Salado Village Voice: always independent, family-owned and hyperlocal since 1979

While the *Salado Village Voice* is not the first newspaper in Salado, it has had the longest life-span since being founded in 1979. The Fleischer family bought the newspaper in 1988, marking 35 years in Salado in Spring 2023.

The first newspaper known to be published in the village was the *Salado Newsletter*. Published by E.W. Billings, the first edition came out on August 25, 1874. Only one copy of the newspaper exists at the newspaper collection of the University of Texas at Austin.

The Grange published another newspaper, *The Texas Farmer* in Salado, but it was later moved to Dallas.

Reference to a third Salado newspaper has been found on a letterhead in the Rose Papers at the University of Texas at Austin. The *Salado Sentinel* was published by A.S. Hornbeck. No copies of the *Salado Sentinel* are known to exist today.

Salado Village Voice founder Dayton Kelley was a native of Bell County, a journalist and a historian. He taught journalism at the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor for 12 years before accepting a position as Director of the Texas Collection at Baylor University in Waco. After Dayton passed away, his sons Dennis and Bill ran the Salado Village Voice, selling it to the Fleischer family in 1988.

Since the Fleischer family purchased the newspaper, a week has not passed that the newspaper has not published. *Salado Village Voice* has published the quarterly magazine Salado: A Jewel in the Crown of Texas for more than 30 years.

Salado Village Voice was named the first Business of the Year by the Salado Chamber of Commerce in 2002. Marilyn Fleischer was named to the Hall of Fame by the Chamber for 2019.





Popcorn, nachos, hot dogs, hot chocolate and funnel cakes will be ready for the concession stand to open at 6 p.m.
















Mermaids take over Salado

On the first weekend of October every year, mermaids take over Salado. Sirena's Creekside Carnaval, hosted by Legacy Salado Inc., a local 501c3 nonprofit, honors the beloved tale of Sirena by bringing together the community and beyond on Saturday, October 7 at Pace Park for a promenade that celebrates the crowning of the Creekside Carnaval Princess and Catfish King, along with a host of fun, free activities for families. This year, attendees can expect live music, live mermaids, vendors, food trucks, a zoo show, petting zoo, storytime, performances by Native American dancers, and so much more. The promenade starts at 9:30 a.m., and the festival will be 10 a.m.–6 p.m.

The Tonkawa Legend of Sirena is a story near and dear to Saladoans young and old alike. The legend, featuring a young Native American woman named Sirena being tricked into becoming a mermaid by a magical catfish, was brought to life by local artist and sculptor Troy Kelley, who created a bronze sculpture that honors the tale his Native American grandmother told him as a young child.

Each year, Legacy Salado Inc. selects a project that improves and enhances the Village of Salado's public spaces or community members.

Last year alone, Legacy Salado Inc. donated \$48,705 towards Salado's all-abilities playground.

Since the Village of Salado considers the playground project fully funded and construction is slated to begin soon, Legacy Salado has found a new project this year. Driven by a passion to make a difference, the 2023 project will be constructing Little Food Pantries in the Village. Salado ISD Superintendent Dr. Michael Novotny has agreed to the first Little Food Pantry being placed at the Salado Civic Center site, with more locations planned around Salado soon. A non-perishable food drive will also be held at Sirena's Creekside



Salado Highland Games, Gathering of Clans marks 62nd anniversary

Sixty-two years ago, on November 12, 1961, people from around the country who shared Scottish ancestry came together in Salado for the First Gathering of All Scottish Clans. Tartan banners waved bearing the name of each clan and more than a thousand people attended. Every November since, the Scots have gathered in Salado to celebrate their heritage making this the oldest Scottish festival in Texas.

This year, the 62nd Scottish Gathering and Highland Games will be held November 10-12 on the grounds at Thomas Arnold Elementary School on Thomas Arnold Road in Salado. Proceeds benefit Salado Museum and College Park, the 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that has hosted the event since its inception.

This is the place to experience all things Scottish -- the skirl of bagpipes, wearing of the tartan, tossing the caber, Highland dancers, Celtic music, men in kilts, Scots shops, good eats and more.

One of the event's main features is the Clan Village, the largest gathering of Scottish Clans in Texas where members of up to 40 Scottish clans and societies will share information with visitors about Scottish history and genealogy.

The weekend begins on Friday evening when a torchlight ceremony is held on the banks of Salado Creek. 
