UIL Realignment sends Salado south for 2024-26

Salado Eagles will play football in a completely new district 13-4A, Div. 2, as UIL announced its biennial reclassification and realignments last week.

The Eagles will play in District 13-4A, where they will face Geronimo Navarro, Gonzales, Jarrell, Lago Vista, Smithville and Wimberley.

Jarrell is the largest school in the district, with an enrollment of 951 and the closest at just 10 miles away.

Geronimo Navarro is the farthest away at 108 miles. Gonzales is 100 miles away, Wimberley is 74 miles, Smithville, 70 miles and Lago Vista, 44 miles.

Wimberley is the second largest school in the district with 855 enrollment. Gonzales has 760 students; Salado, 721; Geronimo Navarro, 694.5; Lago Vista, 672.5 and Smithville, 555.

The Eagles will play four non-district games in 2024, facing Troy Aug. 30 in a home game, Lampasas at home Sept. 6, Giddings on the road Sept. 13 and Academy on the road Sept. 20.

The Eagles start District 13-4A play at Lago Vista Sept. 27. The Vikings were 7-5 last year after going 10-4 the previous two years.

The Eagles will host Navarro on Oct. 4. The Panthers were 9-4 last year, losing to Sinton. The two years prior, the Panthers were 8-5 and 10-3.

The Eagles travel to Wimberley Oct. 11. The The Texans went 15-1 in 2022, losing to Carthage in the state championship game. They were 10-3 in 2021.

After a bye week, Salado hosts the Jarrell Cougars on Oct. 25. The Cougars were 3-8 and 2-3 in District 13-4A last year. The Cougars were 6-7 and 2-3 in 2022 and 3-8 and 0-5 in 2021.

Salado travels to Gonzales Nov. 1. The Apaches were 6-4 and 4-1 in District 12-4A last year. They were 4-6 and 2-3 in 2022 and 2-8 and 0-5 in 2021.

The Eagles finish district play at home Nov. 8 against the Smithville Tigers. The Tigers were 3-8 and 2-3 in District 12-4A last year. They were 5-7 and 3-2 in 2022 and 7-4 and 3-2 in 2021.

Most of the teams Salado faced the past two years will compete in District 12-4A: Gatesville, Robinson and Connally. China Spring and La Vega both move down from Division 1, while Lorena moves up from 3A, Div. 1, in which they won the state championship in 2021. China Spring won back-to-back championships in 2021 and 2022. Madisonville moves to District 11-4A, Div. 2.

UIL also released the alignments for volleyball and basketball.

Salado Lady Eagles will compete in District 24-4A in both volleyball and basketball. They will face Burnet, Georgetown Gateway (boys only in basketball), Jarrell,



Opening lead — six of spades.

Point count is usually a helpful guide to the number of tricks you can take, but it is not a perfect yardstick. Freak distribution can seriously affect the accuracy of high-card point count, particularly in the case of suit contracts.

Consider this deal where South got to five clubs doubled. West had 17 points and probably thought he'd tear that contract to pieces, especially with East having bid twice. But things didn't quite turn out the way he had expected. West led a spade. Declarer won with the ace, played the king and another heart, finessing the jack, and discarded his singleton diamond on the ace of hearts.

These four plays established a perfect crossruff position, and South proceeded to take full advantage. He ruffed a diamond, a spade, a diamond, a spade and then a third diamond and a third spade.

Ten tricks had now been played, and declarer had taken them all. West was down to the A-K-10 of trump, and South the Q-J-9. When declarer next led a club to his queen, West could score only two trump tricks, so South wound up making five clubs doubled despite East-West's 24 high-card points!

Observe that the outcome would have been altogether different had West elected to start off with the A-K-10 of clubs. In that event, South would have gone down two.

It should be said parenthetically that there are very good reasons for West to begin by leading three rounds of trump. North-South were obviously bidding on distribution rather than high cards, so West should have taken steps to short-circuit any impending crossruff. Although this was likely to cost West a trump trick, it was highly probable that the trick would come back with interest.
