## Town meeting called April 7 about potential rock quarries

Members of Save Our Resources and Environment (SORE) have called for a town meeting 7 p.m. April 7 in the Salado Civic Center.

The meeting will inform citizens of potential effects of portable rock crushers between Belton and Salado on the residents of those areas, as well as peripheral effects to citizens of Salado proper.

SORE organized as residents in the area who gathered together in late 1993 in opposition to a proposed portable rock crusher near Stillhouse Hollow Lake and Camp Tahuaya.

Since then, SORE has grown to 100 members and

petitioned against the rock crusher, having over 3,000 signatures.

SORE has retained the services of environmental law firm Henry, Lowerre, Hess and Frederick.

Legal counsel for SORE will be present at the meeting for questions.

According to President Larry Gumpert, SORE needs support from Salado residents as well as those neighboring the proposed rock quarry who will be most effected.

"This is something that will effect a lot of people in a lot of different ways," Gumpert said. "I don't think most people know just how dramatically it may effect their life-styles."

"The quarry near Tahuaya is not the only

quarry planned for the Salado area. There are other potential sites near Salado," Gumpert said.

Gumpert said that the meeting will be informative to all Saladoans concerned about the quality of life in the village.

"We will also discuss some of our next steps in our fight against this quarry," Gumpert said. "Ultimately, we would like to see state regulation of the industry"

Areas of concern to Saladoans include these, according to Gumpert

1. Dust. Extra fine dust in the quantities from even a small quarry will destroy paint, plants, trees and wildlife.

2. Noise from engines,



There are two potential sites for rock quarries within four miles from Salado proper. This will be discussed April 7.

- 3. Land and habitat destruction.
- 4. Safety of water supply.
- 5. Safety of Stillhouse Hollow Dam and Reservoir.
- 6. Safety of Camp Tahuaya.
- 7. Safety of Outdoor Learning Center.
- 8. Devaluation of property values
- 9. Reduction of tourist business. "This will not remain the clean, quiet, peaceful village that we have today," Gumpert said.

**The Age of Innocence** is a compelling, picturesque adaptation of Edith Wharton's novel by Martin Scorsese, who also directed **Goodfellas**. The only similarity between the two movies by Scorsese is his attention to detail.

The Age of Innocence is so beautiful to look at, so wonderful to listen to, that the viewer may find himself awestruck. It is easily one of the most wonderfully filmed movies I have seen.

The costuming and scenery capture the elegance of the Victorian period in which the story is set.

Daniel Day-Lewis is strong and quiet as Archer, a young lawyer promised to May (Ryder). But he finds himself inexplicably drawn to May's cousin (Pfeiffer), a married woman who is the subject of much gossip among the upper echelon of New York City society.

**The Age of Innocence** is as much about society as it is about love. It is also about sacrifice, longing and loss.

## After primaries, it's off to the races for Texas Senate sit, Governors Chair

This time next week, the line ups for the November 1994 general election will be completed, following a few runoff decisions to be made by both major political parties. Democrats naturally have two of the noisiest battles to contend with on April 12, the runoff election date. First is the contentious race between incumbent Supreme Court Judge Raul Gonzales and wannabee Rene Haas. The campaign drew blood the first time Haas' TV ads blossomed forth with accusations that Justice Gonzales took money from companies with suits pending before his tribunal. Since the first primary Haas has mellowed-out her advertising with Gonzales going on the attack. Neither one has much room to do finger-pointing and both lend credence to the proposition that high court judges need to be appointed rather than elected.

