by the very same people who worked to get him elected to end the ter-

rible abuses of the Bush-

Cheney regime. But the fact is that -- in least this respect -- Obama grew up and they didn't.

As president, he didn't have the luxury of turning his back on Bush policies merely because they were Bush policies. In his press conference, he said of the NSA program that upon taking office, he concluded "on net, it was worth us doing." Whereas his allies can either pretend that the terror threat doesn't exist or that there are easy and simple ways of combatting it, he has to deal with it in the real world. As he said of the programs, "My assessment and my team's assessment was that they help us prevent terrorist at-

tacks." There seems little question that the NSA programs are constitutional and legal. The Internet element is directed at foreigners overseas to whom our Fourth Amendment doesn't apply.

As for the phone program, it involves metadata -- i.e., phone numbers dialed, and for what duration, and from where -that courts have held aren't

protected by the Fourth Amendment the same way that the actual content of conversations are. Congress authorized the program, albeit somewhat vaguely, in Section 215 of the USA Patriot Act. The question here isn't if Obama is lawless or shredding the Constitution. It is whether the program is proportionate and wise.

The metadata are fed into the maw of government algorithms. It is only anomalies that, assuming a court warrant can be obtained, get more attention. But the government is nonetheless sweeping up the records of Americans who have done nothing to earn anyone's suspicion. The information lands on the desktops of the likes of whistleblower Edward Snowden, who it turns out isn't a very reliable custodian of sensitive data.

The Snowden leak was wrong, but at least it makes possible an open debate about the program that might lead to useful tightening and new controls. Years ago, Barack Obama's contribution to that debate might have been as hyperbolic and irresponsible as that of his disappointed friends. Now, evidently, he knows better.

CATCHING MONSANTO'S DRIFT Frankenwheat crops are sprouting like weeds in Oregon

Bob Dylan once sent a two-word lyric to Ben Harper, a talented songwriter he admired. "Well well," was the lyric, and Dylan challenged Harper to make a song of it.

He did! By adding another "well" to the title, Harper wrote "Well, well, well" — a stinging lament about America's clean-water well going dry due to waste and greed.

I thought of his song when I heard that a wheat farmer in Eastern Oregon had gotten an unpleasant surprise in May: Some of Monsanto's unapproved, genetically manipulated wheat suddenly cropped up in his field. He'd never planted any of these Frankenseeds, which have a foreign DNA spliced into them by Monsanto's biotamperers.

Field tests of the altered wheat were last done in Oregon in 2001, and the seeds never have been cleared for commercial

use anywhere in the world. But there they are, sprouting like weeds.

Well, well, well. Ever since Monsanto, backed by its political protectors, began messing with the very DNA of our food supply two decades ago, the company line was that it was all perfectly safe and under tight control.

Farmers, however, warned that these corporate and political powers were a bunch of profiteering ignoramuses who knew nothing about such basic realities as pollen drift. Pollen from mutant plants can — and does - move many hundreds of miles across state and national borders to contaminate the crops of unsuspecting farmers living far away.

Ninety percent of the wheat grown by Oregon farmers is exported to Japan and other nations that don't let their consumers serve as lab rats for agribusiness hucksters. So the escape of Monsanto's wheat into the wild endangers both wheat exports and the purity of organic corps - along with human health and our environment.





Johnny's Outback brings John Conlee to Salado

In the face of passing fame and passing time as careers have come and gone at whirlwind speed from the national spotlight, John Conlee has remained firmly rooted in the heart of country music buyers like a fine, well rooted oak tree.

Release of his latest project "Classics"-featuring 19 of his greatest hits plus three new songs—has been embraced by yet another new generation of music lovers for whom traditional country music never goes out of style.

The new album features digitally re-mastered versions of his biggest hits. Songs such as his signature "Rose Colored Glasses," "Lady Lay Down," "Backside Of Thirty," "Common Man," "I'm Only In It For The Love," "Friday Night Blues," and "I Don't Remember Loving You," like fine wine all have only gotten better with age. Not to mention the technology that captures every fiber of John's well woven rich tapestry of a voice.

"Some things never go out of style, and a good country voice, I'm glad to say is one of them" noted Conlee in a recent interview. "I think we can look at George Jones and see what a timeless voice sounds like." Like George, John has been blessed with a voice that doesn't quite sound like anyone elseit's been something that has helped him endure a lot of passing fads in the music business.

Since hitting with "Rose Colored Glasses" in 1976, John Conlee's career has been anything but a passing fad.

Born and raised in the rich farmland of Kentucky, John grew up close to the earth and those that make their living from it. It's a loyalty that has carried over into his career. Through his efforts the Family Farm Defense was

created in the mid-'80's and John became Honorary Chairman. When Willie Nelson announced his plans to stage Farm Aid, John volunteered his services. He has since participated in nine Farm Aid concerts and assisted in raising over 13 million dollars to aid the Ameri-

can farmer. Following "Glasses," John struck gold againthis time with "Lady Lay Down," which reclined in style at the #1 spot. He matched that success just a short few months later with "Backside of Thirty," which also reached the top of the charts. With two more hits in rapid succession-"Before My Time," and "Baby, You're Something," the Academy Of Country Music presented John Conlee with their coveted "Best New Male Vocalist" Award in 1979.

