



Trump leads Red Wave

Donald Trump has won the Presidency for the second time, leading a 2024 Red Wave that could see the Republican Party picking up five seats in the U.S. Senate and retaining control of the U.S. House.

With some races still not called as of press-time, Republicans may oust Democrat Bob Casey in Pennsylvania, a state that Pres. Trump flipped from blue.

Two other states that flipped from blue to red at the top of the ticket look as if they will elect Democratic Senators: Michigan and Wisconsin.

Kamala Harris conceded the election at 4 p.m. Nov. 6.

She trailed Trump 224 to 277 with Alaska, Arizona, Nevada and Michigan still to declare results. Trump led in each of those states, which could push his Electoral College total to 315.

Trump will win both the Electoral College votes and the popular vote. As of press-time with the above states not tallied, Trump leads in the popular vote 71,801,254 to Harris' 66,907,296.

In 2020, Pres. Trump lost his 2020 re-election campaign to former Vice President Joseph Biden. Biden had 306 Electoral College votes while Trump had 232 votes. Biden tallied 81,283,501 votes while Trump tallied 74,223,975.

Trump was elected President in 2016, defeating Hillary Clinton in the Electoral College vote 304-227. He lost the popular vote by almost 3 million. Clinton had 65,853,814 while Trump had 62,984,828.

The Red Wave continued down the ballot as Sen. Ted Cruz easily winning re-election (by almost 1 million votes) over challenger Colin Allred and U.S. Rep. John Carter (R-Dist. 31) defeating Stuart Whitlow by more than 100,000 votes.

Scottish Gathering, Highland Games Nov. 8-10

The 63rd Salado Scottish Gathering and Highland Games takes place Nov. 8-10 at the Thomas Arnold Elementary School grounds here in Salado.

Heralding all things Scottish, this landmark Salado event is the oldest Scottish festival in Texas and has been sponsored continuously by the Salado Museum since 1961.

"The Scottish Gathering is the main fundraising event for the Salado Museum and College Park and continues to draw thousands of visitors to Salado every year," says Lynette Jones, museum executive director. "Our planning committee and our event staff are all volunteers from Salado and nearby towns and event participants come from all over the country."

"Thanks to all of their ongoing commitment and the generous support of our patrons, local and area business sponsors, and the people of Salado, we are able to continue this tradition so vital to the maintenance and operation of the museum and College Hill," Jones adds.

The Scottish Gathering week's activities include bagpipe bands, athletes

Tossing the Caber, Highland dancers, Celtic musicians, the popular Bonniest Knees Contest, a Celtic marketplace, food trucks, and more. The main feature of the event is the Clans Village, the largest gathering of Scottish Clans in Texas where members share Scottish history and family genealogy with visitors. Events begin on Friday with a presentation in words, images and song, The Scottish Folksong Revival from 1960 to Today, by Scottish singer and folklorist, Ed Miller at 1pm in the Salado Museum with a suggested donation at the door.

The historical Calling of the Clans torchlight ceremony is held at 6pm on the banks of Salado Creek just north of the museum and is open free to the public. A ticketed social evening follows at the museum that includes a whiskey tasting by Bourbon Speak of Salado.

Festival grounds are open Saturday from 9am to 5pm. Opening ceremonies are held at noon with the Bands and Clans Parade and a massed bands presentation. The parade starts at Main Street and North Pace

Park Road and moves west on Thomas Arnold Road to the festival grounds.

In addition to bagpipe band, dancing and athletic competitions, the day's activities include live Celtic music by Scottish singer Ed Miller, Scottish fiddler Colin MacLeod, and Celtic band Murder the Stout featuring Scottish button accordionist Hugh Morrison.

On Sunday, grounds are open 9am to 3pm starting with the Kirkin' o' the Tartan devotional service at 9am. The day's activities include a performance by the Silver Thistle Pipes and Drums and the Hill Country Highland Dancers of Austin, a Dog Costume Contest, Scottish Country Dancing, children's Highland Games, and a ticketed children's Faerie Glen Tea Party.

The Wee Scots Gift Shop is open all three days at the Salado Museum on South Main Street.

All proceeds from the event and gift shop benefit the museum, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization.

