Trump leads Red Wave

Donald Trump has won the Presidency for the second time, leading a 2024 Red Wave that could see the Republican Party picking up five seats in the U.S. Senate and retaining control of the U.S. House.

With some races still not called as of press-time, Republicans may oust Democrat Bob Casey in Pennsylvania, a state that Pres. Trump flipped from blue.

Two other states that flipped from blue to red at the top of the ticket look as if they will elect Democratic Senators: Michigan and Wisconsin.

Kamala Harris conceded the election at 4 p.m. Nov. 6.

She trailed Trump 224 to 277 with Alaska, Arizona, Nevada and Michigan still to declare results. Trump led in each of those states, which could push his Electoral College total to 315.

Trump will win both the Electoral College votes and the popular vote. As of press-time with the above states not tallied, Trump leads in the popular vote 71,801,254 to Harris' 66,907,296.

In 2020, Pres. Trump lost his 2020 re-election campaign to former Vice President Joseph Biden. Biden had 306 Electoral College votes while Trump had 232 votes. Biden tallied 81,283,501 votes while Trump tallied 74,223,975.

Trump was elected President in 2016, defeating Hillary Clinton in the Electoral College vote 304-227. He lost the popular vote by almost 3 million. Clinton had 65,853,814 while Trump had 62,984,828.

The Red Wave continued down the ballot as Sen. Ted Cruz easily winning reelection (by almost 1 million votes) over challenger Colin Allred and U.S. Rep. John Carter (R-Dist. 31) defeating Stuart Whitlow by more than 100,000 votes.



Scottish Gathering, Highland Games Nov. 8-10

The 63rd Salado Scottish Gathering and Highland Games takes place Nov. 8-10 at the Thomas Arnold Elementary School grounds here in Salado.

Heralding all things Scottish, this landmark Salado event is the oldest Scottish festival in Texas and has been sponsored continuously by the Salado Museum since 1961.

"The Scottish Gathering is the main fundraising event for the Salado Museum and College Park and continues to draw thousands of visitors to Salado every year," says Lynette Jones, museum executive director. "Our planning committee and our event staff are all volunteers from Salado and nearby towns and event participants come from all over the country."

"Thanks to all of their ongoing commitment and the generous support of our patrons, local and area business sponsors, and the people of Salado, we are able to continue this tradition so vital to the maintenance and operation of the museum and College Hill," Jones adds.

The Scottish Gathering weekend's activities include bagpipe bands, athletes

The historical Calling of the Clans torchlight ceremony is held at 6pm on the banks of Salado Creek just north of the museum and is open free to the public. A ticketed social evening follows at the museum that includes a whiskey tasting by Bourbon Speak of Salado.

Festival grounds are open Saturday from 9am to 5pm. Opening ceremonies are held at noon with the Bands and Clans Parade and a massed bands presentation. The parade starts at Main Street and North Pace

Park Road and moves west on Thomas Arnold Road to the festival grounds.

Consumer spending up 3.7% for last quarter

The Markets

The U.S. stock market, at least as represented by the Standard and Poor's 500 Stock Index (SPX), had some slippage this week as the Index fell 1.37% to 5728.80 as some of the "Magnificent Seven" posted reduced forecasts even though their current earnings generally beat estimates. The SPX held on to a gain of over 20% this year and is up over 35% in the last twelve months, although just 24% higher than it was three years ago. Our other market indicator, the more mainstream CRSP US Mid Cap Value Index also declined, but only 0.88%, closing at 2853.45, up just over 30% in the last year.

The bond market has shown considerably more movement than we have seen in stocks recently. Unfortunately for bond holders, the movement has been down, as bond prices fall when interest rates (yields) rise. The benchmark U.S. Treasury ten-year note ended the week yielding 4.37%, up from an interest rate of 3.88% at the beginning of 2024. Reflecting the rise in longer-term interest rates, the S&P 500 Bond Index (total return) has declined 2.85% in the last month. As the new month began, shortterm Treasuries were still providing an annualized yield of around 4.7% while the thirty-year bond was only paying 4.57%. West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) prices continued their slow decline and at the end of the business day was \$69.56 per barrel.

