### Village moves election from May 2 to Nov. 3

Salado aldermen approved an ordinance moving the May 2 election date to Nov. 3 after receiving new information from the Texas Secretary of State, but also instructed Village Administrator Don Ferguson to write a letter to Gov. Greg Abbott requesting that he allow the Village to hold the election concurrently with the July 14 political party primary runoff elections.

The Village is not alone in making the request as the City of Waco also requests that it be allowed to hold its general election along with the July 14 political primary runoffs.

Aldermen acted on the ordinance during an emergency meeting on April 6, after voting 3-2 March 26 to put off until April 16 a decision to postpone the May 2 election to November 3.

Local governmental entities received additional guidance from the Secretary of State's office on April 1. Gov. Abbott extended the closure of schools until May 4 on March 24 and reinforced the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) Guidelines for social distancing to remain in place through April 30.

Following that action, Bell County Judge David Blackburn on April 3 extended his Stay Home directive through April 30.

With the shelter-in-place extended through what would have been the entire early voting period for a May 2 election, aldermen were left with little choice but to move the election to the Nov. 3 date, which is the only date to which Gov. Abbott has allowed local entities to move

their May 2 elections.

"If you haven't already moved your May 2nd election, you must take action to do so immediately!" Keith Ingram, director of the Elections Division of the Texas Secretary of State's Office, in an April 1 email.

"This most recent executive order will prevent you from securing polling places, recruiting election workers, and allowing voters a safe way to exercise their right to vote," Ingram stated. "If you don't move your May 2nd election, you are subjecting voters to health risks and potential criminal violations. Failure to postpone your election will put your election at severe risk for an election contest."

The advisory from the Director of the Elections Division states that there are only two circumstances in which a date over than Nov. 3 could be chosen for the May 2 election. The first (under section 41.0011(b) of the Texas Election Code) allows a political subdivision to request permission from the Governor to allow the political subdivision to order a special election on a non-uniform election date. Salado's May 2 election is a general election.

The second is to seek a court order for an alternative

The Village is requesting that Gov. Abbott allow it to move the May 2 election to be held concurrently with the political party primary runoff elections on July 14. This is highly unlikely to happen as political primaries are a function of the political parties themselves and not of a governing body. The November general election, however, is a function of governing bodies.

The Salado Cemetery Association has canceled the annual Memorial Day Service on May 25 at the Historic Salado Cemetery on Baines Street.

"Due to COVID-19 continuing to spread throughout the country, we do not believe it is safe to plan a community gathering for the Memorial Day service at this time," said Bill Kinnison, president of Salado

Cemetery Association.

All Veterans' grave sites will have flags placed on them for the Memorial Day weekend. The Veterans are from the Texas Revolutionary War, Early Day Rangers, Home Guard, Indian Wars, Mexican War, Confederate and Union Armies, Spanish American War, WWI and II, Korean War, Vietnam War, and peace time service.

We ask that our learners and families commit to the following," Superintendent Michael Novotny stated. "Continue to be engaged in Salado remote learning with their child; Learners participate in distance learning and complete the assignments provided by educators; families stay in communication with SISD staff for specific needs for their child as they participate in remote learning activities."

### **Grading Practices ELEMENTARY**

### Pre-K and Kindergarten

No formal assessments

will be given during remote learning. Observations and feedback will be given on assignments. Participation is essential to the continued growth and development of your child.

### GRADES 1-5

No major assessments will be given during remote learning. One completion grade per week in a specific subject area using the following rotation: Reading, April 6-10; Writing, April 13-17; Math, April 20-24; Science, April 27-May 1. If the school closure extends beyond May 4: Social Studies, May 4-8; Reading, May 11-15; and Math, May 18-22.

Physical Education, Music Art, Work Habits and Conduct 1-5: Grades will continue to be E, S, N, and U based on participation or

prior performance.

### Promotion & Retention

Administrative dures for promotion and retention will be adjusted due to remote learning. Grades from the 4th 9 weeks will not be used to determine promotion status.

### STAAR TEST

All STAAR and End of Course (EOC) assessments have been waived for the 2019-2020 school year. In addition, if a student is not graduating and is currently enrolled in an EOC course, the EOC passing requirement will be waived if the student receives credit for that course.

### In the start of recession, recovery may come in '21


Once again if you are tirelessly following the news reports you could easily have concluded the theme song in the stock market for the week ending on April 3 should have been "Apocalypse Now" but the reality was not that bad. The S&P 500 (SPX) declined a relatively mild 2.08% for the week, ending at 2,488.95. On Tuesday, March 31, the President's news conference included a warning that the death toll in the U.S. would likely reach "100,000 to 240,000" and that announcement was credited with a minor selloff on Wednesday, April 1 that created almost all of the week's losses. That additional loss for the week takes the SPX down almost 23% year-to-date and almost 14% from one year ago. It is certainly not a pretty picture but far better than it could

The yield on the 10-year U.S. Treasury note fell another quarter point to 0.593% at the end of the week but with the 90-day T-bill only at 0.097%, the yield curve was definitely positive even at the record low interest rates we are seeing. A year ago, the curve was clearly inverted, forecasting a recession, and if one believes in the prophetic nature of the Treasury yield curve, it is forecasting we will be back in solid, if perhaps limited, economic growth territory a year or so in the future.

