Campuses ranked in top 87 percentile

Salado schools get high marks on TEA Report Card

Salado schools recently received a Texas Education Agency Report Card for 1993-94 school year, which indicated that Salado High School was in the top 88th percentile of all schools in the state and Thomas Arnold Elementary School was in the 87th percentile of all elementary schools in

the state.

The report card was based on (Texas Academic Assessment of Skills) TAAS test scores, college admission test scores, drop-out rate, teaching and professional staff, salaries, tax rate and other indicators.

Salado I.S.D. was ranked higher than any other school district in the County. It was also higher ranked than any of the

schools in its UIL District.

Salado schools were among the top five school districts in Region XII, which has 77 school districts.

Salado ISD ranked well above the state average on the TAAS test scores and the college admission tests.

Salado is above the state average in attendance and for per pupil expenditures.

The school district also

has a higher-than-average tax rate. The state average is \$1.39 while the Salado I.S.D. tax rate is \$1.442.

The only areas in which the school district was noticeably ranked below the state average was in teacher experience, and salaries.

"I am very pleased with the efforts of the community, the parents, the teachers and administration for the efforts to reach this

level of achievement," said Superintendent Steven Ervin.

33rd Gathering of the Clans & Scottish Games here Nov. 11-13

It's time for the 33rd Annual Scottish Games, Nov. 11-13. The games will feature bagpipe band competition, Highland dancing, Scottish vendors, athletic events, sheep dog trials and nightly entertainment.

Just as they were the vanguards of civilization in other regions of American west of the Appalachians, the Scots formed the first large group of settlers in Central Texas. This type was indomitable, hard and sometimes ruthless, but always independent and courageous, and had a passionate love of knowledge and freedom. Major Sterling C. Robertson, 2nd generation removed from his Scottish emigrant ancestor, was surveying in central Texas the winter of 1823-24. Most of the 600 families that he introduced into Central Texas

were of Scottish origin. His friend and helper in the later part of the colony was Alexander Thomson, another Scot. In fact, many Texas counties bear the names of Scots.

Sponsored by the Central Texas Area Museum, the event not only promotes the Scottish heritage, but also stands as a landmark to the impact of Scottish immigrants on the history of Central Texas.

Nov. 12, 1961, 40 Clans convened in Salado. The tartan banners of each clan waved from poles eight feet tall with the name of the clan on the pole. Over 1,000 people registered, not to mention many others who visited throughout the day.

Preliminary events begin on Friday morning with Scottish vendors, museum exhibits and a Genealogy Workshop at 1

p.m. A special supper is hosted at the Stagecoach Inn at 6 p.m. to be followed by Scottish entertainment in the Longhorn room]

Perhaps the biggest attraction of any Scottish Games is the bagpipe and drum competitions. Pipe bands from Austin, Dallas, Houston and San Antonio will perform a Massed Bands parade for both the Opening Ceremonies Nov. 12 at noon, and the Closing Ceremonies on Nov. 13, at approximately 6 p.m.

In addition, solo piping and drumming competition will be held throughout the day Nov. 12, with the bands going into head to head competition Nov. 13. Each band will compete in two events; a Medley of tunes and a March, Strathspey and Reel. The bands will be judged by some of the best pipers

and drummers in the world. Several of whom will be coming all the way from Scotland just for the events. Prizes will be awarded at the closing.

Keanu Reeves has had the best selection and widest variety of movie parts of any of today's young actors. Speed, which will be released later this month on video-cassette, is just another example of Reeves versatility.

It is hard to fathom that the same dude from **Bill and Ted's Excellent Adventure** and the young man in **Dracula** are the same young man in the lead role of this non-stop action movie.

But Reeves pulls all of the roles off, even this role as LA cop Jack Traven, a bomb expert who must defuse a bomb on a moving bus in LA morning rush hour traffic.

From the first five minutes, Speed takes off towards and explosive finish that does not disappoint action fans. It is better than the other summer blockbuster **True Lies** and better than copy cat **Blown Away**.

It falls short of the mark left by **Die Hard**, which is the standard against which all action flicks will be judged.

But, for action junkies, Speed delivers what it promises in its title.

Salado aces TEA report card

(Writer's Note: Thinking that readers just might need a break from the cacophony of sound and fury heard and seen during the final days of the mid-term election, this week's column deals with non-political items including the results of our local school's achievement during the past year, plus a report on a great book. Next issue will cover the results of yesterday's election. No doubt, there will be plenty to comment on from now until the 1996 presidential wars -- at least if this most recent vote is the watershed we predicted!)

