## Fabulous Fall Fiesta II

Annual event Sept. 18 in Pace Park benefits Peacable Kingdom

The Fabulous Fall Fiesta II will be held in Pace Park 6 p.m.-midnight Sept. 18. The Fiesta benefits the Peacable Kingdom Retreat for Children, located 20 minutes from Salado in Youngsfort.

The event is held in celebration of the children whom the Peacable Kingdom serves. The retreat is a special place where chronically ill children year-round get a chance to experience the outdoor world. They escape the pressures of life-threatening illnesses as they hike trails, play games and stay overnight.

"I feel that this place truly helps the children get well," said Jan Upchurch at

the Child Life Department of Scott & White Hospital in Temple. "It makes them realize that there is a beautiful world outside of the hospital walls and gives them something to look forward to."

Special Projects Coordinator Mary Helen Schreiner explained that her parents Daurice and Jim Bowmer started the retreat as a tribute to their grandchildren, one of whom they lost to heart disease and others who struggle with diabetes.

The Fiesta not only raises the absolute necessary funds for operation, but also is a celebration of life, according to Schreiner. "That is what we all should

be doing everyday... celebrating the moments God gives to us," Schreiner said.

Don Strange is catering the event, which will feature mariachis and Mexican dancers 6-8 p.m.. J and J Productions, which produces entertainment at Six Flags, is bringing a 50s show 8-9 p.m.. The band, Hotcakes, from Austin, will provide music from the 50s including country and western 9 p.m.-midnight.

A silent auction will be held between events 7-10 p.m., as well as short live auctions.

The trees may be ordered at this time from the IGA Village Foods or by calling Pilgrim or Cathy Sands. The trees will be treated and ready to install by the purchaser either in the ground or secured in some other way, thus insuring the stability of the trees throughout the festive 38-

day holiday season. Each tree owner is asked to put white lights on the tree and have them lit each evening until 10 p.m. so as to present a most unusual bright and picturesque scene for the thousands of visitors that come to the village during the weeks between Thanksgiving and New Year's.

The northern pine, a long-needle trees, will be sold for \$15 for the four-foot size and \$20 for the five-foot tree.

This is something entirely new for Salado and will insure a great deal of interest throughout the area by tourists interested in seeing what Salado is doing to make this year's holiday season extra special.

Make a delicate biscuit crust and cut into rounds, laying them on top of the squirrel. Let them boil, covered closely for fifteen minutes. Pile the squirrel in the gravy with a spoon of browned flour and pour over it. Send it to the table hot!"

## Eagles lose to Riesel in opener

For Salado Eagles fans, there's good news and bad news.

The good news is Salado will face Bruceville-Eddy 8 p.m. Sept. 10 in their first home game of the year.

The bad news is the Eagles got waxed by the Riesel Indians, 37-13 in the season opener.

More bad news is that defensive stand-out Jesse Finger will not play this week. At this time, coaches cannot say when the injured junior will return to the lineup.

Each cloud has a silver lining and the silver lining to the Eagles black cloud of defeat Sept. 3 is that they beat themselves.

The Eagles dropped the ball a dozen times, turning it over on four occasions. Salado was also called for over 100 yards in penalties.

Had the Salado defense not allowed four huge plays, the game would have been a close match. Riesel scored on a 63-yard pass play, and an 80-yard run on the first play from scrimmage of the second half. A 20-yard pass followed by a 29-yard run combined for a Riesel touchdown in the third

quarter.

Jason Hosch scored both touchdowns for Salado, with a one-yard run in the first half and a six yard run in the second half. Both TDs were the result of long offensive drives of 47 yards and 63 yards, respectively.

## Lions Club to meet

"He thinks like you and I do," Black said.

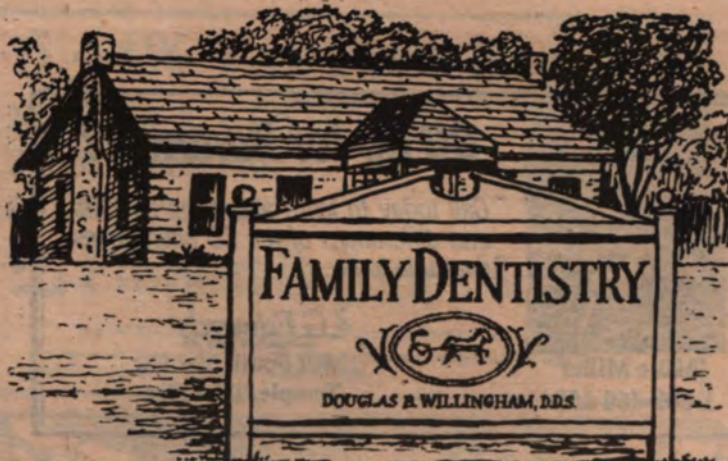

## New higher taxes make municipal bonds more valuable than ever

### Part 2 of 4 in a Series

Since the earliest moments of his campaign, President Clinton was perfectly candid about his intention to raise the taxes of those most able to afford it. His dogma of "shared sacrifice" was the common thread throughout his economic package. But perhaps where it was most evident was in the increase in personal income tax rates for wealthier Americans.

Taxable income of \$140,000 or more for couples, and \$115,000 or more for single filers, will now fall into a new 36 percent tax bracket. This represents an immediate tax hike of five percentage points for this group of taxpayers who used to have a top rate of 31 percent. In addition, the highest of these high-income earners will now be subject to a 10 percent surtax, catapulting their rate on taxable income of \$250,000 or more to 39.6 percent. Together, with the continued reduction of deductions and exemptions first effective in 1991, many upper-income investors top marginal tax rates will exceed 40 percent. Residents of high-tax states may see their total federal and state tax liabilities approach 50 percent.

It's estimated that these new rates will affect only the wealthiest 1.2 percent of all taxpayers, but if you are one of the affected few, this limited scope doesn't provide much consolation. In addition, taxpayers assuming that they have one more year to enjoy their lower rates are retroactive to January 1, 1993.

The new higher rates only confirm what upper-income investors already know: tax-advantaged investments are more important now than ever. For years, investors in the highest tax brackets have used tax-free municipal bonds and tax-free bond funds to lessen the impact of taxes on their investment returns. That's because the interest produced by municipal bonds is free from federal income tax and, depending on the investor's state of residence and the bond selected, perhaps from state and local tax, too. Higher tax rates only increase the value of a municipal bond investment. The following example illustrates why:

Under the old law, an investor in

the top bracket of 31 percent who was considering a municipal bond yielding 5 percent would have to purchase a taxable investment yielding 7.25 percent to receive an equivalent yield after taxes. If this same investor is now in the new 36 percent bracket, he or she will need to buy a taxable investment yielding 7.81 percent for an equivalent yield. And if he or she is subject to the 39.6 percent rate, the investor has to find a taxable investment yielding 8.28 percent just to compensate for the higher amount of tax due on the interest. (Investors should keep in mind that the interest from certain municipal bonds is considered a preference item for the alternative minimum tax.)

Investors in at least the 28 percent tax bracket will generally benefit from tax-free municipal bonds. But those investors who suddenly find themselves in a much higher bracket have even more to gain from a tax standpoint. Although there's probably not much these investors can do to reduce their 1993 tax bills, tax-free municipal bonds and bond funds may have a positive impact on future tax liabilities.
