

BoA reviews municipal building plans

Village aldermen at their March 21 meeting reviewed plans for the new municipal building and police department to be built at the corner of FM 2484 and Event Dr.

Julie Evans, Design Tech II and Randy Stumberg, AIA, RAS, LEED AP, Senior Architect with MRB Group reviewed changes made by MRB Group in the original design of the building.

The original schematics and design were from another design firm. "It became very clear in the beginning that there were issues with the design, in particular the site location," Evans said.

The original site plan located the building "toward the north with an entrance to the southwest," she said. In order to not take out a three-foot diameter tree,

the building was shifted to the west and south and the entrance was moved. "This did cover up a small parking area that branched off of the main parking," she said, but added that the move still meets code requirements. "You are required to have 44 parking spaces between the city and county annex," she said. "There are 130 spaces there.

Approval of the design came from the Bell County Commissioners Court earlier in the week.

The building is a 6,200 sq. ft. pre-fab metal building.

Some improvements over the current municipal building and police department include expanding the evidence storage by more than three times. "The police defund the construction costs by selling "the property we are on here. We will get a loan for the remainder. Funding is critical."

He added: "I do want to figure out how to put our police cars in a secured, fenced area with a cover for the vehicles."

The board also approved resolution authorizing а execution of an Advanced Funding Agreement with the Texas Department of Transportation for the following Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside projects.

 Construction a six-footwide sidewalk along Mill Creek Dr. from Chisholm Trail to the existing sidewalk at N. Main St. at a total cost of \$1,119,016 with \$1,080,172 funded federally, \$38,844 funded by the state partment also has a separate and \$216,034 funded by the Village of Salado. Construction of Ameri-

(ADA) Accessible sidewalks adjacent to Williams Rd. From FM 2484 to West Village Road. at a total cost of \$745,955,92 with \$559,028.74 federally funded, \$33,192 funded by the state and \$153,735.18 funded by the Village of Salado. Aldermen approved an emergency declaration for the April 8, 2024 solar eclipse.

In other business, aldermen approved an engagement agreement with Bickerstaff Health Delgado Acosta, LLP for legal services.

When Jane married Dr. Harry Wilmer in 1944, her life became a whirlwind accompanying him from Minnesota to their many locations around the world and raising five children while constantly focusing her energies on improving the world around her.

Jane and Harry moved from California to central Texas in 1969, when he left Stanford to take a position as staff psychiatrist at Scott and White. Following a brief stint living in Temple, they moved to Salado after Jane fell in love with the ninehole Mill Creek golf course and Harry fell in love with the creek and charm of 'old'

Salado. She has lived here ever since, loving every aspect of the small community and working to improve it through the many organizations and causes she championed.

Harry predeceased her in 2005, but she carried on with their many local activities. Jane was a consummate volunteer and supporter or many Salado organizations, particularly of arts and culture. She was a charter member of the Salado Chorus, the Public Arts League (PALS), Music in Salado, the Salado Library and the Living Room Theatre of which she is the "Vice President for Life." She also contributed her tireless energy to the Ladies Auxiliary, and her book, bridge, and garden

clubs. The cookbook, Salado Cooks and Their Kitchens was dedicated to Jane.

The Institute for the Humanities at Salado, which she co-founded with Harry in 1980, was a primary focus. She was a major force behind that group, serving on the board helping host and bring hundreds of outstanding speakers to Salado from all around the country.

Jane and Harry split their time between Salado and San Antonio for a few years while he was on the faculty of the UT San Antonio Medical School. Soon, Jane took up volunteering there, as well. She was a docent at the Institute of Texas Cultures in San Antonio and very involved with the Symphony and Opera Guilds.

In 1972 she was appointed to the Texas Committee for the Arts, a group which researched, lobbied for and secured more state funding and support for the arts.

But anyone who knows Jane, knows that golf has been her biggest passion. Almost daily for her 52 years here, Jane has been on the golf course at Mill Creek. Or on her bike or at the gym or swimming laps as she maintained her life-long commitment to good health.

Jane was born and raised in St Paul, Minnesota where her eclectic education began at the University of Minnesota High School. She continued her education far from home with her freshman year at the University of Arizona, her sophomore year

Calvary-Jesus Christ, 33, of Nazareth, died Friday on Mount Calvary, also known as Golgotha, the place of the skull. Betrayed by the Apostle Judas, Jesus was crucified by the Romans, by order of the ruler Pontius Pilate. The causes of death were crucifixion, extreme exhaustion, severe torture, and loss of blood.

