Meeting set for Feb. 3 on Mustang Springs WWTP

A public meeting will be held 7 p.m. Feb. 3 in the conference room of the Salado ISD Administration Building, 601 N. Main St. concerning new Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0016524001, to authorize the discharge of treated domestic wastewater at a daily average flow not to exceed 990,000 gallons per day.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality received this application on April 5, 2024 from Mustang Springs Utility, LLC and Jaffe Interests, LP, 4925 Greenville Avenue, Suite 1400, Dallas, Texas 75206.

The facility will be located approximately 900 feet west of the intersection of FM 2843 and Mustang Creek Road, in Bell County.

The treated effluent will be discharged via pipe to Mustang Creek, thence to Salado Creek in Segment No. 1243 of the Brazos River Basin.

The unclassified receiving water use is limited aquatic life use for Mustang Creek. The designated uses for Segment No. 1243 are primary contact recreation, public water supply, aquifer protection, and high aquatic life use.

In accordance with 30 TAC §307.5 and TCEQ's Procedures to Implement the Texas Surface Water Quality Standards (June 2010), an antidegradation review of the receiving waters was performed.

A Tier 1 antidegradation review has preliminarily determined that existing water quality uses will not be impaired by this permit action. Numerical and narrative criteria to protect existing uses will be maintained.

A Tier 2 review has preliminarily determined that no significant degradation of water quality is expected in Salado Creek, which has been identified as having high aquatic life use. Existing uses will be maintained and protected.

The TCEQ Executive Director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit. The draft permit, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The Executive Director has made a preliminary decision that this permit, if issued, meets all statutory and regulatory requirements.

The WWTP is proposed to be constructed in three phases served by a common fine screen headworks and flow equalization tankage to process up to 1,312,000 gpd. Each phase is proposed to be a membrane bioreactor (MBR) and each phase will include an anoxic zone ahead of the aerobic zone to provide nitrification. RAS will be recycled at rates up to 500%. Provisions for alkalinity, pH and supplemental carbon chemical feed systems will be included with each MBR. Sludge will be wasted to a separate aerated sludge holding tank to maintain optimal MLSS conditions in the bioreactor. Effluent will be stabilized by UV light per 30 TAC 217 Subchapter L prior to surface discharge.

The permit application, Executive Director's preliminary decision, and draft permit are available for viewing and copying at Salado Public Library, 1151 North Main Street, Salado, in Bell County, Texas.

The public may submit public comments about this application.

The purpose of the public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. A public meeting will be held and will consist of two parts, an Informal Discussion Period, and a Formal Comment Period.

A public meeting is not a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedure Act. The comments and questions submitted orally during the Informal Discussion Period will not

be considered before a decision is reached on the permit application and no formal response will be made. Responses will be provided orally during the Informal Discussion Period.

During the Formal Comment Period on the permit application, members of the public may state their formal comments orally into the official record. A written response to all timely, relevant, and material, or significant comments will be prepared by the Executive Director. All formal comments will be considered before a decision is reached on the permit application. A copy of the written response will be sent to each person who submits a formal comment or who requested to be on the mailing list for this permit application and provides a mailing address. Only relevant and material issues raised during the Formal Comment Period can be considered if a contested case hearing is granted on this permit application.

After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material or significant public comments.

Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting a contested case hearing or reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in a state district court.

The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn.

First responders respond to suicide on N. Stagecoach

On Jan. 22, at approximately 10:29 a.m., the Salado Police Department was dispatched to a report of an injured person in the 300 block of N. Stagecoach Rd.

Bell County Emergency Services District #1, Salado Fire Department and Temple Medic 25 also responded to the scene.

Upon arrival, emergency

personnel located an unknown female lying on the ground in the parking lot of the Salado Municipal Building with an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound.

Bell County Justice of the Peace Cliff Coleman was notified and, upon arrival, pronounced the victim deceased at 10:55 a.m.

The identity of the deceased is being withheld out of respect to the family.

"The Village of Salado, the Salado Police Department, Village staff, the Mayor, and the Board of Aldermen extend our deepest condolences to the family and loved ones during this difficult time," Mayor Bert Henry said.

Lunch & Learn on Bell Co. 175th

Bell County Historical Commission and Bell County Museum hosted a special Lunch & Learn event at the Salado Museum on Jan. 22. The free event celebrated the 175th anniversary of Bell County.

This was the third Lunch & Learn event organized by the Historical Commission and Bell County Museum. It featured presentations from both Hampton and Historical Commission Chair, Daniel Elder.

