County, Village declare disaster Solar Eclipse coming!

In Salado on Monday, April 8, 2024, at about 12:19 p.m. (CDT), the sun will begin to disappear. At 1:36 p.m. night will fall over the village, the stars will come out, and a profound sense of awe will be felt by all those who are fortunate enough to experience this rare event. For three minutes and forty-six seconds the moon will almost exactly block the sun from the perspective of any observer in a 120-mile-wide path along a centerline that enters Texas at Piedras Negras at 1:27 p.m., and leaves Texas as it crosses the Red River northwest of Clarksville at 1:49 p.m. As the sun's final edge disappears and again as it begins to emerge from behind the moon there is a chance to see the "diamond ring" effect as the last or first sunlight is channeled between mountains on the moon.

If this is your first total solar eclipse, experienced eclipse chasers recommend that you not attempt to capture it with a picture or a video. Rather, look around you as well as at the eclipse. It is a moving experience easily missed if you are focused on your phone or camera.

The April 8 eclipse will be the last in the U.S. for this century, so you don't want to miss it, but DO NOT look at the sun during the partial eclipse phase unless you are using certified solar glasses or certified solar filters on a camera or telescope. Old film, regular camera filters, or other non-certified filters

will not block out the invisible ultraviolet light that can be the most damaging. If you don't have certified glasses, poke a small hole through a piece of cardboard or aluminum foil and project the sun through it onto a flat surface. Enjoy the experience, but don't permanently damage your eyes while doing so.

The Village will station sanitation facilities on Main St. and Royal St. during the event.

Bell County Judge David Blackburn declared a State of Emergency in relation to the upcoming Solar Eclipse.

"Some are projecting our population to double or triple our current population of approximately 400,000," Judge Blackburn stated. "Projections are for this influx of people to begin occurring as early as several days before April 8, with an out-migration occurring in the few hours immediately following the Eclipse."

"If these numbers manifest themselves, the strain this will put on our infrastructure will be significant," he stated. "Everything from our first responders to our health care systems to our fueling stations to our highways to our emergency management systems ... all of these, and more, could be severely strained by this influx of people."

Following suit, Village of Salado aldermen voted at their March 21 meeting to declare a local state of emergency as well.

Bell County offices will be closed April 8. Salado ISD schools and offices will be closed April 8.



History on the move

The 1908 Old Church Place was moved from its home on North Main St. April 2 to its new home on the grounds of the Salado Civic Center. The move required the closing of Main Street while the one-story frame sanctuary was towed across the road. The Salado Historical Society will restore the building at its new home on the grounds of the Salado Civic Center. The 1908 building is a duplicate of an earlier Salado Church of Christ sanctuary that burned. CUWCD sets hearings April 10

Clearwater Underground Water Conservation District will conduct two permit hearings 1:30 p.m. April 10 at the CUWCD board room, 640 Kennedy Court in Belton.

The board will conduct a permit hearing for an amendment to an existing operating permit for an existing well (# N2-21-001P) owned by Victory Rock Texas, LLC. The existing well is completed in the Hosston Layer of the Trinity Aquifer known as the Lower Trinity Aquifer and geographically in the CUWCD Stillhouse Hollow Management Zone.

Well #N2-21-001P is equipped with a 1 1/4 -inch column pipe with a submersible pump rated at 16 gallons per minute on the 283-acre tract located at the 7170 So-

lana Ranch Rd.

The current operating permit is to produce groundwater for a defined beneficial use for a dual purpose specifically for dust suppression and mining/crushing aggregates on contiguous tracts of land known as PID: 41910 and PID: 41912 of approximately 283-acres.

Victory Rock Texas LLC is proposing an amendment to the permit to add an additional tract of land PID: 41920 totaling 110.73-acres to their contiguous property leased from Byron Goode.

The proposed additional beneficial use is to include a Concrete Batch Plant Facility known as Five Star, Concrete, LLC.

The current operating permit does authorize production of groundwater not to exceed 30-ac-ft (9,775,000

gallons) per year from a well (N2-21-001P) completed in the Hosston Layer of Trinity aquifer. This application does not contemplate any additional groundwater production beyond the current operating amount of 30-ac-ft/year.

CUWCD Directors will conduct a hearing for a drilling permit for Well #N3-24-002P owned by Seven Custom Homes.

The proposed Drilling permit is for one public water supply well to serve a future new RV Resort on a 33-acre tract.

The new well will be completed in the Hosston Layer of the Trinity Aquifer known as the Lower Trinity Aquifer and geographically in the CUWCD Eastern Management Zone.

This application is for a

Drilling Permit only and no production is to be authorized.