As the '80's dawned, John's success made him one of the most consistent male artists of the decade. Early in the decade major chart toppers such as "Friday Night Blues," and "She Can't Say That Anymore,"

rode him through the era of the "Urban Cowboy" changes that swept the artist landscape.

In a decade of dashing young men in cowboy hats Conlee more than held his own. "John Conlee's voice makes him the tallest, darkest, most handsome man in country music," noted a national reviewer. Obviously, record buyers by the droves came out in force to agree. As the '80's progressed, John scored major hits with a Red Lane song—"Miss Emily's Picture,"—following it with his version of "Busted" - a hit for Johnny Cash and Ray Charles in the 60's and the song that has helped raise tens of thousands of dollars for Feed The Children.

John hit his high-water mark-pulling off a remarkable four #1 hits in a row. "Common Man," "I'm Only In It For The Love," "In My Eyes," and "As Long As I'm Rockin' With You" all topped the charts as successive releases. To further add some potent ingredients to his mix as a young country music

singer on the way to legend, John added additional gems: "Working Man," "Old School," "Got My Heart Set On You," (which stayed on the charts a remarkable 5 months), "The Carpenter," "Domestic Life," and "Mama's Rockin' Chair," forever wrote his name in the history book of country music. RIAA gold certi-fication of his "Greatest Hits" album is among the accolades that line the walls at the Conlee farmhouse.

John has enjoyed the fruits of his success. Today he continues to be an always popular addition to the stage of the Grand Ole Opry—where he was bestowed the honor of membership in 1981—the fulfillment of the ultimate dream he held as a farm boy back in Kentucky.

For relaxation these days, he goes back to the "farm"—this time his own pristine 32 acre spread outside of Nashville that's become home to John, his wife Gale and their three children-Rebecca, Jessica, and John.





The imperfect endplay

Contract Bridge

By Steve Becker

A declarer who tries to eliminate the element of luck on every deal does not always find the adverse cards distributed exactly the way he'd like them to

For example, take this case where South is in four hearts and West leads the king of spades. Declarer sees at once that he might lose a spade and three clubs and go down one if West has the ace of clubs. But having been to the wars before, he sees the possibility of an endplay against West to nullify an unfavorable location of the club ace.

So after he takes the king of spades with the ace, he plays the K-Q of trumps, hoping to find them divided 2-2. In that case, he would next cash the A-K of diamonds and ruff a diamond before putting West on lead with a spade to force a losing re-

When East turns up with three trumps instead of two, declarer remains unfazed, as this development provides no reason for him to alter his initial plan. He simply stops drawing trumps for the moment, cashes the A-K of diamonds and ruffs a diamond, as originally planned, and then exits with a spade, also as originally planned.

West unhappily finds himself on lead and must hand South the contract. If he returns a spade or a diamond, declarer ruffs with dummy's jack of trumps while disposing of a club loser from his hand. And if West returns a club instead, he makes declarer's king a trick.

This method of play -where declarer executes an endplay while one opponent still possesses one or more trumps -- is called a partial elimination. When it works, though, it is just

Dented Wood Floor Can be Repaired

THIS IS A HAMMER By Samantha Mazzotta

Q: My room has this cool original wood floor made up of wide planks. They're painted over, so scratches haven't been a problem. But there are a few spots where heavy furniture or dropped items dinged and dented the wood. Is there a quick way to repair these spots? -- Carla in Taunton, Mass.

A: There's an interesting fix you can try, using a clothes iron and a damp towel to try and bring up the dent. Because the dent is a compression of the wood, using dampness and heat may help the wood to expand and minimize the dent.

This technique is not one that I would recommend for floors with a heavy coat of wax (as

some older floors do), because the heat may discolor the finish, but since your wood floor has just a coat or two of paint, you shouldn't have much of a problem. However, the paint may bubble or crack due to the initial damage and the expansion of the wood, so have some matching paint handy in order to touch up the area afterward. (As always, test a less-conspicuous area of the floor before making the repair.)

First, dab the dent with a wet rag to soak the wood a bit. Wait a couple of minutes. While you're waiting, fill the reservoir of your clothes iron and turn it on high, with full steam setting.

Once the iron is hot, place a damp towel over the dent. Place the iron atop the towel, holding it

directly over the dented area and trying to avoid the surrounding floor. Move the iron in a circular pattern while applying full steam, for about three minutes. Lift the towel to check your results. If the dent appears to be less deep, reapply the iron for a minute or so, checking each time until the dent is almost level with the rest of the floor.

Once the area has cooled, repair the cracked or bubbling paint over the dent. Sand away the damaged paint, wipe clean with a damp cloth, and touch up the spot with matching paint.

HOME TIP: Placing runners or area rugs in hightraffic areas of your home can reduce minor damage to hardwood flooring.