The Economy

This week, the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) announced that the U.S. economy was growing at a 2.8% annualized rate in the third quarter. Most economists agreed in the past that the speed limit for our economy without generating high inflation was about 2%. Obviously, someone forgot to tell the economy, because our average an-

rejuvenated economy while we can. Reuters reported that consumer spending, which is more than two-thirds of our economy, rose 3.7% in last quarter, adding 2.46% to our GDP. Household net worth rose, and personal income increased by \$221.3 billion last quarter. At the same time, the price index for gross domestic purchases (PCE) was reported to have risen only 2.1% over the last year while average income was up 3.1%. That is a significant reduction from the 2.4% annual inflation reported in the second quarter. The GDP number was reduced 1.5 points as we upped our imports as businesses and individuals sought to build up inventories in fear of tariff increases next year. It was also negatively affected by the two major hurricanes that

an indicator of business activity, fell to 216,000 last month, down from 227,000 in August. The one dark spot in this week's reports was that employers only hired about 12,000 more

swept across the Southeast.

workers in the month, as opposed to the 223,000 in August. The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) at the Labor Department, attributed the slowdown in hiring to the hurricanes, the strike at Boeing, and business uncertainty about tariffs and taxes. Still, the unemployment rate remained constant at 4.1%, about what most economists consider to be "full employment."

The dark side of our economic situation is also showing. The broad stock market has largely gone nowhere following the Fed rate cut last month. At the same time, the bond market is declining. The underlying reason can be found in the law of supply and demand. The Treasury is planning to issue (sell) \$1.3 trillion worth of bonds over the next six months. When the supply of bonds is high and rising, the price of bonds will decline unless there is an increase in demand. Adding to that negative effect on bond prices is the campaign promises from the two presidential candidates. Vice President Harris' promises have been estimated by the Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget (CRFB) to add about \$3.95 trillion to the deficit over the next ten years. Even that is dwarfed President Trump's promises of lower taxes and a dramatic increase in spending which, if enacted, would add about \$7.75 trillion to the national debt. Either way, that is a lot of Unemployment claims, bonds to be issued, so expect higher rates no matter who wins.

> In short, the U.S. economy is still roaring along at about as fast as it could possibly go and shows no signs yet of slowing down.

Veterans struggle, we must help

To the Editor:

The United States will celebrate Veterans Day on November 11th. It is dedicated to American veterans of wars. It became a federal holiday in our country on November 11th, 1938, called Armistice Day. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War it became known as Veter-

ans Day. As we honor our veterans, we need to recognize that many struggle with their mental health. According to the 2023 National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report, there were 6,392 veteran suicide deaths in 2021, and it was the 2nd leading cause of death among Vet**Your Voice** Letters to the Editor

erans under age 45-yearsold. American Indian or Alaska Native Veterans have the highest suicide rate among all Veterans followed by Whites, Asians, and African Americans. Of all Veteran suicides in 2021, 72% were by firearms. The firearm suicide rate among Veteran women was 281% higher than non-Veteran women, and the firearm suicide rate among Veteran men was 62% higher than for non-Veteran men in 2021.


The Veterans Administration found a variety of factors that may increase the risk of suicide. Some of these are: substance abuse, PTSD, traumatic brain injury, depression, anxiety, insomnia, higher doses of opioid medications for pain control, and acute psychosocial stressors. Veterans who misuse drugs and alcohol are more than twice as likely to die by suicide than other Veterans.

The Sons of the Republic of land for settling in that of Texas Sterling C Robertson Chapter 22 heard from member Bill Kinnison about his qualifying ancestor Will Perrin during their Nov. 2 meeting at Johnny's Steaks & BBQ.

Perrin learned of land opportunities when living in Louisville, KY. The Peters Colony was offering tracks of land in Texas. In 1844 he moved with his family to Collin County, Texas which is near present day McKinney. He received 640 acres

area. Two of Perrin's sons accompanied him to Texas and each son received 320 acres. Perrin and sons were farmers, and their interest of land drew them to Texas. "Patent" (or title) disputes were common at that time with so many families moving into the area. This was a problem the State of Texas recognized and, to fix it, they send land commissioners to the colony to issue "land certificates".

It wasn't until 1850 that

William Perrin received a land certificate (title) for the land he settled as a farmer.

There are plays in bridge that are easy to understand when they are pointed out, but that are overlooked in practice because they are very unusual. For example, take this deal where West leads the king of spades against South's four-heart contract. How should declarer play the hand?

eventually collecting two spades, a heart and a club to defeat him one

If South instead leads the king of clubs at trick two, East beats the contract by winning with the ace and returning a trump. West wins and cashes three spades for down two.

As a matter of fact, if declarer adopts any other method of play at trick two after winning the first trick, he eventually runs into a dead end from which there is no escape.

The solution to the problem, and the only way to make the contract, is to let West hold the first trick!

If West then switches to a trump, whether high or low, declarer draws trump as soon as possible and loses at most a spade, a heart and a club to bring in the contract.

A club shift by West at trick two is equally futile, and so is another spade lead, which declarer would ruff in dummy. In the latter case, a club return from dummy at trick three establishes a parking place for South's remaining spade loser.

It is certainly unusual to duck the king of spades at trick one with dummy holding a singleton spade opposite the ace, but if that's the only way declarer can make the contract, then that's what he must do.