Local Report Card

The Texas Education Agency's Division of Performance Reporting sent "report cards" to all 1,126 school districts within the state several days ago to show how each elementary and secondary school in Texas is faring in the academic excellence department. This is especially important during these days of political sharpshooting at the overall field of education.

Salado "aced" its report with a "top of the county" finding as our secondary school (junior/senior students) hit the 88th percentile ranking which ended up Number One in Bell

County! Salado High was number 129 out of the 1026 high schools in the state which accounted for the high ranking. Other county high schools ranged from the 82d percentile (Rogers) to Belton (66th percentile); Temple (61st); Holland (53d); Bartlett (30th) and Killeen High (32d) and Killeen Ellison (26th percentile).

At the elementary level our own Thomas Arnold school ranked 450th out of 3,414 prep schools for a percentile ranking of 87. Again this was the highest in Bell County when compared city by city. One Belton elementary, standing alone, hit the 90th percentile but when combined with other Belton schools dropped to the 55th percentile.

The factors used by the TEA to determine the academic excellence of Texas public schools included: results of the TAAS testing program; retention rates by grades; percentage of students who graduate; the professional staffing in each school district including advanced degrees, experience, certification; student teacher ratios, salary lev-

els, local tax effort and average classroom sizes.

Salado's superior performance speaks well for our education community which takes in the student body, teachers, administrators, support staff, school trustees and citizens within the district - all of whom have to work together in achieving the goal of excellence set out some four years ago when we were recovering from accreditation problems with the state education agency.

Schools across Texas are struggling to do a better job each year - many with decreasing funds. Salado has not only worked hard but has succeeded as shown by the annual performance scores that have risen steadily since 1990.

All of us owe our trustees and professional staff a large vote of thanks for setting goals, achieving them and then moving to higher levels each year - all to the benefit of our students. Each of us needs to pass on a sincere "well done" the next time we run across one of our educational leaders. They deserve it.

We also owe it to this team, a positive vote for the upcoming bond issue that we feel certain is going to be called soon by the

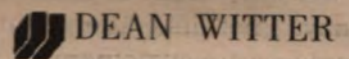

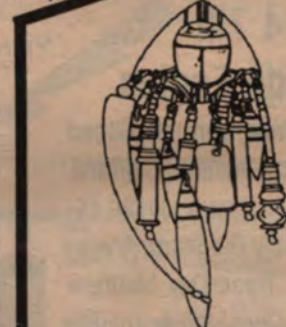

Eagles blow past Academy on way to play-offs

Hosch twins Jason and Jereme combined for 324 yards rushing and three touchdowns to lead the Salado Eagles past the Academy Bumblebees 38-17 at Eagle Field Nov. 4. The win put Salado into the play-offs with a 6-4 season, 4-1 in district play.

Jason Hosch carried 25 times for 237 yards and two touchdowns while Jereme Hosch carried 5 times for 87 yards and one touchdown.

Jereme Hosch scored the first touchdown for Salado on a run of 40 yards in the first quarter.

Jerry Ratliff fell on a Bee fumble at the Academy 41 yard line on the first play from scrimmage. With 10:50 left in the game, Jereme Hosch dashed up the middle for a 40 yard touchdown. He added the extra point to give Salado a 7-0 lead.

Salado took over the ball from the Bees with 8:51 left in the third quarter. Jason Hosch punched the ball 12 yards to the Salado 41 yard line. On third down, he dashed 28 yards to the Academy 22 yard line.

The Eagles could not find the end zone and faced 4-16 at the Academy 28. Jereme Hosch blasted a 45 yard field goal with 5:36 left in the first quarter to give Salado a 10-0 lead.

Salado took over again at the Academy 22 yard line but could not convert the opportunity into points when a 24 yard field goal attempt by Jereme Hosch went wide right.

Taking over at the 20 yard line, Academy only needed two plays to find pay dirt. After Jason Taylor was stopped for one yard gain, Andrew Garcia dashed around end for a 79 yard touchdown run with 11:47 left in the game. Ben Ingriola kicked the PAT to bring Academy close 10-7.

Salado took over at its 20 yard line with 11:45 left in the half. After earning a

first down at the Eagle 32 yard line, Jason Hosch broke through the middle for a 10 yard run; a personal foul added another 15 yards to give Salado the ball at the Academy 43 yard line. Jereme Hosch ran up the middle to the Bee 27, followed by a 27-yard touchdown run by Jason Hosch. Jereme Hosch kicked the PAT to give Salado a 17-7 lead.

After stopping the Eagles, Salado took over on a punt at its 19 yard line.