The second Democratic brawl includes Jim Mattox, former Congressman and Attorney General of Texas and newcomer Richard Fisher. These two worthies want to take on GOPer Kay Hutchison in November. This Senate campaign started on a low point with Mattox accusing Fisher of being a closet Republican

and went downhill from there. Fisher, with more money than Andy Gump, has bought up the airways with ads that are a little less than fair including noting Mattox's indictment ten years ago for bribery but not following up with the fact that Big Jim was found not guilty. Fisher also accuses Mattox, the always tough campaigner, of taking money from Republicans and racketeers. Nothing thus far about what either would do if elected to the National Senate. No wonder the odds-makers are giving incumbent Hutchison the nod. The experts have given Kay an easy 58 percent victory over either Fisher or Mattox in November's general election. And who will win the Mattox-Fisher brouhaha? Fisher has the money. Mattox has labor and the liberal wing of the party except for followers of Governor Richards who still smart from the mauling Ann took from Jim back when they ran for Governor. It will be close but from all indications right now and with a week to go,

Fisher will probably squeak past the impoverished battler - Jim Mattox. This may be the last hurrah for Jim - which may be a blessing for conservative Democrats who faithfully cling to the faint hope of a resurgence of power in Texas.

Once the candidates get lined up on each side of the fence and prepare for the general election there should be plenty of fun for political watchers on both sides. The Governor Richards-George Bush fight will be an all-out war over crime and punishment, education, taxes, welfare - you name it!

Chances are pretty good that neither gubernatorial candidate will call on higher ups to come to Texas to campaign. Ann will no doubt, give President Clinton plenty of chances not to come to town to "help".

We are not talking Whitewater here but health care and all the emotion that brings to the front. Also, people paying retroactive federal taxes this month will not soon forget that foul up and so Clinton's help would have to fall into the category "slim to none" when it comes time to count the prospective votes the

## Salado Eagles finish non-district schedule with 10-1 record

The Salado Eagle baseball team completed their non-district schedule with a victory over the Jarrell Cougars. The Eagles jumped out to an early 6-0 lead and then held on for a 7-4 win. The victory gives Salado a 10-1 record.

In the second inning Richard Jackson started things for the Eagles with a single. Three consecutive walks forced in Salado's first run. After an out was recorded Brandon McGregor lined a single to left for two runs. Chris Jackson followed that up with a single of his own for two more runs. Chris stole

second and third base before eventually scoring on a Jarrell error. This gave the Eagles a 6-0 lead.

Jarrell was able to close the gap on the Eagles with two runs in each the third and sixth innings. Jarrell accomplished this without the aid of a hit. Salado pitchers had a little trouble with the strike zone and the Eagles committed a defensive error in each inning.

Salado scored an insurance run in the bottom of the sixth. Brandon McGregor had a two out triple and scored on a Chris Jackson single. This gave the Eagles a 7-4 lead.

It went to Europe to entertain servicemen, and then, on Dec. 15, Major Miller took off in a single-engine plane from England to precede his band to France, never to be seen again. The army declared him officially dead a year later.

The 19-member band continues to play many of the original Miller arrangements that keep exciting fans who have not heard them play for awhile. They are also playing more modern selections in the big-style, carefully selecting

only those newer tunes that lend themselves naturally to the Miller style and sound, carefully selected pieces that will stay around for awhile. The entire repertoire which now exceeds 1,700 compositions keeps the band popular with both young and old.

Most of the band's shows are sell-outs. It has proven staying power, and its popularity has never seemed to wane. Even today the Glenn Miller Orchestra is the most sought after big band in the world just as it was then. Tickets to the dance are \$15 per person. Make your reservations early. ## DRT Museum receives award

The Texas Association of Museums (TAM) announced today the winner of the Fifteenth Annual Mitchell A. Wilder Publication Design Awards competition. This competition was organized by TAM to recognize achievement in graphic design and media production and, in doing so, to encourage quality in public presentations. Named in honor of Mitchell A. Wilder (1913-1979), founding director of the Amon Carter Museum in Fort Worth and an early advocate of excellence in museum publication, the Wilder Design Competition drew entries from museums throughout the state of Texas. The entries came from museums of all disci-

plines, sizes and locations. The submitted materials ranged from posters, brochures, newsletters and invitation to public service announcements and videos.

The Republic of Texas Museum in Austin was honored with a Wilder Award for the Museum's Sam Houston 200th Birthday Shirt, which was designed in conjunction with the DRT celebration of Houston's birthday bicentennial. Executive director Carl McQueary, who designed the award winning entry is one of several that the museum has earned, including the Texas Historical Commission award of excellence, since the museum's reopening almost 2 years ago.