"It's our third Lunch & Learn, and each one gets bigger," Elder said. "This is our best turnout."

The lectures looked back not just on the last 175 years but also at the thousands of years that preceded the

county's creation. "This place has a lot of history, dating all the way back 20,000 years," Coleman Hampton, Director of the Bell County Museum, said.

Both organizations agree that there is plenty more history to explore.

"There are over 250 historic markers in the county, identifying subjects, activities, places and landmarks," Elder said. "Each one of them is a story of its own."

Other events celebrating the county's 175 anniversary are currently being planned.

"This is the kickoff, the first day," Hampton said. "It's really exciting to kick off the anniversary."

Mayor Town Hall Jan. 30 focuses on finances

Village of Salado Mayor Bert Henry will hold the first of a series of Town Halls on the State of the Village at 6:30 p.m. Jan. 30 at the Municipal Building, 301 N. Stagecoach Rd.

The mayor will address the steps the board of aldermen has taken after a petition was filed and accepted for a May 3 election to roll back the Village adopted tax rate of \$0.486 per \$100 valuation to the Voter Approval Rate of \$0.36122 per \$100 valuation.

In December, aldermen froze wages, imposed a hiring freeze on full time personnel, terminated property

insurance for the Salado Historical Society cabins, terminated lease agreement and any financial obligations in connection to the sculpture garden, suspended general road maintenance repairs, suspended grass mowing for Main St., Pace Park and Sirena Park.

The board also paused the three capital improvement projects listed below on a motion by Bell, receiving a second from Hurst and passing 4-0.

- Mill Creek Rd. sidewalk.
- Royal Street overlay.
- Williams Rd. sidewalks.

US manufacturers increase prices to match tariffs imposed on imported items

As represented by the S&P 500 Stock Index (SPX), the U.S. stock market continued its new-year celebration this week as the Index rose 1.74% to 6101.24. It appears to have vanquished the fearsome 6000 barrier at the opening on Wednesday and is not looking back. The SPX is now up 3.73% this year and month, over 25% higher than a year ago, and up an astounding 38% over the last three years. Our other followed index, the CRSP US Mid Cap Value Index, rose 0.35% to 2882.49 for the week and is up 3% this year and 18% from a year ago.

On the other, much larger, side of the U.S. securities markets, the benchmark 10-year U.S. Treasury note ended the week with a yield of 4.63%, about 11% higher than a year ago and over 1% higher this year. At the shortest end of the Treasury yield curve, the one-month T-bill yield rose during the week to close with an annualized yield of 4.45%. The average 30-year fixed U.S. mortgage rose to 7.11% from last week's 7.09%, according to Mortgage News Daily. The price per barrel of West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) ended the week at \$74.64, about the same as a year ago.

The Economy

While there were no blockbuster economic reports this week, there were plenty of indications of where things are going if you know where to look. Sometimes, the most significant news in economics is found in the later appearing, mundane announcements. Weekly earnings, hires, fires, and jobless claims tend to be

headline grabbers, but the Bureau of Labor Statistics "Usual Weekly Earnings of Wage and Salary Workers" for the last quarter is where the meat is. Median weekly earnings for the fourth quarter paid to the 120.3 million U.S. workers were \$1,192 (not seasonally adjusted). This was 4.1% higher than a year ago, while the Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose only 2.7%. That equates to an after-inflation buying power increase of about 3.4%, a number very close to the U.S. GDP growth in the same period, as it should be. Subtract federal borrowing and the balance of trade deficit from that wage-growth number, and you have a good guess for annual economic growth in the U.S.

Our economy is exceptional because it is the only major developed economy in the world to be almost entirely self-sufficient. Only about 11% of our GDP is the result of selling goods and services to others compared with a global average of 46%, according to Statista.com. Theoretically, we import far more than we export; however, if our trade imbalance was as significant as it is reported to have been over the last half-century, we should be bankrupt. Instead, we are inarguably the wealthiest major economy on the planet. Those facts are why the stock market is unfazed by tariff threats.

If, and this is a big "if," President Trump imposes

large-scale tariffs and other countries retaliate with counter-tariffs, there is a very high probability that domestic prices for tariffed items will rise, but not just on imported goods and services. When, in his last administration, President Trump imposed tariffs on washing machines, domestic producers raised their prices to match those charged for imported machines and, as a result, did not significantly change the percentage of imports. Interestingly, the cost of clothes dryers rose by about the same rate. Still, because we only import about 14% of our GDP, the total U.S. economic change will likely be minor. We saw the effect of tariffs as they were raised on Canadian lumber products, and the cost of lumber jumped, immediately followed by new house cost increases. It contributed to the rather dramatic rise in real estate costs, but as that valuation also applied to already-built houses, our total wealth rose. Unfortunately, it also priced quite a few people out of buying a home. Notably, when the tariffs were removed, the price of houses did not fall. The more expensive wood was already in the houses, and the resulting housing shortage caused the increases to remain.

