## Salado Youth Assoc. elects Directors, begins planning

The Board of Directors for the Salado Youth Association were elected at a meeting held March 31 at the Salado High School. They are Tom Berrier, Ed Buchanan, Steven Ervin, Glenn Hodge, Floyd Lee, Larry McGregor, Billy Pipes, Ricky Preston, Stewart Smith and Mike Tubbs.

The immediate goal of the organization is to raise the money necessary to purchase approximately 21 acres across from the existing baseball field.

Once the land is acquired, tentatively within 3 months, the plans are to build additional baseball and soccer fields, then even-

tually add tennis courts, basketball courts, a swimming pool (for both indoor and outdoor use), walking paths and exercise and aerobic rooms.

As the name of the organization implies, the Association will put its emphasis on facilities for the youth of the community, but will also provide recreation activities for adults.

Family memberships in the Association are currently being sold through the Board members as part of the fund raising for the property acquisition. Other activities will be announced for the same purpose and a study for grants is underway.

The Plantation is a prime example of pre-Civil War Southern plantation, complete with stables, family cemetery and slave quarters.*

# Eagles 1-1 in first week of district

In the Eagles district opener they took on pre-season favorite Liberty Hill. Salado overcame an early 3-0 deficit to take a 6-3 after the top of the third.

Salado received four walks in the inning Brandon McGregor, Chris Jackson, and Jeremy Fischer collected base hits and rbi's in the inning.

A porous Salado defense and 7 free passes to base by Eagle pitchers allowed Liberty Hill to score 12 runs in the inning. Only 5 of these runs were earned.

Fischer, Bubba Moore & Richard Jackson bunched hits together in the seventh inning to allow the Eagles to score two more runs. This left the score at 15-8 at the end of the game.

The Eagle J.V. defeated Liberty Hill by a score of 4-

2. Shawn Easley led the Eagle J.V. at the plate by going 3 for 3. Chris Frazier was credited with the win.

April 2, the Eagles took on the Hutto Hippos. Salado jumped out to a 5-0 first inning lead and never looked back. The runs came with only one base hit in the inning, a double by Jeremy Fischer. The Eagles received four bases on balls in the first and Hutto made 2 errors.

This trend continued through the night. Salado recorded only four base hits on the night but they received 13 bases on balls as they scored in every inning.

The Eagles also showed some generosity in the fourth inning. Hutto received four walks and recorded their only hit of the

game, as Salado committed two errors for three Hippo runs.

The game came to an end after five innings because of the 10 run rule. The 13-3 win gives the Eagles a 9-2 season record and a 1-1 district record.

Jason Hosch had 2 hits in the game, while Jeremy Fischer and Bill Wilson recorded one each.

Richard Jackson recorded the win on the mound. He allowed one hit and struck out five in the 3 2/3 innings. Fischer finished up the game.

The Eagles J.V. improved their record to 8-1 on the season with a 12-4 win over Hutto. William Culp recorded two hits for Salado and Tommy Hagen picked up the win on the mound.

**Planning early for nursing home expenses to reduce dependence**  
 Part 1 of 2

How likely do you think it is that someday you will need nursing home care? Statistics show that one in every four people over age 65 will enter a nursing home at some time in his or her life. Three out of every 10 people over age 85 will be admitted to nursing homes. If you become one of these statistics, do you have a plan for how you'll pay for the accompanying expenses? Government assistance programs, such as Medicaid, are already stretched thin. However, if the need for long-term care is not in your immediate future, you have many alternatives for paying for your potential nursing home expenses.

**Increase your savings efforts**  
 Perhaps the simplest way to cover the cost of future nursing home care is to factor it into the rate at which you're now saving for retirement. This provides important peace of mind should you ever need long-term care. And, if you don't, you can use this money for other purposes or pass it on to your heirs.

**Nursing Home Insurance**  
 If you know that you will not be able to save enough to fund your possible long-term care needs, you may want to consider purchasing a nursing home insurance policy. Nursing home insurance is designed to pay all or part of the cost of a future nursing home stay.

This type of policy works in much the same way as other types of insurance. You pay premiums while you are healthy and the insurance company promises to cover a specific amount of your future nursing home bill for a designated period of time. Both the covered cost and the length of coverage are arranged in advance between you and the insurance company.

When you purchase a nursing home policy, you must weigh the benefits that such a policy might provide you in your later years against the cost of making premium pay-

ments for coverage that you may never need. You must also consider the possibility that without such a policy an extended nursing home stay could deplete your assets. If you decide that you want this type of insurance, be sure to shop around for both cost and features.

**Your life insurance**  
 If you plan to tap your investments or savings to fund long-term care, you don't have to limit yourself to traditional sources such as your stocks, bonds or CDs. A life insurance policy may represent another source of funding. A growing number of insurance companies are allowing policyholders limited early access to all or a portion of their death benefits for use toward nursing home expenses. Such a policy might, for example, allow you to use 2% of your death benefit each month toward a nursing home stay once you have been confined to that nursing home for at least 90 days. Such payments would continue for a pre-arranged number of years.

If you have a need for additional life insurance to provide for a spouse or other dependent, this type of policy with the bonus of early access to your death benefit may be a wise choice. However, if you do not need additional life insurance coverage, some of the other sources for funding long-term care may be more appropriate.

If you're younger and in good health now, you can only guess whether you will need nursing home care in your later years. The advantage you have is that opportunity to lay the groundwork early enough to minimize or eliminate dependence on government assistance programs like Medicaid.
