*Town hall meetings planned*

## Committee formed to examine SISD bond issue for new school

Members of the SISD Community Bond Steering Committee met Sept. 20 with the SISD Board of Trustees to establish dates for town hall meetings to discuss a possible bond election to build a new school facility.

Results of the meeting were unavailable for presstime Sept. 20.

Announcements of town hall-type meetings will be posted throughout the village, including First State Bank and Peoples National Bank and the Salado post office, the superintendent's office in the Salado Civic Center and at the Salado school campuses.

Members of the Steering Committee conducted an informal survey of 109

Salado residents, chosen at random from the telephone directory.

Of those surveyed, 25 percent said they were in favor of a bond election, 7 percent said they opposed any bond election and tax increase for new schools and 68 percent said they needed more information before making a decision.

According to committee chairman Glenda Hill, the town hall meetings and the *Salado Village Voice* will be the primary methods of communicating information about the possible bond election.

"The district is already overcrowded at the elementary and secondary levels. Projected growth will make the situation even more critical," said Superintendent Steven Ervin. "Students attend classes in two portable buildings, the caf-

eteria, and even a closet for Speech."

According to Supt. Ervin, the district has these choices:

1. Do nothing now and take more time to evaluate.
2. Build more portables.
3. Build a middle school or junior high school on the current site
4. Build a new high school on a new site.

In upcoming issues, the *Salado Village Voice* will examine the increasing student population of Salado ISD and the growth in property values.

Also, look for an examination and comparison of the alternatives the district has to handle the growth.

Finally, the *Salado Village Voice* will show the effect of a potential tax increase on property taxes for various property values.

**Mother's Boys** is a lousy movie. In fact, there is absolutely nothing redeeming in it. **Mother's Boys** tries to cash in on the popularity of the modern horror stories like **Fatal Attraction**, **Basic Instinct** and **Sleeping with the Enemy** in which the monster is someone with which the "hero" is intimate.

This time, it is the ex-wife who is the monster. Jamie Lee Curtis stars as Jude, who leaves her family for three years and returns to find that her husband has moved on with his life. Robert (Gallagher) has fallen in love with the principal of his children's elementary school. Calle (Whalley-Kilmer) is the long-suffering girlfriend who doesn't know if she has a place in the torn-apart family left behind.

Of course, Jude sets into motion a plan which causes irretrievable damage and the results are as predictable as all the movies before it. Jamie Lee Curtis is anything but frightening as the evil ex-wife; in fact, she is laughable as a bad girl, except when the viewer feels like crying from boredom.

If **Mother's Boys** had any kind of twist or surprise or suspense or anything else that makes a movie, then it might have been more than a poor copy of the original. Skip this dog.

Several items of local interest take precedence this week over the statewide political races. We will return to those nether regions in our next edition. First of the village items is the formation of a steering committee to advise and assist the Salado school trustees in the matter of a growing student population trying to fit into a static number of classrooms.

Growth is a wonderful thing. It keeps the merchant's cash registers salivating and allows the buying and selling of land and homes to proceed at a rapid clip. All of this we have observed in recent months. What is also growing is the number of kids not only presently enrolled but projected for the near future. Today's 700-plus students will become over 1,000 in five short years. That means an almost immediate need for more teachers and classrooms. Since it takes two years from inception to completion of most construction projects and since all of our facilities are crowded today it is time to get cracking! Hence the school board's call for community input; the organization of village leaders and finally,

when all the information is put together - a town hall meeting where everyone's questions can be asked and answered. All necessary and important steps.

The trustees and administration, as our elected representatives, want to know what their "bosses" (that's us) feel is best for the district. What to build (and where) are primary questions coupled with costs, bond issues and tax rates. Best thoughts on those subjects appears to center on a new high school campus plus additions to the elementary and middle schools.

But before the cart gets ahead of the horse, it is necessary to do some information collecting and cost estimating and it is at that organizational point that we find the board and the steering group. Results will be presented in the Salado Village Voice and at subsequent meetings up to and during the community wide session. All this is proper and we salute the board for steering things in this wise manner.

Salado's future is tied in

large measure to its schools. People won't come to our village to live unless we have top flight instructional centers so we owe it to ourselves and our community (not to mention the kids) to study this matter and vote to approve a bond issue carefully thought out that will take care of the building needs of our growing student population for at least the next eight to ten years.

Much information will be forthcoming in the weeks ahead, prior to a village wide "town hall" type meeting. The steering committee has zeal and enthusiasm and will spend much of their time in a volunteer effort to help promote a bond issue to provide the funds to build what is needed. The rest of us should do no less as we inform ourselves and attend those meetings set up to study our school needs. History has proven that time and money invested in education returns many-fold to a community that rates its schools high on their priority list. Those towns fail to do this generally dry up and fade away. These are choices left in our own hands - not held by nameless people in far away political centers like Austin or Washington.