West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) staged an impressive partial comeback as the price per barrel in the front month futures market surged almost 33% to close out the week at \$29 per barrel. The jump in prices was based on a comment from President Trump that the Saudis and the Russians were negotiating a production cut, which the Russians almost immediately denied. The difficulty with the Saudi proposal was that it also demanded that U.S. cut production. With many oil producers facing bankrupt-

### **Market & Economic Update**

The Economy

The headline economic news this week was that about 7.1 million newly unemployed workers filed for unemployment insurance last week. Combined with last week's 3.3 million filings that raises the official figure for layoffs to almost 10 million in two weeks. Then, the Labor Department released the official monthly unemployment figures estimating that employment fell by 701,000 in March, raising the total official unemployed figure to 7.1 million and 4.4%. The two sets of numbers clearly are from different universes.

The problem with the official unemployment figures for March is that they are the result of a survey that ran from March 7 until about March 14 and did not capture the layoffs in the last half of the month. Despite the fact that this official March increase in unemployment from 3.4% to 4.4% was the largest one-month rise in unemployment since the survev started in 1948, it is but a shadow of what we will see next month. Estimates are that as much as 40% of the newly unemployed have not been able to file yet. It is reasonable to expect the total unemployment rate to rise to a level from 10% to 15% or more when we get April's report a month from now.

The big questions are, "How bad will this get?" and "How long will this last?" There is a consensus among seasoned, well-respected analysts that it is going to get a lot worse before it gets any better. We have been reviewing various models based on

the exponential contagion and death rate in Italy combined with the figures from 1918 and they all suggest a median forecast of one to two million deaths in the U.S. based on the about 50% social distancing compliance that is going on. As to how long it will last, the most reasonable models we have reviewed suggest that the contagion will tail off sometime in mid-August for much of the nation, but a second wave will be started as the restrictions on gathering and business activity are relaxed.

Every indication we see suggests that we are already in a recession and that we will see a negative GDP annualized growth figure for the first quarter and a record level of economic contraction in the second quarter. Sadly, we also suspect the third quarter of 2020 will also be one in which the U.S. economy contracts. The only good news is that we continue to see a recovery starting toward the end of 2020 and getting its legs in 2021.

The other thing we are confident of is that there will be a massive change in the way we do business and function as an economy and as a society as we emerge from this crisis. The old demand for high efficiency and lowest cost ways of doing business will be replaced with a powerful impetus toward resiliency. Much of our critical supply sourcing will return to America but as we did not and do not have enough workers to do the work, automated systems will dominate the new economy that will emerge. We believe that automation trend will fuel a decade of expansion greater than any we have seen before. Between here and there are some rough times, but the future on the other side of this storm is bright.

## SISD adopts grading guidelines for remote learning due to closure

As our community and our nation continue to grapple with sheltering in place and remote learning, the staff of Salado ISD have begun to make adjustments to our grading practices for the 4th nine weeks. Our goal is to continue to provide opportunities for our students to learn and grow while acknowledging that remote learning has many challenges for all of us. It is our belief that learning activities should be designed based on the needs of students AND that our actions should be student-centered.

Therefore, as we address Salado ISD grading practices for the 4th 9 weeks for 2019-2020, these are some of the considerations that have influenced our District


- Equity of instruction & access (face to face vs. remote learning)
- Length of time for school closure
- Flexibility during remote instruction
- Unique and highly varied at-home learning setting
- Impact on learner GPA Class Rank/GPA Cumulative Score

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which has resulted in school closures through at least May 4, 2020, the following Salado Independent School District grading practices have been developed for use during remote learning. All other components of the existing 2019-2020 SISD grading practices remain in place.

- 1. Student work will be monitored by the teacher for both paper-based activities and computer-based learn-
- 2. The same criteria will be used in grading assignments whether the student submitted digitally or in hard copy.
- 3. Students will not be penalized for the inability to access resources to complete the assignments.
- 4. Students who received a failing grade during the 3rd 9 weeks will be given an opportunity to make up their work or complete remote enrichment learning assignments as designated by their teacher to improve their 3rd 9 weeks grade to a passing
- 5. Grades from the 1st nd 2nd 9 weeks (for Fall 2019 semester) and 3rd 9 weeks (for Spring 2020 semester) will be used to calculate semester grades, GPA, class rank and promotion status.
- 6. Grades from the 4th 9 weeks will not be used to calculate semester grades, GPA, class rank and promotion status.
- 7. Students will not be re-

quired to make up any days missed because of school closures caused by the coronavirus. TEA will allow any school district that supports students instructionally while at home to submit a waiver for the school days missed due to COVID-19 related concerns.