Jesus Christ, a descendant of Abraham, was a member of the House of David. He was the son of the late Joseph, a carpenter of Nazareth and Mary, His devoted Mother. Jesus was born in a stable in the city of Bethlehem, Judea. He is survived by His mother, Mary, His faithful Apostles, numerous disciples, and many other followers.

Jesus was most noted for telling parables about His Father's Kingdom and performing miracles, such as feeding over 5,000 people with only five loaves of bread and two fish and healing a man who was born blind. On the day before His death, He held a Last Supper celebrating the Passover Feast, at which He foretold His death.

The body was quickly buried in a stone grave, which was donated by Joseph of Arimathea, a loyal friend of the family. By order of Pontius Pilate, a boulder was rolled in front of the tomb. Roman soldiers were put on guard.

In lieu of flowers, the family has requested that everyone try to live as Jesus did.



Church to Hold Stations of the Cross Walk

New Life Methodist Church of Salado on Good Friday, March 29, will hold a "Stations of the Cross" walk in Salado, beginning at 6:30 pm at the Salado Museum, located at 423 South Main Street in Salado.

Pastor Tom Lathen said. "While the Stations of the Cross is often associated with the Catholic faith. many Protestant churches hold to the traditional service as well. In the 4th Century Christian believers began the pilgrimage to Jerusalem to retrace the steps of Jesus. Later, St. Francis of Assisi is credited with authoring the service that many Christians pray today.'

According to Pastor Lathen, "Though the Stations of the Cross can be used at any time, it is most often associated with the Fridays of Lent, particularly Good Friday. The Bible tells us Jesus was crucified on a Friday and three days later rose again. (Mark 15:33-42)"

Lay Leader John Perry said, "We invite everyone to join us for this special Good Friday observance. Ten of the stations will be located inside our temporary home at the Salado Museum. Then, the final four stations will be observed in a short walk outside the area around the Museum along Main and Royal streets."

Pastor Lathen explained, "This is a somber service that recalls the suffering of Christ and the painful death he endured. We believe the jov of Eastern morning is revealed to us when we also understand the enormity of the sacrifice that Jesus made."

"Those who are uncomfortable walking the final four stations will also be read inside the church. Those who are unable to walk but might still want to participate in the procession are invited to join us by wheelchair or other conveyance, although we do not have a a.m..

church wheelchair so individuals will need to bring their own. All area residents are invited to participate in this very special experience."



Total solar eclipse is coming to Salado April 8

In Salado on Monday, April 8, 2024, at about 12:19 p.m. (CDT), the sun will begin to disappear. At 1:36 p.m. night will fall over the village, the stars will come out, and a profound sense of awe will be felt by all those

experience this rare event. For three minutes and forty-six seconds the moon will almost exactly block the sun from the perspective of any observer in a 120-mile-wide path along a centerline that enters Texas at Piedras Negras at

who are fortunate enough to 1:27 p.m., and leaves Texas as it crosses the Red River northwest of Clarksville at 1:49 p.m. As the sun's final edge disappears and again as it begins to emerge from behind the moon there is a chance to see the "diamond ring" effect as the last or first sunlight is channeled between mountains on the moon.

> If this is your first total solar eclipse, experienced eclipse chasers recommend that you not attempt to capture it with a picture or a video. Rather, look around you as well as at the eclipse. It is a moving experience easily missed if you are focused on your phone or camera.

> The April 8 eclipse will be the last in the U.S. for this century, so you don't want to miss it, but DO

> On April 8, a total eclipse will shade 31 Texas state parks along the path of totality. With the exception of Old Tunnel and Lyndon B. Johnson State Parks, where visitors will gain entry on a firstcome, first-served basis, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) encourages visitors planning to view the event from state parks to reserve a day pass in advance. Many of the parks in the line of totality are already fully reserved and Texas State Parks staff anticipate all will reach capacity. Make reservations at https://tpwd.texas.gov/ state-parks/reservations/


NOT look at the sun during solar glasses or certified

the partial eclipse phase un- solar filters on a camera or less you are using certified telescope. Old film, regu-

lar camera filters, or other non-certified filters will not block out the invisible ultraviolet light that can be the most damaging. If you don't have certified glasses, poke a small hole through a piece of cardboard or aluminum foil and project the sun through it onto a flat surface. Enjoy the experience, but don't permanently damage your eyes while doing so.

Pace Park in Salado will offer unobstructed views of the solar eclipse as well as parking. There are many other places throughout the village that have parking and unobstructed view. Do not just pull over on the side of the road, especially I-35.