Consumer spending up 3.7% for last quarter

The Markets

The U.S. stock market, at least as represented by the Standard and Poor's 500 Stock Index (SPX), had some slippage this week as the Index fell 1.37% to 5728.80 as some of the "Magnificent Seven" posted reduced forecasts even though their current earnings generally beat estimates. The SPX held on to a gain of over 20% this year and is up over 35% in the last twelve months, although just 24% higher than it was three years ago. Our other market indicator, the more mainstream CRSP US Mid Cap Value Index also declined, but only 0.88%, closing at 2853.45, up just over 30% in the last year.

The bond market has shown considerably more movement than we have seen in stocks recently. Unfortunately for bond holders, the movement has been down, as bond prices fall when interest rates (yields) rise. The benchmark U.S. Treasury ten-year note ended the week yielding 4.37%, up from an interest rate of 3.88% at the beginning of 2024. Reflecting the rise in longer-term interest rates, the S&P 500 Bond Index (total return) has declined 2.85% in the last month. As the new month began, short-term Treasuries were still providing an annualized yield of around 4.7% while the thirty-year bond was only paying 4.57%. West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) prices continued their slow decline and at the end of the business day was \$69.56 per barrel.

The Economy

This week, the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) announced that the U.S. economy was growing at a 2.8% annualized rate in the third quarter. Most economists agreed in the past that the speed limit for our economy without generating high inflation was about 2%. Obviously, someone forgot to tell the economy, because our average an-

nualized GDP growth rate per quarter for the last two years has been a whopping 3.0%. A combination of an amazing growth in worker productivity and an abundant labor supply seems to be the underlying reason. The open question is whether this can continue and if so, for how long? If you have tried to drive between cities, you probably would agree with us that the highways are at maximum capacity. Air cargo and the railroads are at or close to maximum usage as well. Only time will tell, but we are happy to enjoy this rejuvenated economy while we can.

Reuters reported that consumer spending, which is more than two-thirds of our economy, rose 3.7% in last quarter, adding 2.46% to our GDP. Household net worth rose, and personal income increased by \$221.3 billion last quarter. At the same time, the price index for gross domestic purchases (PCE) was reported to have risen only 2.1% over the last year while average income was up 3.1%. That is a significant reduction from the 2.4% annual inflation reported in the second quarter. The GDP number was reduced 1.5 points as we upped our imports as businesses and individuals sought to build up inventories in fear of tariff increases next year. It was also negatively affected by the two major hurricanes that swept across the Southeast.

Unemployment claims, an indicator of business activity, fell to 216,000 last month, down from 227,000 in August. The one dark spot in this week's reports was that employers only hired about 12,000 more

workers in the month, as opposed to the 223,000 in August. The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) at the Labor Department, attributed the slowdown in hiring to the hurricanes, the strike at Boeing, and business uncertainty about tariffs and taxes. Still, the unemployment rate remained constant at 4.1%, about what most economists consider to be "full employment."

The dark side of our economic situation is also showing. The broad stock market has largely gone nowhere following the Fed rate cut last month. At the same time, the bond market is declining. The underlying reason can be found in the law of supply and demand. The Treasury is planning to issue (sell) \$1.3 trillion worth of bonds over the next six months. When the supply of bonds is high and rising, the price of bonds will decline unless there is an increase in demand. Adding to that negative effect on bond prices is the campaign promises from the two presidential candidates. Vice President Harris' promises have been estimated by the Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget (CRFB) to add about \$3.95 trillion to the deficit over the next ten years. Even that is dwarfed by President Trump's promises of lower taxes and a dramatic increase in spending which, if enacted, would add about \$7.75 trillion to the national debt. Either way, that is a lot of bonds to be issued, so expect higher rates no matter who wins.

In short, the U.S. economy is still roaring along at about as fast as it could possibly go and shows no signs yet of slowing down.

Veterans struggle, we must help

To the Editor:

The United States will celebrate Veterans Day on November 11th. It is dedicated to American veterans of wars. It became a federal holiday in our country on November 11th, 1938, called Armistice Day. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War it became known as Veterans Day.