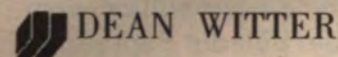

# Eagles dominate Liberty Hill in 10-7 victory

The final score did not reflect Salado's domination of the Liberty Hill Panthers Sept. 16, as the Eagles won 10-7.

Turnovers and penalties killed the Eagles' chances of scoring in the first half. On the first possession Salado drove 41 yards to the Panther 27-yard-line. An illegal motion call against Salado thwarted the drive effort, resulting in a 43-yard field goal attempt by Jereme Hosch, which failed with 8:40 remaining in the opening period. The effort was marked by a 36-yard run around end by Jason Hosch, who ran for 90 yards on the night.

Javier Montes picked up Jerome Peoples fumble mid-stride and ran it back 30 yards for the only Liberty Hill score. Kevin Powell kicked the point-after to give Liberty Hill a 7-0 lead with 9:28 remaining in the half.

With under three minutes remaining, the Eagles were forced to punt at midfield. Gabe Soto recovered the muffed punt for Salado, giving the Eagles the ball at the Liberty Hill 19 yard line with 2:22 remaining in the half.

The Eagles faced fourth down and inches at the Panther 10 yard line. Shawn Easley was stopped at the line by the Panthers with 1:22 remaining.

Salado took over the second half, scoring on its second possession. Liberty Hill went for a first down on fourth and a yard to go near

mid-field, but the stingy Salado defense stopped the Panthers to take over at their own 48 yard line.

The Salado defense held Liberty Hill to 84 yards total offense. Senior running back Billy Simmons was never a threat, as the Eagles thwarted the 200 lb. Panther at every turn, holding him to less than 3 yards per carry.

Shane Johnston, in his best performance of the season, threw deep to Shawn Reichert on second and 15. Reichert made a diving catch of 35-yards to give Salado a first down at the Liberty Hill 20 yard line.

After Jason Hosch punched the ball to the 11 yard line on two carries, Easley followed with two more carries to give Salado the ball at the 2 yard line. Easley followed his line across for the score with 4:18 left in the third quarter. Jereme Hosch booted the point-after to tie the game at 7-7.

Twice Salado turned over the ball to the Panthers within the Eagles' 25-yard line. But the Eagle defense held tough, with Jason Hosch stopping a fake field goal attempt and a second field goal attempt falling short.

Salado took over at its own 19 yard line and marched to the Panther 10 yard line. William Culp spurred the drive with a 13-yard catch and a remarkable 30-yard catch to give the Eagles a first down at the Panther 14 yard line. Culp leaped high above two defenders to grab

Johnston's pass to give Salado great field position.

Facing fourth and 5, the Eagles chose to kick a 27 yard field goal. Jereme Hosch's foot was good enough to give Salado the 10-7 lead with 4:53 remaining in the game.

Johnston threw for 106 yards on five completions. Culp caught three passes for 60 yards. Johnston also carried twice for 21 yards.

Jason Hosch carried 16 times for 90 yards and Easley carried 10 times for 36 yards.

The Eagles offense tallied 305 yards for the night. It turned over the ball three times.

Leading the defense were David Berumen with 14 tackles, 2 for losses; Michael Sierra, 12 tackles, 2 for losses even though he was double teamed throughout the game; Rusty Wasik, 12 tackles and Jerry Ratliff and Jereme Hosch had 8 tackles each.

The Eagles will face the undefeated Thorndale Bull-

dogs 8:00 p.m. Sept. 23 at Eagle Field.

Thorndale will seek revenge for last year's loss to the Eagles, as Salado beat the Bulldogs to win the district championship.

Thorndale is ranked #1 in the state for 1-A football. Fifteen lettermen return, including Anthony Dominguez at quarterback and linebacker.

## Teachers and employees of non-profits can take advantage of the 403(B) retirement plan

If you are a teacher or an employee of a non-profit organization, you can gain special retirement benefits through your 403(B) retirement plan. This plan is an excellent way for employees to invest for retirement, reduce current income taxes and defer taxes on the earnings placed in the plan account.

As a participant in the plan, a portion of your salary goes into your retirement account. It will show up on your check as a salary reduction, since the amount of your voluntary contributions isn't considered salary. You won't have to pay taxes on that money until you withdraw it from the plan.

In addition, like an IRA, any earnings in your account will grow tax deferred until they're withdrawn. A 403(B) can help accumulate a substantially greater amount by the time you retire than if your earnings were taxed each year.