The proposed well is for proposed future production of groundwater for a future public water supply entity at an annual quantity not to exceed 16.8 acre-feet or 5,474,297 total gallons per year at a maximum pumping rate not to exceed 50 gallons per minute per well from the Lower Trinity Aquifer (Hosston Layer)

No production will be issued with this drilling permit application other than that necessary for drilling and completing the well and the prescribed elements of the required Well Completion Report per District Rule 6.9.2(f)(1-8) for a future operating permit.

Each candidate will have

Candidates will rotate during the process.

At the end of the question/answer period, in reverse order to the introductions by Nancy Best, each candidate will be given two minutes for closing remarks.

Barrow Brewing Co. celebrates 8th anniversary April 6

Barrow Brewing Company will celebrate eight years of brewing and serving craft beer on April 6.

The Brewery opened in 2016 after changing the law in Salado in November 2014 and spending a year renovating a pole barn in the historic district.

Graydon and KD Hill are the co-owners and over the years have expanded the brewery operations to include distribution from Waco to Georgetown, a wood fired pizza truck, as well as a beer garden with a silo bar, and room for guest trucks like Longbow Coffee

and Eli's Doubleburgers.

Barrow Brewing was the first microbrewery to open in the tri-county area, paving the way for other breweries to open. They celebrated with those breweries April 1 by hosting the Heart of Texas Craft Brewers Guild meeting. The guild meets

monthly at member-breweries and fosters collaboration and community among the group.

The April 6 celebration includes the kickoff of the seasonal Salado Farmers Market. Barrow has hosted farmers markets for the last seven years. Some of the

vendors that attend have gone on to open their own brick and mortar locations in Salado and Bell County. The farmers market is 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. every Saturday through September.

Live music will start at 11 a.m. from Wayworn Traveler. This local duo has played

Barrow's anniversary every year. Sam Goldwinners will go on at 2 p.m. Brooks Emerson at 4 p.m. and Wes Perryman (another 8-year running musician) will play at 7 p.m. The brewery will offer special beers and commemorative merchandise to mark the occasion.

SOAP performances set

Salado High School Theatre is going to the Chicago National Democratic Convention—in 1968 as they travel back in time to perform their adaptation of Aaron Sorkin's The Trial of the Chicago 7 for the UIL One-Act Play contest. The trial, which was infamously known for challenging free speech, followed the Chicago anti-war protests during the summer of the convention.

The journey to perform the adapted play started when director J.J. Jonas watched the film version on Netflix.

"I was 11 years old when this happened in America, but I still remember the controversy it caused. The nation was polarized—you were either for the Chicago 7 or against them," Jonas said. "I realized that we still were that same polarized nation, and it really hit home for me."

Jonas initiated the quest to reach Aaron Sorkin, one of today's most famous and successful playwrights/directors in the early fall of 2023.

"It was a tough task and

took us through a twisted route, but finally, we got in," Jonas said.

When the director finally received approval from Sorkin to adapt his screenplay to a 40-minute stage play, she whooped and hollered to her class with the news.

"I couldn't believe it! Aaron Sorkin himself read

our letters and said he would be proud for us to adapt his work to the stage," junior Harper Schreiner-Brown said.

The word went out on the team's GroupMe app, and soon, theatre students were pouring in the classroom to celebrate.

Sounds over Salado Solar Sessions at Barrow Brewing

Barrow Brewing Company (108 Royal St., Salado) will experience the total solar eclipse on April 8. Totality will happen here at 1:36 p.m. and will last for 3 minutes and 46.1 seconds.

The brewery is planning to party all day with the folks from Dark Green Light Productions, presenting Sounds Over Salado Solar Sessions. Sounds Over Salado is a music series produced by Dark Green Light Productions that began in 2021.

Founder Stephen Clarke brings incredible bands to the brewery grounds for intimate, fun, concerts. There will be bands playing live

music, special food options, and commemorative merchandise. Bands playing the event are Salado's own Brooks Emerson Band, Sundae Drivers, and Joshua Kane. Through a grant from the Salado Cultural Arts District and sponsorship by Havard Roofing and Construction, the brewery was able to hire aerialist dancers who will perform during the eclipse and concerts. Barrow Brewing is taking reservations for tables and individuals through www.centraltexasickets.com. Each attendee will receive solar viewing glasses.

Attendance will be limited to 500 people.

Prose and Spirits features works of Jane Austen

You are invited to an afternoon of Prose and Spirits, celebrating English author Jane Austen.

Austen was a beloved author noted for her quiet subtlety. The four novels published during her lifetime — Sense and Sensibility (1811), Pride and Prejudice (1813), Mansfield Park (1814), and Emma (1816) — were published anonymously. During the Regency period, gentried women were to marry well, not work professionally.

After her death in 1817, her brother Henry Austen published Northanger Abbey and Persuasion together and noted that Jane was the author of the four previous novels about the gentried society.

Attendees to the Prose and Spirits event will hear Austen's quiet prose that held within the words un-

dercurrents of much deeper meanings and longings.

