Salado Legends marks 30 years!

It has been 30 years since we had the very first performance of Salado Legends!

Looking back, I am shocked at my confidence and appalled at my unmitigated gall in composing and writing Salado Legends. Taking over Tablerock in 1991 with \$1.34 in the checkbook was pure madness! A year later after a few plays, our bank balance had increased to \$3,000. My friends at the Institute of Outdoor Theater at the University of North Carolina cautioned me to wait until I had a million dollars in the bank before starting a play. But knowing I would be dead by then, I plunged onward. What was I thinking?

Having told everyone in Salado my plans for Tablerock was a mistake. Then I had to follow through. If I had kept my mouth shut, I might have given up. I started researching and writing the play, and I realized what I needed for props, actors and costumes. I deviously planned assaults and skirmishes upon unsuspecting friends. I put on my big-girl high heels and a dab of lipstick and hit the road asking for the loan of lights from the Cultural Activities Center where I served on the board of directors. Next was Baylor, where I knew people in the Theater Department and asked for a loan of costumes and props. They granted our wish, and

even pitched in some ancient speakers. We cherished those old clunkers and thanked Baylor profusely. We returned the favor later by passing the speakers on to Salado High School. The chore of finding a Native American who could perform a theatrical dance was daunting. Then I heard of a Seminole in Oklahoma, who had been in few Smithsonian films. Dave Jackson played the Salado Legends scout, Tonweya, for 12 years! Finding a re-enactment group who already had weapons and uniforms led to Charlie Van Bibber who agreed to bring the Texas Volunteer Militia on board. The planning along with script and song writing plus recording the music in Wayne Gardner's garage sound room took nine months.

At last the show was meshing. Under the direction of Mike Doggett, the actors, teens and small, wild children were transforming the script into an outdoor musical. The local banks sold tickets for us, all of Mill Creek came out in force and we got rave reviews from local newspapers (and Fort Worth newspapers too...

thanks to A.C. Green). Every year the money from the sale of tickets goes to buy lights, sound equipment, scholarships and to improve the facilities of this 501c3 (non-profit) organization. Salado Legends, our once a year event at Tablerock has expanded into several events a year. Originally written for 40 people, Legends has grown to 114 in the cast and crew. Our first scholarship of \$250 has grown to over \$10,000 in up to 14 scholarships a year making a total of over \$200,000 given in scholarships from 1993 to 2023. Our college-bound cast and crew have earned degrees in accounting, education, nursing and more with Salado Legends scholarships. Many return every year as volunteers to help with Tablerock productions, and one family boasts three generations participating in Salado Leg-

Approximately 5,000 people a year have attended events at Tablerock. The economic impact of Salado Legends alone was over \$227,424 in 2017 when it was last figured by Institute of Outdoor Drama guide-

Tablerock's Board of Directors, now under the direction of Thom Wilson, is a board of hard working volunteers. The board is supported by many generous donors. With help from Rolly Correa, we obtained a matching grant from the Texas Parks and Wildlife to build a one-half-mile walking trail. Wayne Phillips, a local stone builder, bid the job and donated the stone tables and benches in the picnic area. Tablerock's original Greek-style amphitheater seating was upgraded with Fort Hood's donation of 422 used stadium seats. Tablerock's original seven acres has increased to 14 acres with volunteer built

barns, storage buildings and fencing. When our savings for indoor bathrooms and a concession building proved insufficient, friends at CenturyLink, the Terry Crawford Family and Jerry Iley donated the remaining funds to build the hospitality room and the upstairs education room. My husband, Denver, designed and oversaw the construction. The \$125,000.00 building was completed and paid for with ticket money from plays and donations (no loans) just in time for Salado Legends' 20th birthday celebration.

Gracious friends and the past 30 years have been good to Tablerock, and Tablerock has been good for Salado. I'm so glad that I didn't keep my plans for an outdoor musical a secret!

Now, what role would you like in the next Tablerock production? Maybe would like to make costumes? Control the spotlights? Sing or dance? We have a place for you and your family to volunteer your tal-

SWSC continues **Stage 3 restrictions**

Salado Water Supply Corporation continues in Stage 3 of its Drought Contingency Policy, which allows outdoor watering one day a week (odd customers on Tuesday and even customers on Wednesday).