By law, investment choices in a 403(B) are restricted to mutual funds, fixed or variable annuities. The specific investment is designated at the time you enroll in the plan. Generally, the employer selects a mutual fund family or annuity family to work with, then you select the fund or account most appropriate for you. Your investment broker can help you select the right investment.

The amount of voluntary contributions to your 403(B) can be

as much as 20 percent of your gross salary, not exceeding \$9,500 annually. Although not required, your employer can make discretionary contributions to the plan. Your employer's contribution combined with your individual pre-tax contribution cannot exceed the lesser of 25 percent of compensation or \$30,000.

Keep in mind, if you withdraw an amount from your 403(B), it is subject to ordinary income taxes in the year you receive it. If you withdraw before age 59-1/2, you may incur a 10 percent IRS early withdrawal penalty tax.

As long as you are at least 59-1/2, your withdrawals avoid a 10 percent IRS penalty, but are subject to ordinary income taxes. Also, you can access your account balance without penalty because of disability, separation from service with your employer or financial hardship. The IRS defines hardship as an immediate and heavy financial need that can be met by no other resources. Withdrawals to meet a financial hardship are subject to ordinary income taxes and, if you are under the age 59-1/2, the 10 percent IRS penalty.

Once you are past 59-1/2, you have several ways to access your

403(B) plan account. One option, without incurring any current taxes, is to roll the funds directly from your 403(B) plan into an IRA. Another, if you prefer, is to receive a series of equal, regular payments (e.g. monthly or annually) over your lifetime or a designated period.

Third, you have the option to withdraw your entire plan balance. However, if you opt to do so, your employer is required by the law to first withhold 20 percent of your balance for federal income tax. This is not an additional tax. Rather, it is a payment against the taxes you'll owe on the distribution when you file your current year's tax return (similar to your employer withholding taxes from your paycheck).

Only non-profit organization classified as section 501(C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code Non-profit organizations are eligible to adopt a 403(B) plan. Other organizations include: colleges and universities, non-profit hospitals, scientific foundations, museums, symphony orchestras, charitable institutions and churches, synagogues and other religious organizations.

If you work for a public school system or any other 501(C)(3) non-profit organization, now is a good time to save tax dollars and invest for retirement. Seek help from an investment professional to set up a 403(B) plan with your employer.

# Sub-Varsity teams beat LH

The Junior Varsity Eagles won their second game of the season, defeating the Liberty Hill Panthers 20-6.

Cody Hall carried the point-after to give Salado an 8-0 lead.

Hall then took a 45-yard lead to give Salado its second touchdown. The PAT failed and Salado held a 14-0 lead before Liberty Hill was able to score.

Paul Mashburn dove in from 6 yards on a quarterback keeper to give Salado its final score. The run topped a 30 yard drive by the Eagles. The PAT kick failed.

Other offensive standouts were linemen Mitch Lindley and Joseph McGregor.

David Kirk, Shane Berrier and Chris Frazier lead the defense.

## 8th Grade

Even though the 8th grade Salado Eagles did not touch the ball until there was just a minute left in the first quarter, the Eagles beat the Liberty Hill Panther 36-0.

Salado's first team offense ran only six plays on the night, but Guajardo and Gillespie had fine games in this short time. Adam Nuse and James Howerton helped make gaping holes on the long scoring plays.