Guests at the event will step back in time to experience the charm of a Jane Austen-era soiree filled with Austen's prose, tea and spirits, Regency-era food, live music performances, and (optional) Regency-inspired costumes.

The limited gathering is a fundraiser for The Friends of the Salado Public Library, where you can find Austen's writings.

The event will be held 4-6 p.m. Sunday, May 5 at The Chapel at Caliber Oak, 5235 Royal St. Rick and Dennis Thomsen hosted a similar evening last year to benefit The Friends of the Salado Public Library based upon the writings of Edgar Allan Poe

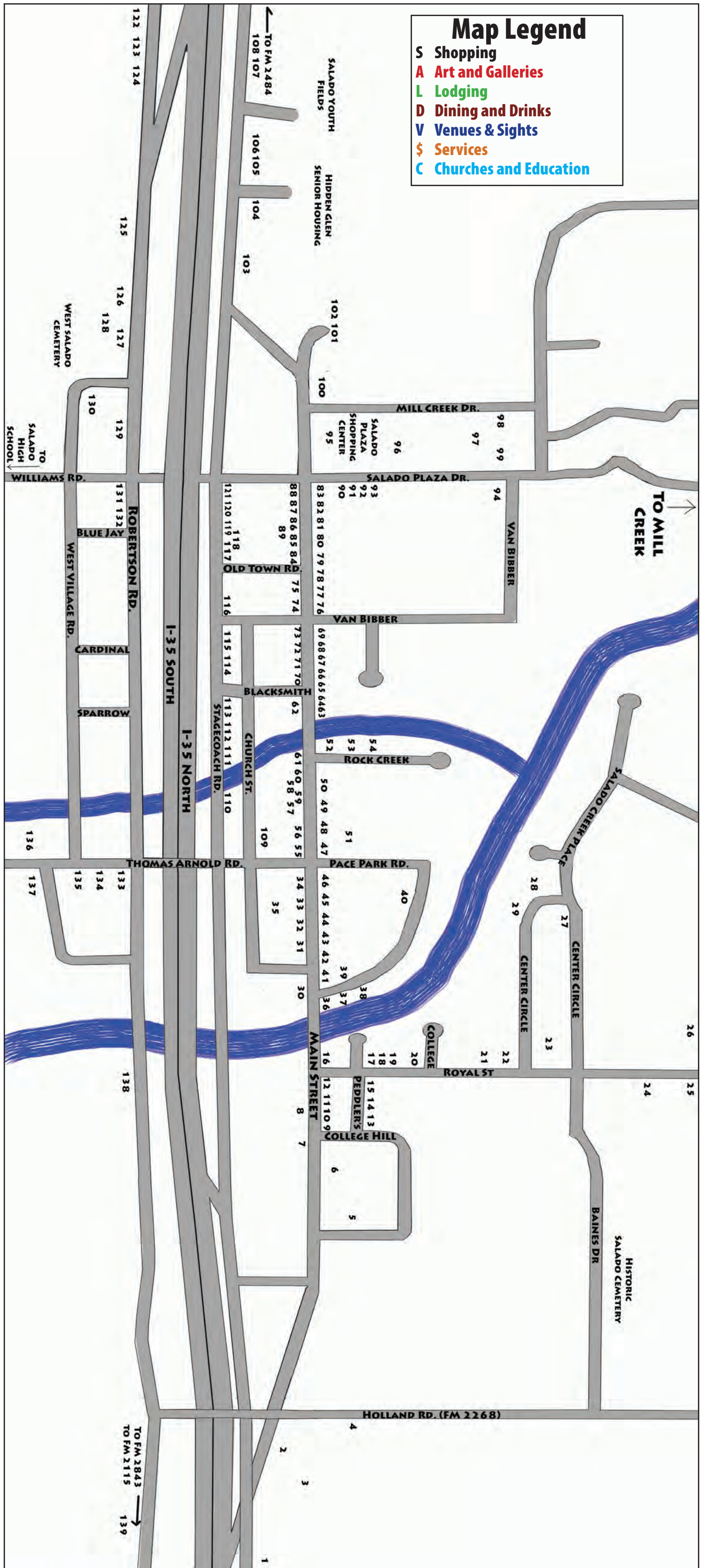

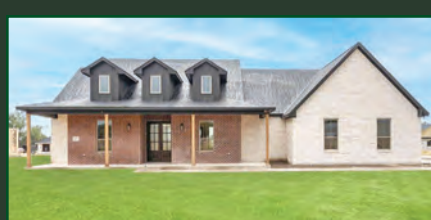

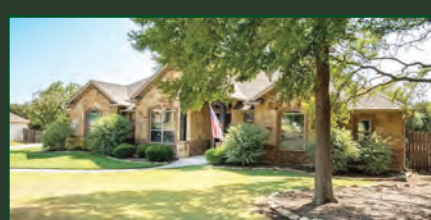