The Salado WSC Drought Contingency Plan allows for outdoor watering on those days from the hours of midnight-10 a.m. and 8 p.m.-midnight. Salado WSC Drought Contingency Plan states that outdoor watering between the hours of 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. is considered wasteful watering due to severe evaporation.

"Through these efforts, we have been able to reduce water usage by 25%," SWSC manager Rick Preston stated. "Violation notices are being sent to those members who have not complied to the Drought Contingency Policy and enforcement action will be taken immediately if those members avoid compliance.'

Salado Water Supply receives about 40% of its water from Stillhouse Hollow Lake which is at an all time historical low level. The water intake structure to the treatment plant we receive water from, will be under repair beginning the week of Aug. 19 to drop the intake to a lower level to allow continued operation of the plant until recharge of the lake occurs.

"During the repair time, expected to take 1 week, signs will be posted in the affected areas where all outside water use will not be allowed while these repairs are being made," Preston said. "It will be critical to avoid all outside use of water to be sure enough is available to avoid an outage of water in this area and insure continuous service for your residences."

Texas Sales Tax Holiday is Aug. 1

(AUSTIN) Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar is reminding shoppers they can save money on clothes and school supplies during the state's sales tax holiday on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 11-13.

State law exempts sales tax on qualified items such as clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks — priced below \$100, saving shoppers about \$8 on every \$100 they spend. The dates of the sales tax holiday and list of tax-exempt items are set by the Texas Legisla-

"As Texans prepare for the back-to-school bell, this

is the perfect time to take advantage of the opportunity to save money on everything from blue jeans to ballpoint pens," Hegar said. "As the father of three, I know how these expenses can add up."

The Comptroller's office estimates that shoppers will save \$136 million in state and local sales tax during this sales tax holiday.

Apparel and school supplies that may be purchased tax free are listed on the Comptroller's website at TexasTaxHoliday.org.

During the annual sales tax holiday, qualifying items can be purchased tax free online or by telephone, mail, custom order or any other means (including in-store purchases) when either:

- the item is both delivered to, and paid for by, the customer during the exemption period; or,
- the customer orders and pays for the item, and the

seller accepts the order during the exemption period for immediate shipment, even if delivery is made after the exemption period ends. Texas' sales tax holiday

weekend has been an annual event since 1999.

Forecasters back off on predicting recession

The Markets

As it usually does, the S&P 500 Stock Index (SPX), our choice for an indicator of what is going on day to day in the U.S. Stock Market, dodged and weaved through the week, but wound up at 4582.23, a gain of 1.01%. To bring that gain into perspective, the SPX is now up about 105% from its bear market bottom back in March of 2020, up about 28% from mid-October of last year, and up about 19% so far this year. It remains down 4.4% from its high in January 2022, but is up almost 40% in the last three years, an annualized return of 11.8% per year. The other market index we follow, the CRSP US Mid Cap Value Index, went the other way, dropping 0.58%for the week 2471.07, but is up 5.62% this year and 4.86% lower than its record high set in January of 2022.

The benchmark 10-year U.S. Treasury note yield closed out the week at 3.96%, a rise of around 3% for the week but still within the trading range it has maintained for over a year. The Treasury yield curve was largely unchanged other than a rise in less than one-year maturities to a range around 5.5% following the Fed's announcement of a short-term rate increase to that level as it remained severely inverted. West Texas Intermediate crude oil rose nearly 5% to \$80.65, probably in reaction to the unexpectedly high GDP numbers, as traders began to price in a more robust U.S. economy with fuel demand likely to rise.

The Economy

This was one of those weeks when an avalanche of economic data comes pouring out of government agencies, and just about all of it was good. The biggest chunk of that data and the biggest surprise to many pundits was the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA)

That high GDP number could have been seen as bad news in that high business activity is often associated with rising inflation, but separately, the Labor Department's Bureau of labor Statistics, announced the employment cost index only increased 1% in the second quarter, the slowest advance since 2021. The BLS also announced that the Fed's preferred measure of what real inflation is doing, the personal consumption expenditures price index (PCE) rose only 3% in the last twelve months, also the lowest increase since 2021. The PCE also showed consumer spending, adjusted for inflation, rose in June the most we have seen since the beginning of this year.