As we honor our veterans, we need to recognize that many struggle with their mental health. According to the 2023 National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report, there were 6,392 veteran suicide deaths in 2021, and it was the 2nd leading cause of death among Vet-

erans under age 45-years-old. American Indian or Alaska Native Veterans have the highest suicide rate among all Veterans followed by Whites, Asians, and African Americans. Of all Veteran suicides in 2021, 72% were by firearms. The firearm suicide rate among Veteran women was 281% higher than non-Veteran women, and the firearm suicide rate among Veteran men was 62% higher than for non-Veteran men in 2021.

The Veterans Administration found a variety of factors that may increase the risk of suicide. Some of these are: substance abuse, PTSD, traumatic brain injury, depression, anxiety, insomnia, higher doses of opioid medications for pain control, and acute psychosocial stressors. Veterans who misuse drugs and alcohol are more than twice as likely to die by suicide than other Veterans.

MELBA WHITECOTTON CLAPP DECEMBER 20, 1931 OCTOBER 29, 2024



Melba Whitecotton Clapp was born on December 20, 1931, to Beulah and ZT Whitecotton in Uvalde, TX, where she met her future husband at the age of 16. She was a young schoolgirl, and he was a handsome Lackland Air Force man based in San Antonio. He came to Uvalde with a friend for the weekend. It was love at first sight. She went home and told her mother she was going to marry "that" man. Months later they were married, and the rest is history. Together they had three boys, David, Don and Andy.

Melba learned to knit very early as a child. Growing up she designed and knitted sweaters, caps, dresses, pillows, and anything that came to her mind. She became a very accomplished designer and was commissioned by Bernat and Berroco Yarn Co. to design and make many different products for the company to sell. Her sales were worldwide and even sold by Grace Jones of Salado.

Melba loved baseball and encouraged her boys to play from a very early age. She attended every ballgame of every son, sitting in the stands knitting and keeping score. As an avid baseball fan who loved the Yankees and Dodgers, she would keep a record of each pitch, hit, and out, for all the ball games she watched. Her stats stand today. When a son told her he wanted to hit high and outside pitches, she simply replied: "Just hit the strikes!"

After leaving their home in Uvalde, she and her husband, Ken, moved to Killeen and then to Austin because of his rising career. While living in Austin they decided to build a "get away" house in Salado. It took many years and three different construction projects to complete. They moved from Austin to Salado permanently in 1984.

Ken loved his Mercedes and traded for a new one each year. Melba's love was a BMW with a supercharged engine. After his passing, she started trading her BMW every year, even if it was hardly driven.

Melba loved horses but late in life, while riding her son Don's horse, she fell and chose to stop riding.

Melba died on Tuesday, October 29th, in Seton Hospital, Harker Heights, with her sons by her side.

Melba is preceded in death by her husband Ken. She is survived by her three sons: David and wife Becky; Don and children, Natalie Reichert and Jenny Osborne; Andy and wife Randy, and daughter, Johnna Binsted, plus eight great grandchildren and two great-great grandchildren.

Services for Melba will be on Thursday, November 7, 2024, at Broecker Funeral Home Chapel with a visitation starting at 10:00 A.M.; service at 11:00 A.M. with Joe Keyes officiating, followed by interment in Salado Historic Cemetery.

Local SRT meet at Johnny's

The Sons of the Republic of Texas Sterling C Robertson Chapter 22 heard from member Bill Kinnison about his qualifying ancestor Will Perrin during their Nov. 2 meeting at Johnny's Steaks & BBQ.

Perrin learned of land opportunities when living in Louisville, KY. The Peters Colony was offering tracks of land in Texas. In 1844 he moved with his family to Collin County, Texas which is near present day McKinney. He received 640 acres

of land for settling in that area. Two of Perrin's sons accompanied him to Texas and each son received 320 acres. Perrin and sons were farmers, and their interest of land drew them to Texas. "Patent" (or title) disputes were common at that time with so many families moving into the area. This was a problem the State of Texas recognized and, to fix it, they send land commissioners to the colony to issue "land certificates".

It wasn't until 1850 that

William Perrin received a land certificate (title) for the land he settled as a farmer.

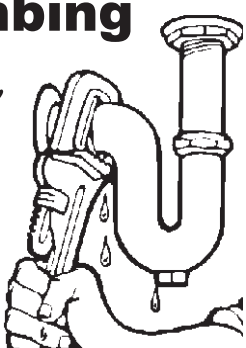