The awards were presented at a luncheon held during the TAM Annual meeting and Trustee's Conference in Houston.

The Texas Association of Museums was established in the early 1960's as a non-profit education service organization. Today, with over 800 members, TAM continually works to improve and expand its services. TAM is dedicated to fostering educational, cultural and recreational opportunities for all Texans by providing a communications network among museums, sponsoring educational programs and encouraging adherence to professional standards and practices.

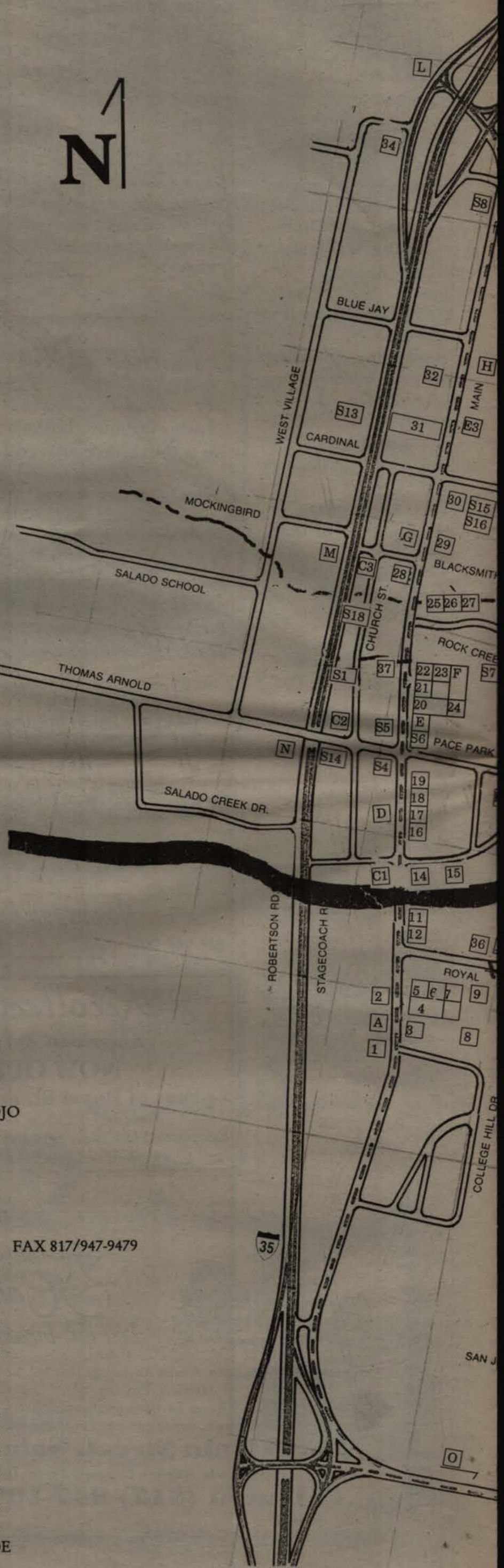

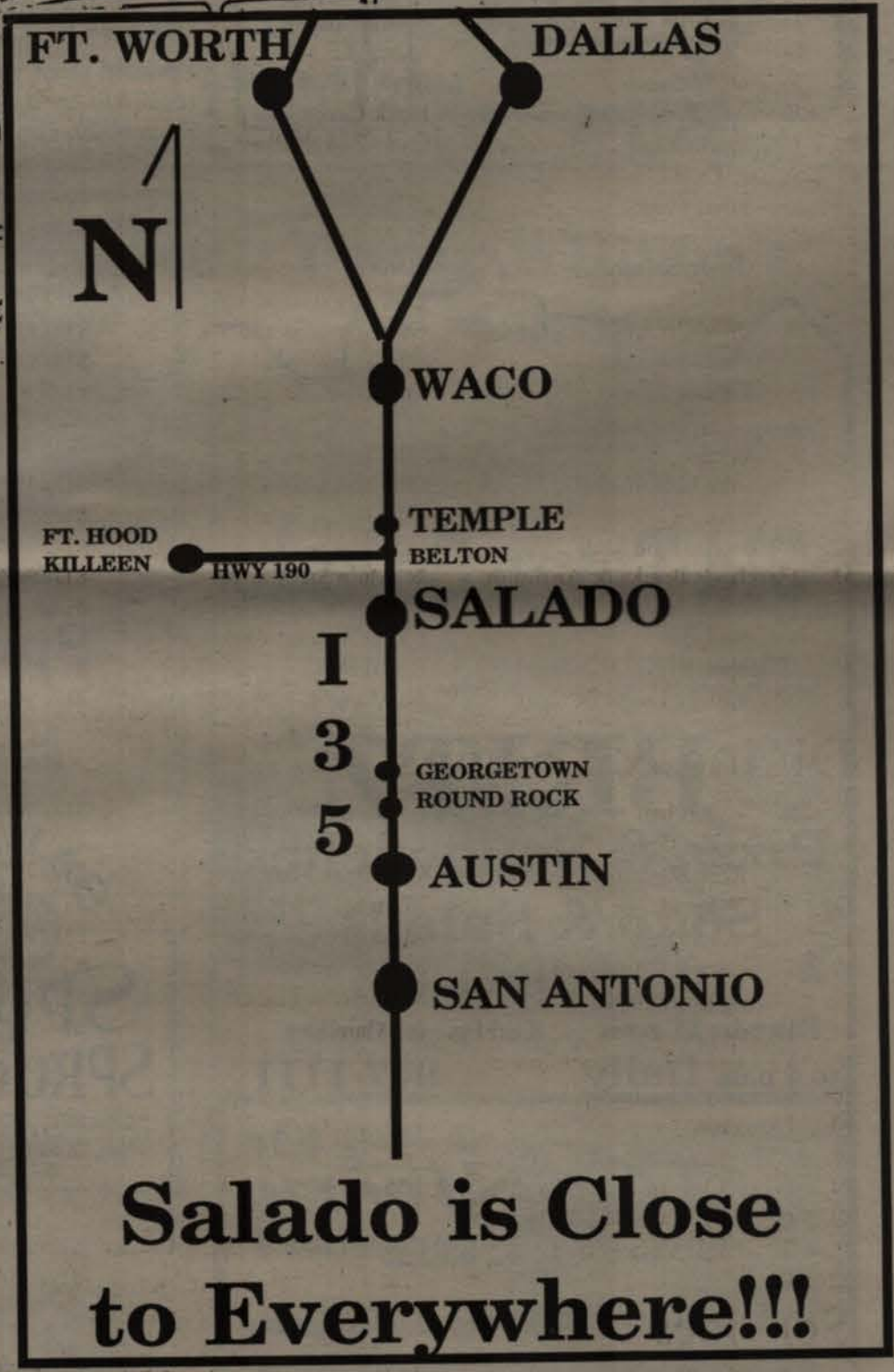

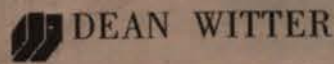

limestone. The wife of the original owner, Martha McWhirter, is famous for having formed a religious sanctuary for women who wanted freedom from sometimes abusive marriages.

The 1893 Baggett-Lastovica Bed & Breakfast at 1019 N. Main St. was built by Ele Baggett and is a mirror image of the house across the street which belonged to his father. The house features gingerbread wood designs which were said to have been removed in the 1930's and burned

by the owners because it was not considered to be in style at the time. The material was replaced with materials from the Ferguson Hall on the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor campus in 1980.

The 1895 Hammer-smith-Clark-Fleischer House at 520 S. Main St. was given to John Hammersmith by his father, Peter, as a wedding gift. It served as a boarding house for soldiers during World War II. It features a

recently rebuilt widow's walk and graceful ornamental columns.

The 1897 Beamer-Jones House at 1201 S. Beal St. was built by William Frank Beamer. He used bricks that were hand-fired at the Belton Brickyard, a business that was owned by Beamer himself.

Tour hours are April 30, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., and May 1, 12 noon to 6 p.m. Admission is \$6 for adults and \$3 for students.