The members of the Federal Reserve Board voted unanimously to raise short term interbank interest rates from 5.25% to 5.5% as expected. The good news was that their press release and Chairman Powell's press conference indicated they would wait on more data before deciding whether to raise rates another 0.25%. Then came the data indicating that inflation continues to moderate, but the economy appears to be accelerating. From the perspective of economic theory those two data points appear to be in contradiction. In Europe, for example, their economies are slowing and have entered a recession after the European Central Bank and the Bank of England raised rates, and inflation, while still much higher than here, also slowed. Here in the U.S. where we have been historically described as having "American exceptionalism" we, once more appear to be the exception to the rule.

Meanwhile, signs of slowing growth continue to appear in data coming out of China. A part of that is the shift going on as American companies have largely stopped investing in China and are diligently working at creating sources of materials and production elsewhere. There are plusses and minuses to that trend. As we de-couple from the Chinese economy, China has less to lose from the sanctions that would follow an invasion of Taiwan. More, as the Chinese economy slows, it removes another drawback that would come from war. This bears watching.

During this past (2022-2023) school year we had two students make a verbal threat. Our threat assessment teams promptly and thoroughly addressed these two situations and determined that the threats were not credible and that they did not endanger our students or employees. Unfortunately, false information regarding these two incidents was shared via social media, text, e-mail, and word of mouth, causing concern among our To prevent community. this from happening again, we have consulted with

our attorneys to develop a plan that will allow us to share information regarding threats with parents and employees while still complying with the Family Educational Rights Privacy Act (FERPA). Thus, parents and employees will be notified of threats, even if the threat assessment team determines that the threat is not credible and there is no danger to our students or employees.

Everyone can help us maintain a safe environment by notifying us if you hear or see anything that could possibly be dangerous. These reports can be made by calling the school, contacting a school administrator or police officer, sending an e-mail to sisd. police@saladoisd.org through our anonymous reporting system that is available at the following webhttps://saladoisd-tx. safeschoolsalert.com/

It's not difficult to make four hearts on this deal with all four hands exposed. After West leads the K-A-J of clubs, you ruff, cash the A-K of spades and trump a spade in dummy. You then lead the nine of hearts to the ace, rejecting the finesse and felling West's singleton king. You lose a diamond trick later, but you make four hearts. But if you could not see the opposing

cards, you might very well go down one after losing a heart finesse to the singleton king. However, even without the advantage of a peek, rejecting the finesse is the right play!

There is a very good reason for arriving at this conclusion. First you take West's bidding into account; then you combine it with the additional knowledge gained from the play to the first six tricks.

At trick seven, when you lead the nine of hearts from dummy, you know that West — who must have had at least four diamonds and four clubs for his bids, and who has already shown up with three spades — cannot possibly have more than two hearts. (Actually, he's much more likely to have either one heart or none.)

It follows that you cannot gain by taking a trump finesse. Even if the nine won, with no way to take a second finesse, you'd still have to lose a trump trick later to East's K-x-x or K-x-x. Your only hope, therefore, is that West was dealt the singleton king!

It is true that the chance of West having been dealt specifically the singleton king is very slim, but a remote chance is surely better than no chance at all.










Shopping Map of Salado





"A few years later, her husband's career in education led our family to Leander ISD where she reentered the education world teaching fifth grade," Mullins said.

"In 2020 Mrs. Larremore's family landed in the best little village, Salado, Texas! She spent a year with Jarrell ISD teaching third grade to in-person and virtual students simultaneously during the pandemic," she said.







Early Childhood Screening Child Find





Fire danger continues as hot, dry conditions persist

Texas A&M Forest Service warns of increased wildfire danger, as high temperatures and dry conditions continue to impact the state.

"Since mid-July, wildfire activity has increased substantially across Texas due

to expanding drought conditions," said Wes Moorehead, Texas A&M Forest Service Fire Chief. "Over the past two weeks, state and local firefighters have responded to 280 wildfires that burned almost 10,000 acres."

Elevated fire weather, characterized by triple-digit temperatures, low humidity and increased wind speeds, will create an environment with high potential for wild-fires that are difficult to control this week.

Regions with increased risk also include areas east of I-45 and south of I-20, including communities near Jacksonville, Center, Lufkin, Crockett, Hunts-