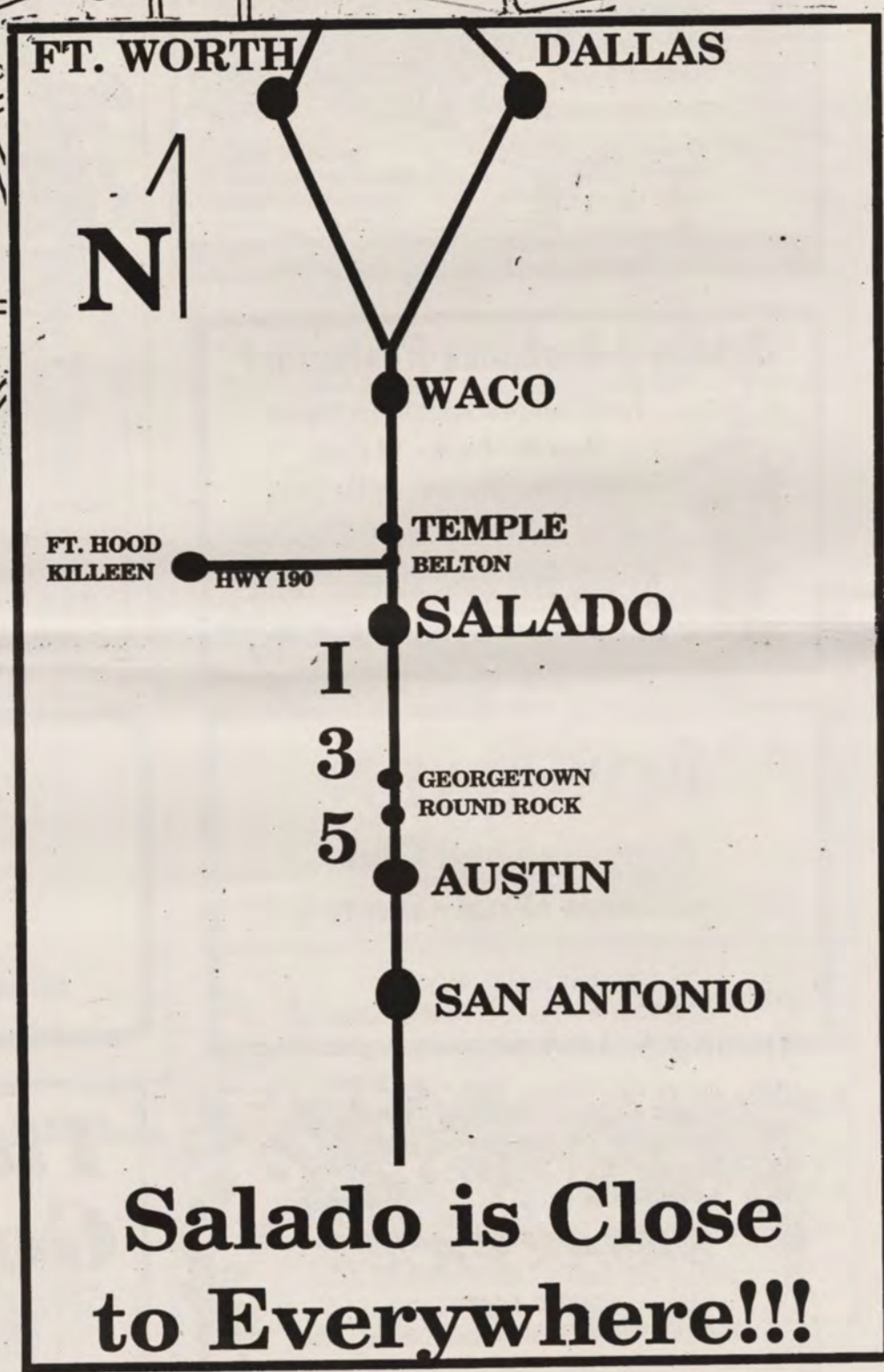

I want to congratulate your paper on writing the article, and I want to congratulate the groups in your area that are attempting to educate the

community on the harmful effects of smoking.

Lest there be any doubt, let me state that, in my opinion, nicotine is an extremely addictive drug. I never realized how addictive until I quit. I thought smoking was a "nervous habit". It is not a "habit", it is an addiction, and my withdrawal has been difficult and painful.

I think if I had been told the truth about nicotine at an early age, and if the glamour and mystique had been eliminated, things might have been different. One of the most important elements for me when I began smoking (at age 14) was peer pressure. The blessing is that peer pressure may have ultimately been the reason I quit.

I think your article is an example of the peer pressure that helped me

decide to stop smoking. Education like this tells the truth - smoking kills. I am grateful that at the age of 45, after a lot of education from articles like yours - I decided to stop killing myself. Thank you again.

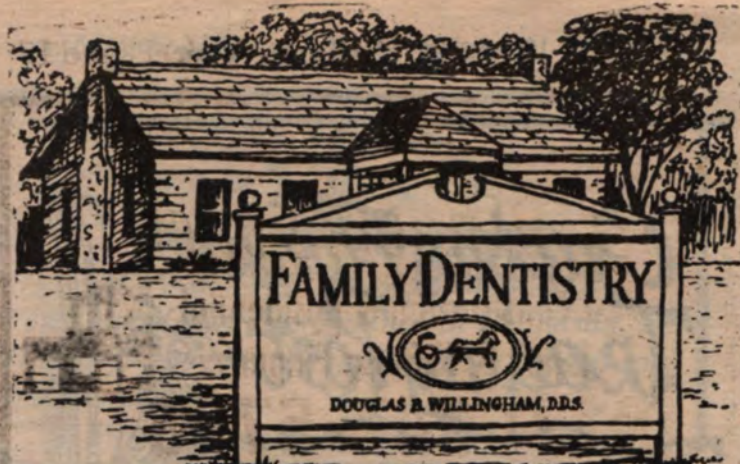

**Pigeon and Creek News**

The regular monthly session of the Salado Chamber of Commerce's board, held this past Monday, was highlighted by news from the Bell County Health Department chief Wayne Farrell who reported that the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) has found continuing high samples of the fecal coliform bacteria in Salado Creek and recommends the "off-limits" be continued.
