Commissioners certify Formation of BC ESD #1

Bell County Commissioners on Nov. 16 canvassed and certified the Nov. 3 General Election results and issued an Order based on those results certifying the formation of Bell County Emergency Services District #1 and outlining its boundaries.

Bell County interim Election Administrator Matthew Dutton reported to commissioners that the County has conducted its partial manual recount that is required by the state. The tapes and early voting machines have been matched against the reports from the reporting software and "Everything matched up and looks good.

Dutton reported that 58% of Bell County registered voters cast ballots in the Nov. 3 General Election. There are 217,149 registered voters, of which 128,035 cast ballots. Early voting was exceptionally heavy with 92,142 taking advantage of three weeks of early voting. On election

day, only 23,330 cast ballots Bell County Tax Appraisal in Bell County. "It was very smooth on Election Day," Dutton said.

The proposition for the formation of Bell County Emergency Services District #1 passed overwhelmingly, he reported. A total of 5,708 votes were cast in the proposition, with 4,108 voting for and 1,600 voting against.

Dutton reported that the county uses ES&S Election Services machines and software for the election. "Nothing is on-line" he told commissioners after Commissioner Bill Schumann asked him about election security. "They (hackers) would have to have physical access to the machines."

After certifying the election, commissioners unanimously certified the formation of the Bell County Emergency Services District #1, including its boundaries. The next step for the BCESD#1 will be appointment of a fiveperson board of directors. With the boundaries identified, the BCESD#1 will be able to contract with the

District to calculate taxable property values within the district for the purpose of proposing an operating budget and a property tax rate that cannot exceed \$0.10 per \$100 valuation.

The five-person board of directors will serve staggered terms and will be appointed by the Bell County Commissioners Court.

In other business, commissioners approved an inter local agreement with McLennan County to provide inmate space for \$84 per inmate per day. Bell County Judge David Blackburn reported that the population in Bell County jail recently topped 1,000 inmates.

Commissioners also approved the re-appointments of Commissioner Bill Schumann and Kathryn Long to serve three-year terms on the Bell County Public Health District Board of Directors.

They also approved a final plat to combine two lots in Krueger Estates.

Sales tax jumps 35% for Village

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar delivered sales tax rebates checks last week to taxing entities across the state and the Village of Salado saw a 35% increase in their sales tax check for November.

The Village received a checks for \$57,641.55, an increase of 35.17% over last November's payment of \$42,641.31. For the year, the Village is running 7% ahead of 2019. The Village has received \$518,873.75 through November 2020, compared to \$484,681.09 through November 2019.

ies in the County with a re-

bate check of \$2.6 million, a 19% increase over last year. Temple was up, too, 15% to \$2.3 million over last year's \$2 million payment. Belton was up as well, 14.6% to \$599,948.96, compared to last years \$523,468.17.

The Salado Public Library District received a check for \$45,906.16, an increase of 26% over last year's \$36,336.28. For the year, the Library has received \$426,996.35, which is 15.7% more than payments of \$369,023.44 paid through November 2019.

Bell County received Killeen led the larger cit- a check for \$2.2 million, an increase of 19% over

last year's payment of \$1.9 million. For the year, the County is running ahead by almost 11% having received \$21.3 million compared to \$19.2 million paid through November 2019.

Last week, the Comptroller Hegar sent cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts \$890.5 million in local sales tax allocations for November, 4.8 percent more than in November 2019. These allocations are based on sales made in September by businesses that report tax monthly, and on sales made in July, August and September by quarterly





Thom Wilson is a retired Army veteran. He and his wife live in Temple, TX. He has directed A Christmas Carol for Tablerock several times and using his artistic talents has also designed and crafted many of the sets used in both A Christmas Carol and Salado Legends. Thom, his children and his grandchildren have performed in many of the Tablerock plays for the past 16 years.



Let's say you're declarer at three notrump in today's hand and West leads a spade. You count six quick tricks and can surely score a diamond for a seventh trick. The question is how to get the two additional tricks you need for your contract.

Obviously, the diamond suit is a more promising source of tricks than the heart suit, since the diamonds are longer and stronger, so let's say that after taking the queen of spades you

All will be well if East cooperatively takes the ace. Regardless of what he returns, you can then establish the diamonds, losing a trick to East's jack along the way, and so make your game.

The trouble with this line of play is that East may not take the ace of diamonds when you play the queen from dummy. If that happens, the best you can possibly do is hold yourself to down one.

The way to prevent this is to lead a diamond at trick two and, regardless of what West plays, follow low from dummy instead of playing the queen! In the actual deal, East would win with the nine, but the defense could not then stop you from scoring nine tricks.


You must assume from the outset that the diamonds are divided 3-2. Once this is granted, the contract is virtually assured regardless of where the ace is located, provided the king or queen is not played at the first opportunity.

It is true that this method of play will cost you a trick if it turns out that West has the ace. However, that trick is relatively unimportant because it affects only the question of making three or four notrump, whereas if East has the ace, it affects the much more vital question of making the contract or going down.

Making the contract is always the primary consideration.