Once more, we are forced to render the unpopular assessment that the U.S. economy is in excellent shape and rolling along with little or no signs of bad times ahead.

Hollywood has responsibility to address mental health crisis

A suicide devastates more than one life.

I learned that lesson shortly after my doorbell rang at 2:30 a.m. on September 10, 2016. My 20-year-old son, Austin, had died by suicide. After decades reciprocating his infectious smile and admiring his achievements on the football field and in the classroom, I had to digest in an instant that I would never see him again.

Every single day, I wish I could go back and talk with him one more time. Would it have helped? I'll never know. But I do know, seven years into my journey as a suicide prevention advocate, that severe mental illness doesn't manifest in a vacuum, especially for young adults.

Whether we're aware of it or not, the media we consume strongly influences how we process mental health crises.

The folks who shape our culture have never been more aware of the mental health challenges Americans face. But they largely haven't responded to that awareness by depicting mental health more responsibly.

Over the last two decades, the suicide rate among those aged 10 to 24 has risen nearly 60%. The factors behind this crisis are complex and multifaceted. But researchers are coming to understand that Hollywood plays a role. Many shows have inadvertently contributed to the increase in the youth suicide rate by glorifying suicide and the mental health conditions that cause it.

Consider "13 Reasons

Why," a show developed for Netflix that depicts the story of a teenage girl who takes her own life and leaves behind a series of audiotapes that implicate the people she holds responsible for her death.

Just one month after the show aired, the suicide rate among 10- to 17-year-olds increased nearly 30%. The series was intended to start a meaningful dialogue about bullying, sexual assault, and suicide. It instead portrayed the main character's choice as a means of exacting emotional revenge on those who wronged her.

Some teens with existing mental health issues are more susceptible to emulate suicides that are glamorized -- a well-documented phenomenon called "suicide contagion."

While "13 Reasons Why" has exacerbated some awful mental health trends in America, it's hardly the only one. Fortunately, other shows and movies do just the opposite.

The critically acclaimed film "Silver Linings Playbook" has been praised for its realistic depiction of people living with bipo-

lar disorder. Or consider "Adieu," a movie currently in production that centers on a prodigal violinist struggling with depression after her sister's suicide. Several leading mental health professionals have commended "Adieu" for depicting grief, depression, and the value of human connection in an authentic way -- allowing viewers to see the possibility for recovery and growth even after a tragic loss.

Stories like these are crucial because they tap into what some experts call the "neuroscience of hope." These scientists hypothesize that optimism stems from distinct neurological processes that are subject to outside influence. As a result, certain forms of art could literally rewire the brain to generate feelings of hope that combat mental illness.

By creating powerful art that more appropriately considers and depicts mental health challenges, Hollywood could use its great power more responsibly.

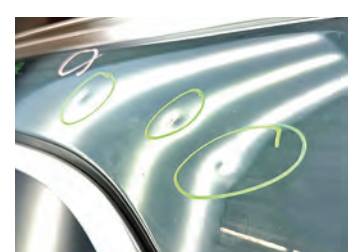

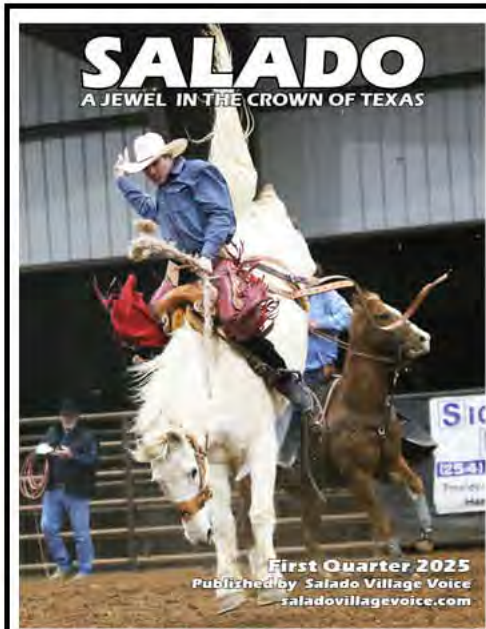
