Carpenter, a communicator, executive, author, writer and a 32 veteran of the Washington scene, has

been named by three presidents to positions of trust. Lyndon Johnson named her press secretary to Lady Bird Johnson; Gerald Ford appointed her to the international Women's Year Commission and Jimmy Carter appointed her Assistant Secretary of Education for Public Affairs.

Born in Salado, Carpenter is a descendant of pioneer Texas families and is a fifth generation Texan. She holds a Bachelor of Journalism from the University of Texas. She was named a Distinguished Alumna of the University of Texas in 1975 and a Liz Carpenter Distinguished Lectureship at the University was created in her honor.

Between the Johnson and Carter administrations she returned to Texas to become a consultant to the Lyndon Baines Johnson Library, organizing lecture series, seminars and fund raising events.

She has contributed articles to numerous publications, including *Redbook*, *Ladies Home Journal*, *Ms.*, *Good Housekeeping*, *Family Circle*, *Lear's* and *The Washington Post* (inauguration issue) as well as *Texas Times*. She researched and prepared a manuscript on the humor of presidents, entitled *Hail to the Comic Relief*. She has written two books **Ruffles and Flourishes** and **Getting Better of the Time**.

Memorial Day services will honor Salado's 129 war vets

Memorial Day services will be held at the Salado Cemetery 9 a.m. May 31. The public is invited to attend.

The Salado Cemetery is one of the oldest and most historic in the Central Texas area. The oldest gravestone dates to 1856, although it is commonly believed that there were earlier burial and that there are numerous "lost" graves.

A number of pioneer citizens who played important roles in the development and settlement of Bell County and Texas are buried there, including Rev. Ferguson, father of Gov. James Ferguson; Rev. Baines, grandfather of Lyndon Baines Johnson; prominent educators involved in Salado College and Thomas Arnold High School; Maj. A. J. Rose,

member of the Board of Regents of Texas A & M University; Dr. Welborn Barton, Dr. B.D. McKie and Captain Robert Bonner Halley.

Gravesites for 129 persons serving in the armed forces or early military groups have been located. Among these: Unknown Soldier, one; early Texas Rangers, three; Texas War for Independence, one;

Mexican War, two; Spanish-American War, four; Confederate States of America Army, 27; Union Army, one; World War I, 22; World War II, 47; Korean War, 10; Vietnam War, eight and peace-time service, two. Several buried in Salado Cemetery served in more than one war.

Hoffa is a great movie.

While the film adaptation claims it is no biography, it is very realistic. Danny DeVito, who stars in and directs **Hoffa**, said his character is fictional as Hoffa's best friend and confidante.

Jack Nicholson's performance as Teamsters boss Jimmy Hoffa is fantastic. It warranted a nomination for Best Actor by the Academy. Watch it and see if you don't agree. The set of his jaw, his eyes and his accent are all true-to-life.

Also true-to-life is the hard language. Just about every three words is foul language. But we must remember that Hoffa was no Boy Scout.

Clocking in at over two hours, Hoffa is overly long for some folks. But not for me, because Nicholson's and DeVito's performances are so strong.

Senate race still toss-up

One week from this coming Saturday, June 5, there will be a run-off election to decide who will be our next freshman U.S. Senator: interim Bob Krueger, Democrat from New Braunfels, appointed by Governor Ann Richards to fill the post vacated by Lloyd Bentsen who decided to end his career as Treasury Secretary under President Clinton or hard charging Kay Hutchison, Republican, who came in first in the special election earlier this month by 97 votes.

Question before the house then - who will win on June 5? Answer is a bit sticky. If we look at the vote totals from the first election the nod would have to go to Hutchison. After all she and her two GOP rivals - Congressmen Barton and Fields - came up with a 57 percent majority and if the GOPers hold tight - as they usually do in run-offs - then it is clear sailing for the Treasurer of Texas.

However, things don't always go according to numbers. Actually decisions are made at an unconscious level as we look at personalities, hair styles, speaking ability and reputations. Krueger again falls behind since his style and personality is closer to Daffy Duck

than a high powered Senatorial wannabe. Still, take a peek at his most recent TV ad wherein he admits he is a "lousy politician". "Is it my suit, my hair, my physique. The week of May 23-29 is recognized across Texas as Emergency Medical Services Week. It is a week when we should take a look at EMS and the men and women who dedicate themselves to helping others.

An EMS system includes the equipment and technology used at the hospital in the emergency department, diagnostic labs, and rehabilitation centers; at the colleges and universities teaching EMS courses; and in the dispatch and communications centers.

An EMS system includes law enforcement organizations, first responder groups, funding agencies, regulatory bodies, and public education programs. And most of all, an EMS system includes you. EMS needs you to make that first vital emergency call that swings the components of an EMS system into action. Because without that call, there is no system. EMS is a system...

A system to save a life.

EMS is available to all the citizens of Salado and "One call does it all...9-1-1." The system is now activated with you

making the call. The dispatcher gets all the vital information: what, where and when. The dispatcher then alerts the appropriate personnel to respond.

In a medical emergency in Salado, this would include alerting the Salado Volunteer Fire Department in addition to the Belton Fire Department ambulance. The Salado Fire Department has seven volunteers trained for medical emergencies. They can perform CPR, basic life support, bleeding control, splinting broken bones, extrication of people trapped, advanced airway control, IV therapy. They are also able to establish contact with an Emergency Physician. The Belton Fire Department ambulance has the equipment for cardiac emergencies and transports the patients.

At the hospital the Emergency Room physician will assume care of the patient.

The American College of Emergency Physicians marks its 25th anniversary in 1993. These doctors have chosen emergency medicine as their area of specialty. The "system" is working until the patient is released from the hospital, regardless of how long that may take.