Runs of 45 yards by David Berumen and 25 yards by Jereme Hosch set-up a 2-yard dive by Jason Hosch with 5:11 left in the half. Jereme Hosch kicked the PAT to give Salado a 24-7 lead at the half.

Salado almost gave the game away in the third quarter on turnovers. A.C. Chaffin picked up an Eagle fumble at the 31 yard line and returned it to the end zone. Ingriola kicked the extra point, 14-24.

Academy pulled within a touchdown on a 48-yard field goal by Ingriola after Cody Curry recovered an Eagle fumble in Salado territory. The field goal with less than a minute left in the third quarter brought the score to 24-17.

Salado turned over the ball twice more with 11 seconds left in the half and with 7:57 left in the game, but the stingy Salado defense did not allow the opportunities to become points.

The Eagles scored twice within four minutes in the last six minutes of the game.

Salado took just three minutes to drive 96 yards for the final score of the game. The Eagles took over at their own 4 yard line with 5:32 left in the game.

On the first play of the drive, Jason Hosch took the ball up the middle and dashed 79 yards before he was taken down at the Bees 17 yard line.

David Berumen punched the ball in from the 1 yard line with 2:24 left in the game. Jereme Hosch kicked the extra point to give

Salado its 31-17 lead.

Jerry Ratliff intercepted a Bee pass and returned it 35 yards for the final touchdown. Jereme Hosch hit the PAT for the final lead of 38-17.

Salado controlled both lines of the scrimmage with 478 yards rushing and 7 yards passing. The Bees were held to 158 yards rushing and -20 yards passing.

Salado turned over the ball four times while the Bees turned over the ball twice.

Salado was called for pen-

alties nine times for 70 yards, the Bees were hit seven times for 55 yards.

Don't believe all you hear when choosing your investments

In a society bombarded with all sorts of news from the mass media, knowing whether a "hot investment" touted by the media is really worth your hard-earned money can be difficult. Keeping an open mind and putting things in perspective are vital keys to unlocking the value of potential investments. So, before you base your investment decisions on the latest news, review your portfolio objectives and ask yourself the following questions:

1. Does this investment meet your objectives for income and growth? Investments that pay regular interest or a relatively secure dividend are considered "income" investments, while a "growth" investment is one from which you hope to benefit from the increasing value of the investment, also known as capital appreciation.
2. What are the risks of the investment? Generally, the more return potential, the greater risk you must assume. It is important to know your "suitability" ahead of time to establish which investments will fall within your risk boundaries. "Conservative" investors prefer a relatively low amount of risk, while "aggressive" investors usually take on more. "Speculative" investors (or speculators) are clearly the biggest risk-takers, willing to risk a larger loss in exchange for the possibility of making a larger profit.
3. Does this involvement offer the tax advantages you are looking for? Investors should also include taxes in the investment equation since not all investment returns are subject to the same taxation. For example, tax-

advantaged investment, such as municipal bonds, offer federally tax-free interest. Investments such as limited partnerships offer partially tax-sheltered income, while others such as annuities and certain life insurance policies provide tax-deferred growth so that you can postpone taxation until you withdraw funds.

4. How easily can you sell this particular investment? Investments should be judged by your need for liquidity and how easily you can convert the investment into cash on short notice. For some investors, this may be irrelevant, but for those who do not have vast financial resources, a liquid investment may be a necessity.

5. Is it a "long term" or "short term" investment? Like the question of liquidity, knowing the time frame of an investment can influence your decision to participate. Some investors want to see results in six to 12 months, while others seek long-term appreciation and are comfortable riding out market fluctuations over the long haul.

If you have questions or concerns about a highly publicized investment, an investment broker can explain the intricacies of that investment and advise you of whether it suits your portfolio objectives. After all, just because the media say it's a good investment doesn't mean it's a good investment for you.

- **Supply comfortable, accurate temperature control:** Use a temperature zone control system to supply heating and cooling to areas of the home only when they need it. The home office can be kept at a comfortable temperature during the workday, for example, with separate energy-saving temperatures in effect for the home's other areas.

At a minimum, use a programmable thermostat that is accurate within approximately ± 1 degree F. A programmable thermostat may pay for itself in less than one year because it can cut heating and air-conditioning costs by as much as 33 percent.

I just finished re-reading "To Kill A Mockingbird" for the fifth time and followed it up by viewing once again the tape of the movie that followed the book so faithfully. Harper Lee won a Pulitzer for her novel and Gregory Peck the Academy Award for his portrayal of Atticus Finch the main character in "Mockingbird".