Dual credit grades are determined by Temple College. Temple College courses are continuing as per Temple College's schedule and dual credit students remain responsible for all work assigned in those classes. Per Temple College policy, dual credit grades will not be determined until the end of the semester. Once those grades are received by Salado ISD they will be recorded in the same manner as Salado ISD courses.

Know the testing pro-

COVID-19 testing isn't available for everyone. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), your medical provider is the only one who can determine if you need testing. So be sure to talk to him or her if you're experiencing symptoms. The main symptoms of COVID-19 include:

Fever Cough

Shortness of breath Other risk factors in-

If you've come into con-

tact with someone known to have COVID-19. If you recently traveled

to a CDC-confirmed infected region. "Scammers

know COVID-19 testing kits are in high demand," says Dr. John Kugler, chief of the Clinical Support Division at the Defense Health Agency (DHA). "They're targeting beneficiaries who may be unaware of the testing process and looking to steal their personal information. Your health care provider will usually determine and order the test if you need it, so check with your doctor's office if someone else offers you testing."

What to do if someone

The people involved in the COVID-19 testing kit scam are looking to steal personal information from you. This could be your Social Security, credit card, or bank account numbers. Don't give them the opportunity to do it. If you receive a call about coronavirus testing, submit a fraud report online to the DHA Program Integrity Office. Also report it to your TRICARE regional contractor.

Testing kit calls aren't the only way scammers are taking advantage of the COVID-19 outbreak. too. The Securities and Exchange Commission recent-

Look out for other scams

They're on social media, ly put out a statement on avoiding coronavirus-related investment scams. When using social networks, like Twitter or Facebook, be wary of people you don't know who ask for money. If you use a mobile payment

app, like Cash App or Venmo, don't give out your username or contact information to a person you don't know. If someone you know sends you a social media message about a COVID-19 fundraiser, call them before sending any money. It's better to be safe than sorry.

A helpful reminder

If you're experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, have been in close contact with someone sick from COVID-19, or traveled to an area where COVID-19 is widespread, don't make an appointment or walk into your local military hospital or clinic. Instead, you should remain at home and contact your medical provider. Your medical provider will assess your condition and determine if you need to be tested.

Call 911 and get medical attention immediately if you develop emergency warning

Persistent pain or pressure in the chest

New confusion or inability to arouse

Bluish lips or face







## Salado Cowboy Poetry, Music Gathering moved to July 31-Aug. 2



# **Texas State Parks will be temporarily closed to public**

AUSTIN—At the direction of Gov. Greg Abbott, Texas State Parks will be closed to the public effective at the close of business Tuesday, April 7 in order to maintain the safest environment for visitors, volunteers and staff. The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) will continue to stay current with the latest public health recommendations and will announce when a definite reopening date has been determined.

"Given the myriad of challenges and heightened risks of operating the parks at this time, we believe this is the best course of action right now in order to meet the health and safety expectations the state has set out for the citizens of Texas," said Carter Smith, Executive Director of TPWD. "All state parks will remain temporarily closed until public health and safety conditions improve. During the closure, staff will continue to steward and care for the parks to ensure they can be immediately reopened to visitors at the appropriate time."

Outdoor recreational opportunities such as hunting, fishing, biking, jogging, walking, hiking, wildlife viewing, and the like are

a essential activities for Texas citizens. TPWD will continue to do its part to actively encourage and promote these opportunities in ways that are safe and close to home, said Smith.

Through this trying time, TPWD has worked diligently to facilitate access to the outdoors across the state, including in the state park system, which hosted nearly 740,000 day and overnight visitors throughout the month of March.

Despite the implementation of increasingly restrictive visitor use measures to help minimize the transmission of COVID-19 at parks, TPWD has reached a point where public safety considerations of those in the parks, and in the surrounding communities, must take precedence over continued operations. Difficulty in ensuring compliance with social distancing, problems in maintaining adequate supplies and keeping park facilities sufficiently sanitized are only a few of the challenges encountered by state park staff.

While parks are closed to the public, staff will be working to help maintain the standard upkeep, maintenance, stewardship, and

We are contacting customers in order of arrival date and appreciate your patience.



Had he ducked the queen, West could then have done no better than continue with the ten of clubs, which South would duck again, preserving dummy's king as a trick. After ruffing the ten of clubs and drawing trump, declarer would discard his heart loser on the club king and wind up losing only the ace of trump and

Ducking the queen of clubs is a super sound safety play that preserves the 10 tricks South is looking at. It protects against the possibility of a club ruff — at no cost — and therefore is the right play.
