First Cedar Valley Baptist Church dedicates building

Accept the present. Don't fret over the past. Have faith in the future.

This was the message Donnie Jackson shared with the hundreds of congregants and community members gathered April 1 for the dedication of the new First Cedar Valley Baptist Church, less than a year after their building was leveled by an EF-3 tornado that ripped through the western portion of Salado.

Jackson was joined by former ministers of First Cedar Valley Baptist Church, including Jack Husung, and Richard Worden, evangelist Dennis Erwin, State Representative Brad Buckley and Governor Greg Abbott for the celebration that focused on prayer, songs of praise and thankfulness for God's blessing.

What could have been an event that broke a church instead has strengthened it. Last year, the congregation of First Cedar Valley Baptist had Easter services on a bare concrete foundation amid the rubble caused by the tornado with an untouched cross as a visible reminder of what Jackson called God's grace.

Jackson talked about that cross, which continues to grace the church, a Bible from the 19th century and a plate that were left unscathed by the ravaging tor-

"They were at the foot of the cross," he said. "They were untouched by it. We are at the foot of the cross."

Rep. Buckley talked about the days after the tornado, as clean up began for the residents of Cedar Valley and Stillhouse Valley, the two areas that the tornado ripped through on that fateful evening.

"Time after time, when someone would be approached for help, they would always say, 'I'm okay, but this other person needs the help more than I do.' That is who you are you," Rep. Buckley said.

He remarked on how quickly the church was rebuilt. "I am in the process of building a new clinic," he said, "and it has been 18 months. You have rebuilt in less than a year..." he said.

Rep. Buckley introduced Gov. Abbott, who returned to Cedar Valley after his visit here just days after the tornado.


Abbott's comments focused on resiliency of the people and their reliance on their faith in God. He echoed the sentiment of Jackson, Husung, Worden and Buckley. Then he presented the church with a signed proclamation, the text of which is at right.

Jackson called Dennis Johnson up to the front and thanked him for his leadership in overseeing the rebuilding of the church, adding that God placed him in the church before the tornado came. "God knew we would need you," he said.

The Erwins, who have been singing at Cedar Valley since they were children and of whom Jackson

Personal consumer spending continues to increase

The Markets

That old saying on wall street that "Bull markets climb a wall of worry." has rarely seemed so apt as what we have seen recently. For the last several weeks, and particularly since the failure of Silicon Valley Bank, Signature Bank, and Credit Suisse, little could be found in the news suggesting anything but doom and gloom were ahead economically. The news wasn't much better this week, but the S&P 500 Stock Index, arguably one of the best single economic predictors, rose 3.48% to finish out the week and the first quarter of 2023 at 4109.31. That rise puts it ahead 7.03% for the quarter and year to date. The Index is now 14.71% higher than in mid-October of 2022 and a mind-numbing 83.66% ahead of where it was in March of 2020, only three years ago. Again, we must also note that the SPX remains over 14% lower than it was in January of 2022, but that decline is dwarfed by the gains we have seen over the longer term. Our other followed stock market indicator, the CRSP US Mid Cap Value Index, rose an eye-opening 4.52% for the week to 2317.12. It is now down a bit less than 1% this year and about 11% from its record high last year as regional bank stocks continue to weigh on the Index.

The benchmark 10-year Treasury note ended the week yielding 3.48%, only a tenth of a percent higher than last week and the week before. The yield curve remained stubbornly inverted with even the 90-day T-bill offering a 4.85% annualized yield. The price per barrel of West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) rose a quite substantial 9.28% for the week to \$75.62 as a pipeline supplying oil from the autonomous Kurdish region of Iraq through Turkey to the Mediterranean was closed when a tribunal at the International Chamber of Commerce found in favor of Iraq in a lawsuit. We are changing the elementary school and secondary school start and end times for this upcoming (2023-2024) school year. Our elementary school times will be from 7:30 a.m. until 3:15 p.m. Our middle school and high school times will be from 8:15 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. The reason we are doing so is to have sufficient number of bus drivers to continue to provide transportation for all of our families that choose to have their students ride the


bus. We have experienced a significant shortage of bus drivers the past two years. As a result, our band directors, athletic coaches, athletic director, middle school principal, chief operations officer and I have all been driving some of the bus routes these past two years. We are unable to continue having all of these employees covering bus routes on a consistent basis as it can interfere with our ability to fulfill the duties for our full-time positions with our

school district. Adjusting the times will allow us to have separate bus routes for our elementary school students and for our secondary school students. This will reduce the numbers of bus routes going at the same time. As a result, we will not need as many bus drivers.

These split times between elementary schools and secondary schools are common in many other school districts. In fact, some school districts even


The following are some additional benefits from these changes:

- Secondary school 1. students will start school about 25 minutes later. There is significant research that supports the benefits of a later start time for middle school and high school students.
- 2. There will be fewer students on each bus route so the buses will not be as crowded.
- Many of the bus routes will not take as much time to complete so the students will not have to be on the bus as long each day.
- 4. Elementary school students and secondary school students will no


longer be on the same bus routes.

- We will not have as many bus routes going at the same time so we will not need to use as many buses. Thus will allow us to use our better, newer buses that all have air conditioning.
- 6. It will provide more work hours for our bus drivers, which should help with recruitment and retention of drivers.







The bidding: South West North East 1 • * Pass Pass 2 NT Pass 3 NT Opening lead — four of spades.

This deal from a team-of-four match demonstrates how psychology sometimes plays a primary role in determining the outcome.

The contract at both tables was three notrump played by South, and both Wests led a spade. Both declarers won East's ten with the jack, but that's where the similarity ended.

Both declarers realized that they

would need a club trick to make the contract, and also recognized the danger posed by the possibility that East might have the ace of clubs. In that case, East could win the first club lead and return a spade. If West originally had five spades, this would defeat the contract.

At the first table, South crossed to dummy with a diamond at trick two and led a low club toward his hand, hoping to steal his ninth trick if East had the ace and played low. Unfortunately for South, East alertly put up the ace and returned a spade, whereupon West cashed four spade tricks to sink the contract.

The declarer at the second table found a more devious way to try to steal a club trick. After winning the first spade, he cashed the ace of diamonds and then led the club king.


This sequence of plays was designed to create the impression that South had started with the singleton ace of diamonds and was trying to develop an entry to dummy. East was tempted to take his ace, but he had no way of knowing for sure that his partner could run four spade tricks.


So East ducked the king, after which declarer ran like a thief with his nine






