The Specialist is nothing without its special effects and big names. But even Stallone and Stone are not enough to save this from being a terribly bad movie.

Education hit the "front burner" at both State and national legislative levels this week. In Washington, it was the Gingrich-led budget-slashers who were at work on the Department of Education's current budget. And guess which state sustained the highest amount of dollar cuts? You got it! Texas won the runner-up prize (after California) with some \$75 million bucks lost to the "all heart" GOPers who sliced \$1.7 billion from the overall spending program!

Not all the cuts were draconian but there were some that raised a few eyebrows, even among the hard charging "right-ones" including the 100% deletion of nearly \$200 million from the vocational education programs for students and adults not headed for college. These programs, plus funding for technical-vocational schools, are of vital importance if we really believe we need to put young people to work!

Down here in Texas, the education reform bill that is expected to send much of

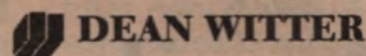

## Louzelle Rose Barclay Texas Woman in History

Louzelle Rose Barclay was born in Salado on February 17, 1881, the youngest of eight children born to Archibald Johnson Rose and his wife Sarah. She grew up in the family home, now known as the Rose Mansion.

Louzelle Rose was scornful of ancestry, including those forbearers who immigrated to Virginia in the 1600s, those who followed the Gold Rush to California in 1849, those pioneers who came by wagon train to Texas around 1857, and even the fact that her mother was related to Stephen F. Austin, father of Texas. Instead, she believed that each individual proves his or her own worth

as a parent and through community and church work.

Louzelle may have found it burdensome to be the daughter of such a distinguished father. Major Archibald J. Rose was prominent in Salado, Bell County and Texas history, founding the first Grange in Texas, serving as a 32nd degree Knights Templar and a Master Mason in Texas, serving on the Board of Trustees of Texas A&M University, Prairie View A&M University, Baylor University and Baylor Female College at Independence, a founder of the Texas Historical Society, and serving as Commissioner of Agriculture, Insurance, Statistics and History under Governor Charles Culbertson. He served in the Army of Confederate States of America during the War Between the States.

Louzelle Rose was educated at Thomas Arnold High School and, later, the University of Texas, where she is credited with bringing the first sorority, Kappa Kappa Gamma, to the University.

While attending Thomas Arnold High School, Louzelle met her future husband, Rigsby Ledbetter Barclay, a native of East Bell County. It is said they "exchanged notes in a tree" on the campus. This friendship was renewed in later

The Salado One Act Play cast and crew competed March 23, at the district contest in Taylor.

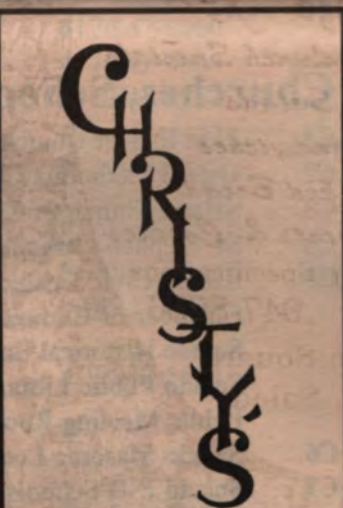

year and a courtship evolved when Louzelle returned to serve as hostess in her father's house upon the death of her mother in 1900. The couple was married in a small private ceremony in the Rose home on April 19, 1904.

After a short time spent in the Barclay home, the couple traveled to Oaxaca, Mexico, where Barclay worked in his father's gold mine for about two years. The couple returned to live in Temple two years later in anticipation of the birth of their first child.

During her early years in Temple, Louzelle devoted her time and efforts to being a good mother and wife, and to her church. She was said to be a talented organist and vocalist. She became a student of great religions of the world and founded and taught in a popular non-denominational Bible study for many years.

Louzelle was a love of good books and became familiar with all the classics. At the same time, she encouraged local and beginning authors and established the Temple Authors' Collection, containing 1,500 books and articles by citizens of Temple. As

president of the City Federation of Women's Club, she founded fine arts contests, which continue to provide recognition for citizens of Bell County, including the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor and Fort Hood, in painting, sculpture, writing and music. She persuaded the City Council of Temple to purchase grand pianos for the municipal auditorium and the women's club room, and worked to build the present City Federation of Women's Clubs' club house. She wrote hundreds of articles and delivered many talks to local clubs and organizations.

Louzelle Barclay died in Temple on November 25, 1965 and is buried in Hillcrest Cemetery.

Louzelle was chosen as a Mother of the Bicentennial Years in 1976 based on her lifetime as an exemplary wife, mother, citizen, and honored leader.

A picture and short biography of Louzelle Rose may be viewed in the Salado Historical Society Gallery in the Salado Civic Center on Main St.

duction to something called the "Speaker's House Discretionary Fund!" What do you reckon that is all about? Surely "little Newt" is not planning to use the "saved" bucks to reward or punish his fellow lawmakers do you? Be nice to have an accounting of those dollars even if asking might upset the Speaker and cause him to call yet another press conference and blast the "liberal" press and/or other enemies of the "Righteous Right." These things have a way of coming home to haunt even the most powerful of office holders.

**Sibley Is Right**

Texas Senator David Sibley (R-Waco) put forth a constitutional amendment some days back that stirred the upper house to near frenzy. The moderate Republican from our neighboring city to the north, decided it was high time to get past the days of Affir-

I have always wondered how even the most adamant affirmative action stalwart would feel about having as his personal doctor or surgeon - a man or woman who got in to and out of medical school on the basis of special quotas and preferential treatment rather than ability! Does that make you wonder - right?
